Gulf State Radio Stations Cope With Katrina

Stations from the Florida Panhandle to Texas continue to offer extended coverage, with many in the path of the storm struggling to remain on the air.

At Clear Channel's WKSJ (95 KSJ)/Mobile, PD/MD/midday host **Bill Black** expected downtown Mobile to be flooded for several blocks. He said, "The storm surge is coming in on a high tide, making for rough flood conditions.

"95 KSJ and our Clear Channel/Mobile cluster have been broadcasting continuous storm coverage since 5pm Sunday. Our staff announcers, teaming with local NBC-TV affiliate WPMI, are updating listeners on the latest storm movements, power outages and road closings. Our audio is also being streamed at our weather website, www.stormalert.net, and has been picked up by Premier. We plan to continue long-form coverage through [Monday night]."

To the northeast, WTVY/Dothan, AL midday host Big **Mike Casey** and morning co-host **Amie Pollard** gave much-needed information on area tornadoes to the Wiregrass region while also providing reports to refugees who fled such areas as Biloxi, MS and Mobile. Pollard went on the air at 6am Monday, and, as of 6:45 last night, planned to remain on the air, as the entire region had been placed under a tornado watch until 5am CT Tuesday.

Stations Assist Storm Refugees

While our coverage usually focuses on those most adversely affected, it's important to note the critical role radio plays in areas within driving distance of the storm. Radio can help those fleeing a storm in a number of ways.

CC/Alexandria, LA OM and KRRV PD **Steve Casey** said, "We're safe here in Alexandria. We have a lot of people passing through town looking for hotel rooms which aren't available, so we are directing them to shelters."

KRMD/Shreveport, LA was also assisting New Orleans evacuees. PD **Les Acree** said, "There were a lot of folks on the road en route to this area, and we certainly kept them informed on what was going on back home and where the nearest motel or hotelvacancies were. We also broadcast the names of restaurants willing to feed them for free, with their ID. Once critical needs are assessed, we will
