Bishop joined the SonyBMG-owned Provident less than two months ago. His background includes a stint as MCA Sr. VP/Promotion in Los Angeles and 10 years with RCA Records/BMG Music in New York, where he rose from regional promoter to VP to Interim Sr. VP. During that decade with Nipper he worked with current RLG/Nashville Chairman **Joe Galante** and Exec. VP **Butch Waugh**, both of whom worked for RCA in New York.

Citadel Bows 'The Country Legends' In SLC


A couple weeks ago we told you that KSOP-FM/Salt Lake City morning personality and Country Music DJ Hall of Famer (2001) **"Country Joe" Flint** had resigned after an incredible 34 years at the station. We also speculated that Joe might be heading to a new Classic Country outlet — one that would be launched by Citadel to flank its mainstream Country KUBL.

Well, Citadel did indeed debut a Classic Country outlet yesterday, while also smartly resurrecting the KKAT call letters, which had been attached to successful Country radio in SLC for a long time. The rundown: Citadel dumped CHR/Pop KPQP at 101.9, moved Triple A KENZ (The End) from 107.5 to 101.9, and launched "The Legends of Country" on 107.5. KUBL PD **Ed Hill** is programming KKAT, with Country Joe in mornings.

New 'Coyote' Hunts KWNR

Beasley's Adult Standards KJUL/Las Vegas flipped to Country at noon yesterday with a segue from Sinatra's "My Way" to Toby Keith's "How Do You Like Me Now?!" Currently spinning 10,000 songs in a row as "104.3 — The Coyote," the station will "lean hard on the core artists" according to consultant **Joel Raab**, who is directing the search for a PD. T&Rs to *joelraab@aol.com.* **Harry Williams** is the Beasley/Las Vegas Market Manager.

Ironically, KJUL received the Adult Standards Station of the Year honor at the NAB Marconi Radio Awards on Sept. 22. The station ranked No. 7 12+ in the Spring 2005 Arbitron. However, it was No. 24 25-54 and No. 1 55+. It's now aimed right at Clear Channel's KWNR, which has been No. 1 12+ in Las Vegas in the last five Arbitrons.




