# Massie Rises From The Bear's Ashes As KNIX PD

Former KZBR/San Francisco PD **Ray Massie** is the new PD of Clear Channel's KNIX/Phoenix. He starts June 22 and succeeds **Shaun Holly**, who in April was elevated to Dir./Programming Operations for the company's eight Sun City stations, as well as its Total Traffic operations in Phoenix, Tucson and Yuma, AZ.

Massie launched KZBR in August 2003 and exited when it flipped formats to Jack-like "95.7 Max FM" a month ago. He previously programmed KFRG/Riverside and WIL/St. Louis.

#### CMA Music Fest Grows: Just Add Water

"This is the first time we've had a hurricane to deal with," says CMA Exec. Director **Ed Benson** in the wake, almost literally, of a rain-drenched 2005 CMA Music Festival. Despite the unwelcome arrival of remnants of tropical storm Arlene, country fans came out in record numbers for the festival, with aggregate four-day attendance growing to 145,355 from approximately 132,000 in 2004. Four-day-pass sales were up 16% over last year, while single-show sales were up 38%. Four-day attendance at the Fan Fair Exhibit Hall was 43,600, up from 37,000 in 2004.

#### **Ackerman Added To R&R Country Panel**

Coleman VP Chris Ackerman has been added to the R&R Convention 2005 Country panel "So, You Have a Country Station — Now What?" He'll shed some light on the ways Pop and Country P1s use their respective favorite stations. Is the audience different? Do PDs coming from Pop to Country have to change any of their ways? Chris will provide some answers as he joins KKBQ/Houston PD Johnny Chiang, WQHT/New York PD John Dimick, Sirius Satellite Radio Dir./Country Programming Scott Lindy, KSCS/Dallas PD Lorrin Palagi, WUSN/Chicago VP/GM Dave Robbins and WGH-FM/Norfolk OM John Shomby on this panel, set for Friday, June 24, from 11am-1pm.

The 3-5pm Friday session is "The Country Boiler Room." It features Infinity VP/Country Jeff Garrison, Columbia/ Nashville Sr. VP/Promotion Larry Pareigis, Consultant Joel Raab, Clear Channel SVPP Alan Sledge and WGAR/ Cleveland PD Meg Stevens in a fast-paced discussion of Country's hottest topics. Plus, new Columbia/Nashville artist Brice Long is set to entertain prior to the afternoon panel.

"Single-concert sales were very robust the first two nights, but dropped 40% the second two nights. We might have gotten close to 150,000 aggregate attendance if the weather had cooperated. We didn't lose any shows, and all of the artists scheduled played but one — Lorrie Morgan didn't show up, for some reason."

Rain aside, 180 artists on five stages helped bring out more Nashvillians, one of CMA's top priorities.

"That 38% increase in single-ticket sales signals increasing local support and participation," Benson says. "It's taken us a while to turn that corner, but we're on track."

#### Festival: TV Special On Track

Weather could have had a severe impact on the ABC primetime CMA Music Fest special scheduled to air Aug. 2, but the winds were kind. "We didn't lose any cameras or have anything go down technically, other than a few minor glitches," Benson says. "Saturday night the rain was falling fairly straight down, so we were very lucky there were no substantial south winds that would have blown right into the stage and the artists. Had that happened, we might have had to think about curtailing the shows.

"The weather forecast on Saturday morning was very dire — up to four inches of rain over a 48-hour period. That had us scrambling around, and this was our second year in a row with weather issues after last year's rather substantial late-afternoon thunderstorms."

Nevertheless, attendance is growing, as evidenced by a 44% increase in advance sales for 2006. CMA is already planning to offer more four-day tickets next year, pushing the single-show patrons into the Coliseum's upper deck. Judging by the enthusiasm exhibited this year, the move will just make "Country Music's Biggest Party" that much bigger.


