WB Staffer Eric Mansfield Found Murdered

Our most heartfelt condolences are extended to the family, friends and colleagues of Warner Bros. Director/Creative Services **Eric Mansfield**, who was murdered Friday. He was 33. Mansfield was returning to his East Nashville home around 6:35pm when, police say, he may have been targeted for robbery. At around 7:25pm, Mansfield's housemate found him locked in his car, unresponsive, with a gunshot wound to the chest. A reward of \$26,000, including \$25,000 from Warner Bros., has been offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the perpetrator or perpetrators.

A statement from Warner Bros./Nashville Exec. VP Bill Bennett reads, "We mourn the tragic passing of our colleague and friend Eric Mansfield and offer our deepest condolences to his family and loved ones. They are in our thoughts and prayers. Eric was a great talent who made his mark in Nashville and throughout the creative community. He brought the highest vision, spirit and creativity to countless artist releases on Warner Bros. Nashville and all that he touched in the music industry for so many years. We will help to commemorate Eric's lifetime and achievements in an appropriate manner, with the guidance of his family."

Visitation is scheduled for today at Roesch,

accompanied on guitar by hubby **Chris Lindsey**, who also performed the couple's huge hit "Amazed."

They were joined by walk-ons **Jeff Hanna**, Berg's hubby, who sang his "Bless The Broken Road," and **Jon Randall**, who provided guitar backing and background vocals, in addition to a chilling version of "Whiskey Lullaby." At one point Randall asked the crowd how it felt to have "2,000 hillbillies invade New York City." Inquiring whether anyone had seen *Deliverance*, he got real close to the mike and in a low voice said, "That shit is true, you know" while pickin' the opening of "Dueling Banjos."

From there it was back to B.B. King's for **Neal McCoy** and **Craig Morgan**. It was wall-to-wall fans singing the words to every hit, an amazing sight in a city without a Country station.

Next up, an 11pm start for Broadway Meets Country, where Broadway stars sang Country tunes and Nashville's finest belted out show tunes. It has to be one of the most incredible concerts I've ever attended. Broadway star **Brian Stokes Mitchell**, cohosting the show with **Lee Ann Womack**, told the crowd he "fell in love with country music 20 years ago because country singers can really *sing*."

And Nashville's best proved his point, deftly handling songs not normally in their repertoire. Neal McCoy did a beautiful job with "Almost Like Being in Love," from *Brigadoon*. **Trace Adkins** slowly walked to center stage, sat on a stool and sang "My Funny Valentine" from *Babes in Arms* with a ton of warmth and soul. And **Glen Campbell** got a standing ovation with a soaring rendition of the very difficult-to-sing "You'll Never Walk Alone."

The Broadway stars really nailed their tunes, with standouts including **Andrea McArdle** — the original Annie — belting out "Fancy" and Adriane Lenox's


Our weekly analysis of Country callout research is brought to you by Bullseye President John Hart. Here's a look at some of the biggest stories Hart looks at in next week's issue.

"Keith Urban's 'Better Life' spends another week as the No. 1 song overall at Callout America, and it's the No. 2 Passion song for the week. LeAnn Rimes moves from No. 3 to No. 2 with 'Probably Wouldn't Be This Way.' Alan Jackson has the No. 4 song overall with 'USA Today,' up from No. 6 last week. Billy Currington continues to strongly outperform the radio spin chart, with 'Must Be Doin' Somethin' Right' ranking at No. 5 overall. Martina McBride is still strong, ranking at No. 7, up from last week's No. 10 overall. Big & Rich are big and strong with 'Comin' to Your City,' which is new to the top 10, at No. 8 — a major move from last week's No. 15."

(*Doubt*) version of "You Say You Will." Huge props to Broadway's **Jason Danieley** (*Full Monty*) and **James Naughton**, who tackled the tricky "Sold" and "I've Been Everywhere," respectively. Both flawlessly pulled off these uptempo tongue twisters.

Other highlights included **Ben Vereen** in a cowboy hat and duster singing "King of the Road" while adding a little soft shoe — in cowboy boots, no less. In fact, one of the more interesting aspects of the evening was seeing country stars in designer gowns and suits, while most of the folks from the Great White Way sported jeans and boots.

There were also duets, including **Trisha Yearwood** and **Idina Menzel** singing "For Good," from *Wicked*; **Jamie O'Neal** and McArdle performing "I Know Him So Well," from *Chess*; and **Carrie Underwood** joining **Patrick Wilson** for "Suddenly Seymour," from *Little Shop of Horrors*.

The wall behind the stage was glass, providing a backdrop of Central Park and 59th street, adding to an already magical night that ended with Mitchell calling to the crowd, "Ya'll come back now, ya hear?" — to which Womack responded, "Fuhgeddabowdit." Not quite getting the expected response from the crowd, which only gave light applause and laughter, Womack looked at the audience and said, "Aw, c'mon. I practiced that all day." It was back to Joe's Pub that night as Jeffrey Steele, Tim Nichols, **Craig Wiseman** and DiPiero passed more than the guitar — a bottle of single-barrel Jack Daniels also circulated onstage. Nichols and Wiseman ended the evening with a duet of "Live Like You Were Dying" to thunderous ovation. The most-heard comment backstage: "Why isn't Jeffrey Steele a star?"
