WGNE Moves To Jacksonville

It was September 2003 when Renda Broadcasting first petitioned the FCC for permission to move WGNE (Froggy 99.9)/Daytona Beach's tower north to Jacksonville. Yesterday at 6am, WGNE made its long-awaited leap into the market, launching into 9,999 commercial-free, jock-free songs in a row with **Gary Allan**'s "Nothin' On But The Radio." WGNE keeps its call letters and frequency but drops "Florida's Station For Good Times & Great Country Music" with the move for "Jacksonville's New Country Station, 99.9 Froggy-FM."

WGNE PD/PM driver **Jeff Davis** and middayer **Michele Chase** are the only staffers making the move, as morning talent **Jessica Dean** leaves to get married and head west while personality Jen Jones chose not to move from Daytona. All of this means, of course, that Davis needs a staff. Send T&Rs to the station's new address: 6440 Atlantic Blvd., Jacksonville, FL 32211. WGNE's new phone number is 904-727-9696.

drummer **Eddie Bayers**, pedal-steel guitarist **Paul Franklin**, guitarist **Kerry Marx**, bassist **Michael Rhodes** and guitarist **Biff Watson**.

The room was filled with legendary, talented and successful artists ranging from Queen of Country Kitty Wells to fresh princes Big & Rich. This formidable group was brought to its feet time and time again by stirring performances and an atmosphere that was described more than once as being nothing less than spiritual.

Former CMA Executive Director **Jo Walker-Meador** introduced Foglesong, while Price spoke on Kristofferson's behalf. Foglesong remarked that the legacy he'd hoped to leave behind was that people would say of him, "He was a good music man."

Kristofferson movingly told the story behind his composition "Why Me" before playing it. The evening closed with Hall members gathered on stage to sing "Will The Circle Be Unbroken." If for no other reason than the event they came together for, the answer is a resounding "yes."

ASCAP Moves Awards To Ryman

"It's time for a change," says ASCAP's **Connie Bradley** in regard to the performance rights organization's move of its annual songwriter awards from the Opryland Hotel to the Ryman Auditorium. "We've been having it out there for probably 25 years," Bradley says. "I was down at the Ryman one afternoon, standing on the stage and talking to Lee Ann Womack after she rehearsed. I looked out at those seats and the stained glass and it hit me: If I were a songwriter in Nashville, right here is where I'd want to receive my award."

This year's ASCAP Country Awards are set for Oct. 17. A gala party at the Bellsouth building will follow the awards presentation. "It'll be different, it'll be fun, and next year when the CMA Awards are at the arena, we'll already be downtown," Bradley says.

Joe Nichols' What's a Guy Gotta Do' moves to the No. 2 spot, up from No. 3. Gretchen Wilson is new to the top 10 with 'Home Wrecker,' which moves up strong to No. 7 from the No. 11 spot. Trick Pony continue to set a blazing pace with 'It's a Heartache,' which moves to No. 12 overall this week from No. 15 last week. Heads up for Big & Rich's 'Big Time,' which is beginning to show strong growth. It ranks No. 16 overall, up from No. 22."




