Clear Channel, DreamWorks Top R&R Country Award Winners

The two companies carried off the most trophies during last Friday's 2005 **R&R** Industry Achievement Awards ceremonies at the **R&R** Convention in Cleveland. We'll have a pictorial wrap-up of all the activities in this week's **R&R** and profiles of the winners in the July 1 **R&R** Country column. In the meantime, here are the 2005 honorees.

Radio winners in Country were: Station of the Year, Markets 1-25, KYGO/Denver (Jefferson-Pilot); Markets 26-100, WIVK/Knoxville (Citadel); and Markets 101+, WUSY/Chattanooga, TN (Clear Channel). WIVK/Knoxville (Citadel) PD Mike Hammond was awarded PD of the Year. KNIX/Phoenix MD Gwen Foster (Clear Channel) was honored as MD of the Year for her work with KNIX and KUSS/San Diego during the eligibility period. And WSIX/Nashville (Clear Channel) morning personality Gerry House was once again voted by R&R's readership Country's top personality for an incredible seventh consecutive year.

Record winners were: Platinum Label of the Year, DreamWorks. Gold Label of the Year, Curb. Former MCA/Nashville, Mercury and DreamWorks Sr. VP Promotion & Artist Development **Scott Borchetta**, who will be launching his own imprint soon, was named Sr. Promotion Executive of the



moved from an AC station to program Country WPOC/Baltimore in 1997, added, "Somebody mistook me for John Michael Montgomery, and I didn't know who that was."

The story illustrated just one of the many misconceptions related during the "So You Have A Country Station — Now What?" panel. Targeted at GMs, OMs and PDs who find themselves in unfamiliar territory at Country, the session also highlighted the format's unique strengths.

WUSN/Chicago GM **Dave Robbins** cited unparalleled accessibility. "Working with the artists in this format is totally different from working with artists in Pop," he said. Former Country programmer **John Dimick**, who's now at WQHT (Hot 97)/New York, added, "They leave their guns at home."

The overriding theme, however, was the eagerness, openness and helpfulness of artists, industry members and fans across the board. KSCS & KTYS/Dallas PD **Lorrin Palagi** minced no words: "I'll never go back to another format."

Issues Drive Radio And Label Exec Discussion

Clear Channel's **Alan Sledge**, WGAR/Cleveland's **Meg Stevens**, KMPS/Seattle's **Becky Brenner**, Lyric Street's **Kevin Herring**, consultant **Joel Raab** and Sony/Nashville's **Larry Pareigis** debated a number of hot topics during the "Country Boiler Room" session Friday afternoon.

The focus was on issues including the development of new radio talent, the limitations of research and radio's attentiveness to SoundScan numbers. The "Jack" format's impact on Country stations was also discussed.

Pareigis noted that even with 1,200 songs, Jack can eventually get repetitive, turning the "oh wow" into "oh no." Speaking later about strain in the

"Toby Keith continues his assault, moving to the No. 1 slot with 'As Good As I Once Was.' The song is up from No. 2 last week and No. 14 two weeks ago. Alan Jackson's 'The Talkin' Song Repair Blues' sees strong growth inside the top five, going to No. 3 from last week's No. 7. Darryl Worley's 'If Something Should Happen' is inside the top five titles as the No. 4 song overall. Faith Hill's 'Mississippi Girl' is exploding at just 5 weeks of age, moving from last week's No. 16 overall to this week's No. 9. The No. 1 song with female listeners this week is 'Making Memories of Us,' by Keith Urban. SheDaisy are healthy with 'Don't Worry 'Bout a Thing,' which moves from No. 19 to No. 16 this week."

radio-label relationship he said, "The problem children are never the ones up on the panel or in attendance at these functions. And we all know who they are." Sledge urged him to name names.

Speaking to the more explosive change seen in Country's early '90s boom, in comparison to its most recent surge, Raab pointed out that radio stopped playing almost everything that pre-dated the late '80s. "We don't need to throw the baby out with the bathwater this time, so it hasn't opened up as much as it did in 1989," he said.

Brenner lamented the artificial pressure labels put on stations to maintain momentum for singles. "I wish the charts would go away. We're getting screwed on both ends. Labels complain because we don't add a song early, then we run

through it and take it off and they complain because we're keeping them from going No. 1. It's all so ridiculous because it's not driven by what the listeners want."

Sponsored by Columbia, the panel was preceded by a performance by newcomer **Brice Long**, who stuck around afterward to take in the proceedings. Queried about what he'd heard as the session drew to a close, Long said with a smile, "This is scaring the hell out of me."




