Michaels joined WB/Nashville as Dir./National Field Promotion in July 2002 and was elevated to VP last December. Bustos Media has agreed to purchase Country KAYO, licensed to Elma, WA, from South Sound Broadcasting for \$20 million. KAYO, at 99.3 MHz, boasts a signal that reaches Bremerton, Seattle and Tacoma, as well as Aberdeen, Centralia, Olympia and Shelton, WA. KAYO posted a 1.4 in the winter 2005 Seattle Arbitron. With the purchase Bustos will now own 23 stations nationwide, including KDDS-AM (La Gran D)/Seattle, which it acquired from Entercom in December 2004 for \$6 million.

total sample, 14% answered "more," while 77% said "about the same."

2. "Have you ever listened to a station you would not normally listen to because of a contest the station was running?" Of the total sample, 92% said "no," and 8% said "yes."

Commenting on the overall results of the survey, Paragon Media Strategies CEO **Mike Henry** said, "The appeal of contests to radio's audience continues a slow decline, but for a small minority of listeners, contests will affect the stations they listen to and how much they listen to them. Also, listeners and contest players still prefer contests with more but smaller prizes vs. contests with fewer but bigger prizes."


