Bullseye Marketing Research: CMAs A Hit With The Viewers

It's been two weeks since the 39th Annual CMA Awards were broadcast on CBS-TV live from New York. And, of course, everyone in the biz has chimed in with their two cents about the show. But what did the fans think?

To find out, **John Hart's** Bullseye Marketing Research fielded a pair of studies — one before the telecast and one after — covering a variety of areas, including pre-show awareness, awareness about the show coming from New York City and, of course, what viewers thought of the show.

Prior to the show, a 505-person sample -46%male, 54% female — was asked three questions.

- 1. "Do you know the CMA Awards are on Nov. 15 on CBS?" Of the entire sample, 64% said yes.
- 2. "Do you plan to watch the broadcast?" Over 63% said they planned to watch.
- 3. "What city are the CMA Awards broadcasting from?" About 60% of the respondents did not know. Roughly 28% said New York City, while about 10% thought it was Nashville. (The other 2% split between Los Angeles and Las Vegas; one person thought the CMA Awards were being broadcast from Cincinnati this year.)

R&R's Year-End Reporting Schedule & Dates

It's hard to believe it's the end of another year. In response to a number of requests for year-end chart dates and questions about reporting, here are some important dates to keep in mind:

- Dec. 9: R&R's Year-End Music Issue. Once again we'll have the top 100 songs of the year and every record that hit the top 15. Plus, we'll crown R&R's Country Label of the Year and the format's Most Valuable Performers.
- Dec. 16: R&R's Year-End News Issue. We'll wrap up the year's news, recall the highlights and chronicle people's moves through 2005.
- Dec. 19: The last reporting day of the year. There will be no reports on Dec. 26 or Jan. 2, 2006. The last R&R Country Hotfax with music information will arrive the morning of Tuesday, Dec. 20.
- Jan. 6, 2006: R&R's first issue of the new year a news-only edition with no music information.
- Jan. 9, 2006: The first reporting day of the new year. Adds from Mediabase-monitored stations and reports from R&R Indicator stations will be taken until 3pm ET, as usual. You will get an R&R Country Hotfax on the morning of Tuesday, Jan. 10 with this music information.

In the two days following the award show, 583 people were contacted and asked their thoughts on the show. Among the questions:

• "When you watched the CMA awards, did you" was designed to determine the extent of appointment viewing. Of the sample, 76.5% said they had made plans to watch the show, 19.5% said it was a last-minute decision, and 4% said they watched because family and friends were watching.

• "How did you find out the CMA awards were being televised?" TV and radio carried the bulk of the load here, with CBS-TV's promos leading the way — 62% of the folks said, "saw it on TV," while 21% said, "heard it on the radio." Next came "ran across it while surfing the TV," at 6.7%; "family/friends told me," at 4.6%; "read about it in a newspaper or magazine," at 4.5%; and "was in group of family/friends who were watching," at 1.4%.

• "How would you respond to this statement: 'I think the stars on the show should only sing their big hits and *not* the newer songs I don't know.'" Agreeing were 25% of the sample, while 48% said they disagreed. Just under 27% said it was "not important what songs they sang."

•"On a scale of 1-5, with 1 being the lowest score and 5 being the highest, how would you rate the CMA awards show for overall entertainment value?" The show did very well here, with almost 76% giving it a 5 (43.6%) or a 4 (32.30%). It got a 3 from 18.8% of the respondents, a 2 from 3.6%, and a 1 from only 1.8%.

Country TV Ratings

In the final TV ratings tally for the week of 11/14-11/20, the *39th Annual CMA Awards* tied for 10th place with *Cold Case*. The CMAs posted an 11.1 rating/17.0 share and 17,7333,000 viewers. For comparison, the No. 1 show for the week, *CSI*, had a 17.8/27.0 with 28,985,000 viewers.


This Week At Callout America

Our weekly analysis of Country callout research is brought to you by Bullseye President John Hart. Here's a look at some of the biggest stories Hart looks at in next week's issue.

"A great week at Callout America, the first full sample following the CMA Awards show, which put some mojo in the opinions of Country radio listeners. Billy Currington continues to see strong response, with 'Must Be Doin' Somethin' Right' ranking as the No. 3 song overall and the No. 2 passion song. Kenny Chesney is new to the top five, at No. 4, with 'Who You'd Be Today.' Gary Allan enters the top 10, his 'Best I Ever Had' ranking No. 7, up strong from last week's No. 12. Dierks Bentley's Horizon Award and live performance pay big dividends, as his 'Come a Little Closer' moves from No. 20 last week to No. 8 this week. George Strait moves into the top 10 for the week, with 'She Let Herself Go' ranking as the No. 10 song, up big from last week's No. 19."

Last Wednesday night's TV specials by **Kenny Chesney** and **Faith Hill** each placed third in their respective time slots. *Kenny Chesney: Somewhere in the Sun* helped ABC to a second-place finish for the night, with the network netting a 7.6 rating/13.0 share. In the 8pm ET hour, Chesney rang-up a 5.2/9.0, behind NBC's "E-Ring," with a 5.9/10.0, and CBS's "Still Standing" and "Yes, Dear," each with a 5.4/9.0.

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Faith Hill: Fireflies had a 4.4/7.0, behind only ABC's "Lost," with a 10.7/18.0, and CBS's "Criminal Minds," which had an 8.3/14.0. NBC placed third for the night, with a 6.0/10.0.

For a bit of historical perspective, last year's Tim McGraw *Here and Now* special on NBC, which also aired the night before Thanksgiving, drew a 6.5/11.0. At the time, it was the top-rated concert special on network television in over a year.

CRB News

CRB will honor KEEY/Minneapolis morning talent **John Hines** with the Tom Rivers Humanitarian Award during the opening ceremonies of CRS-37 in Nashville on Feb. 16, 2006. A 30-year market vet, Hines has supported a number of charitable efforts, including the Minnesota Aids Project, the MS River Road Run Kick-Off Party, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Make-A-Wish of Minnesota and Wishes & More. He was imbedded with the Minnesota National Guard and broadcast live from Camp Liberty in Baghdad last December.

In other CRB news, **Joe Nichols** will announce this year's New Faces during a CRS-37 press conference on Wednesday morning.

CC Flips Texas Talker For 'Outlaw'

Clear Channel flipped Progressive Talk KRPT/San Antonio to a Texas-focused Country format as "92.5 The Outlaw" on Nov. 23. Programmed by CC sister KAJA/San Antonio PD Clayton Allen, the station will play music from Texas artists including Willie Nelson, Jack Ingram, Pat Green, Robert Earl Keen, The Randy Rogers Band,

Waylon Jennings, Cory Morrow and Cross Canadian Ragweed. Hank Moon, who voices KAJA's weekly Texas music show, is KRPT's MD. KRPT puts a limited signal into San Antonio from its city of license, Devine, TX, approximately 40 miles to the southwest.

Veteran radio news journalist **Jerry Dahmen**, creator of the 25-year award-winning radio program *I Love Life*, is teaming with the Salvation Army to assist hurricane victims and other outreach programs.
