#### **R&R Throws Down A Gauntlet**

The call to action follows the launch of All for the Hall, a fundraising campaign spearheaded by **Vince Gill** that asks every country artist to donate one night's pay to ease the museum's significant financial burden. The campaign is explained in detail in **Chuck Aly**'s Aug. 12 Nashville column.

WSIX/Nashville and Clear Channel have set a precedent for radio, donating \$25,000 to All for the Hall. Moving forward, R&R/Nashville is challenging every radio company and station and all who make a living in Country radio to donate a day's income to the cause. R&R, Helton and Aly have already pledged their donations.


#### Franks To Keynote Seminar






