Albright & O'Malley Reveal Survey Results At Pre-CRS Meet

Consultants Albright & O'Malley are hosting their pre-CRS client seminar on Feb. 14 at the Nashville Hilton. Lyric Street is sponsoring the opening luncheon buffet, with music from SheDaisy, followed by a series of discussions and presentations.

The first panel begins at 1:30pm. "Meet Your Target Listener" will be conducted by **Jaye Albright** and **Michael O'Malley**, who will reveal the results of the first-ever national format study of the 15,620 Country radio listeners among the 117,737 consumers sampled in the last year by The Media Audit's 87 markets.

M.A.'s **Phillip Beswick** will assist in the presentation, which highlights qualitative profiles of listeners from a number of Country-centric formats. Also detailed will be the advertisers to target as the best match for our listeners and the key characteristics of the specific markets where country is strongest.

At 2:15pm is "An HD Radio Update" from Ibiquity's **Don Kelly**. In addition to the latest hardware, find out what it will take for this new technology to hit the tipping point, what you need to do to make it happen and why it's important to you.

At 2:45pm it's "Stationality 101" with **Mike McVay** of McVay Media Consulting. He'll get to the basics of branding and focus and will have examples of stations that have defined their target's values extremely well.

"National Country Perceptual Trends" kicks off at 3:30pm. FMR Research's **Bruce Fohr** will discuss what drives country music preference in 2006, radio usage overall and new media's impact on our core, and he will highlight potential opportunities and problems emerging on our strategic horizon.

At 4:15pm it's "Today's Cross-Sectional (Diary) Ratings Vs. The Coming Longitudinal (PPM) Survey." **Tripp Eldredge** of dmr reveals information collected by dmr and the A.C. Nielsen Center for Marketing Research at the University of Wisconsin which dismisses some of the common myths of PPM audience measurement while sharing the unique insight the A.C. Nielsen Center brings with its years of experience using panel research. Eldredge will also share insights on what will and will not change with marketing in the PPM world.

Cumulus To Halt Adds, Playlist Reporting

Cumulus EVP **John Dickey** has announced that, beginning next week, the company will no longer report adds, across all formats, to trade publications, most specifically **R&R**, the only trade publication that continues to report adds. In addition, nonmonitored stations will no longer submit adds or playlists, effectively ending their status as **R&R** reporting stations.

"Our PDs, depending on format, are charged with being innovative and aggressive locally in the markets we program to, and I still don't think the reporting of adds encourages that local process," Dickey told **R&R** CHR and Street Talk Editor **Kevin Carter**. "[It] narrows the music-selection process down to looking at charts, callout and perhaps following the add histories of other stations we respect."

Regarding the decision to stop submitting playlists, Dickey says, "We're not going out of our way to distribute information about what we play on our radio stations, and there's no other motive other than we're too busy trying to figure out what we do play."

The policy extends to all properties owned and operated by Cumulus, which is expected to include current Susquehanna stations once Cumulus' purchase of them is finalized around the end of April.

Two Cumulus stations — WSM-FM (The Wolf)/ Nashville and WKKO/Toledo — are **R&R** Country reporters. Cumulus has 15 **R&R** Country Indicator reporters, 11 of which are not monitored.

Josh Turner stays strong, with 'Your Man 'at No. 7 overall. Tim McGraw's 'My Old Friend' powers up to No. 9 from No. 16. Sugarland's 'Just Might Make Me Believe' ranks at No. 12, up from No. 14. 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In addition to the Future Country side channel WUSN/Chicago launched in May, CBS Radio will be serving up Future Country HD 2 companions at WUBE/Cincinnati, WYCD/Detroit, KILT/Houston and KMPS/Seattle. KUPL/Portland, OR will carry a "Country Legends" format, and Classic Hits KFRC/San Francisco will host a Country channel.

Emmis will offer Adult Alternative on the KZLA/Los Angeles HD channel, while Country WLHK/Indianapolis will feature Americana. Greater Media's WKLB/Boston will offer a Classic Country side channel.

This Week In R&R

Do the Grammys get Country? That's the question posed in this week's Country column. And the answer, historically and anecdotally, seems to be a resounding "No." An analysis of three years' worth of Grammy nominations reveals that as much as 40% of nominations in the Country fields have questionable relevance to what's going on in the format's mainstream.


An examination of the Grammy voting process offers many explanations for this "relevance disparity" even as it raises other issues. Interestingly, a similar phenomenon in the R&B fields seems to have been largely corrected by a late '90s push to get contemporary Urban music makers more involved with the Grammys. 
