Clear Channel Nabs Six CMA Broadcast Awards

For the first time in the history of the CMA Broadcast Awards, one company has swept the Station of the Year category in all four market-size classifications. Clear Channel's KSSN/Little Rock; WSIX/Nashville; KEEY (K102)/Minneapolis; and WUSY/Chattanooga, TN were judged as the format's top Country stations in the Major, Large, Medium and Small Market categories, respectively.

Two teams of Clear Channel personalities also were honored, as WSIX's *Gerry House & The House Foundation* (featuring **Gerry House, Mike Bohan, Duncan Stewart** and **Al Voecks)** and WUSY's *Dex & Kim* (**Bill Poindexter** and **Kim Carson)** won CMA Broadcast Awards for Personality of the Year in the Large and Small Market categories, respectively.

The CMA Broadcast Award for National Personality of the Year went to **Lia Knight** for *The Lia Show*, a Jones Radio Networks offering. The Major Market honor went to WUSN/Chicago's **Lisa Dent**, while the Medium Market winners were WIVK/Knoxville's **Andy Ritchie**, **Alison West** and **Jimmy Holt** for the *Andy & Alison and the Morning Crew* show.

Knight said of her first CMA Award, "I've been in Country radio for 19 years and this represents the highest achievement in my career. I'm so humbled by this whole experience." Commenting on KEEY's first victory, CC/Minneapolis OM **Gregg Swedberg** said, "This is really one of the greatest moments in the history of K102. Just to be mentioned with other legendary stations in our category was a thrill. This will keep us warm all winter long."

Winners were notified yesterday — in many cases live on the air — by MCA/Nashville artist Lee Ann Womack. They will be recognized in New York at the *39th Annual CMA Awards* telecast, to be shown on CBS-TV on Nov. 15.

Congrats to **Jon Loba** and his BBR promotion team on the label's second No. 1 single, as **Craig Morgan**'s "Red Neck Yacht Club" sailed into this week's top spot. BBR's maiden voyage to No. 1 was also with Morgan, whose "That's What I Love About Sunday" was moored at the top of the charts for five weeks between March 3 and April 10.

Kudos also go to **Kevin Herring** and his hot, hot, hot Lyric Street team. They put **Josh Gracin** in the Top 5, massaged **Rascal Flatts'** hit to No. 7 and strode into the Top 30 with **Shania Twain**. Plus, Herring and the team got a No. 26 debut on the new **Garth Brooks** single with only *four days* of airplay.

By the way, the highest debut in the history for **R&R**'s Country charts was by the G-Man himself. On Nov. 6, 1998, Garth's "It's Your Song" debuted at No. 4. There's no telling where his current single would have debuted with a full week of airplay. But, I can tell you this: Calculating a chart based only on the last four days of airplay — the days that Garth's "Good Ride Cowboy" was available for airplay (Oct. 6-9) — it would have debuted at No. 10.
