CRS 37 In The Books

Another CRS has come and gone, and from all indications it was another stellar year for Country's premier event. While attendance figures held steady over last year, the best news is that support for the CRS hit record levels. CRB Exec. Director Ed Salamon said, "We had a record-breaking year in sponsorships and signage sales, and this contributed to a very positive atmosphere around the event." As reported in last Thursday's **RRCD**, there were 1,913 full registrants and 766 participants in related events, bringing the total to 2.679. Last year's total was 2.701. Look for a recap of our R&R Country Daily coverage later in this Hotfax.

CRS 38 will also be held at the Nashville Convention Center. Its announced dates are Feb. 28-March 2. 2007. The DI Hall of Fame Dinner is set for Feb. 27. 2007. Additional information is at www.crb.org.

"Josh Turner's 'Your Man' is a big ol' hit with radio listeners, this week repeating as the No. 1 song overall for the third consecutive week. Kenny Chesney continues to storm the Callout America rankers, at No. 3 for the week, up from No. 5. Sugarland's 'Just Might Make Me Believe' moves into the top five as the No. 5 song, up from No. 7 last week and No. 9 two weeks back. Miranda Lambert's 'Kerosene' continues to rank in the top 10, at No. 9 for the week. Across the Sony hallway, Montgomery Gentry's 'She Don't Tell Me To' ranks No. 7 for the week and No. 5 with female listeners. Blake Shelton's 'Nobody But Me' is new to the top 10, at No. 10."



CRS Twilight Zone

Cumulus Sr. Programmer **Charlie Cook** managed to lose his cell phone during CRS. After looking for a couple of hours and calling his number repeatedly, he was about to give up when he boarded the elevator after searching his room one last time. On the way down, the elevator doors opened, and on stepped Michelle Branch, who was at CRS performing in the WB suite as part of the new duo The Wreckers. Cook introduced himself, said he was a huge fan and added that under normal circumstances he'd prove it by playing her the ringtone on his phone: Branch's "Game of Love."

An incredulous Branch told Cook that only minutes before she was walking through the hotel when she was stunned to hear her song. Searching for the source, she found her music coming from an unattended cell phone, which she turned in to the front desk.

CRS In Review

Here's a recap of CRS-37 from coverage that first appeared in the **R&R Country Daily**.

• DJ & Radio Hall: Radio Hall honoree Jonathan Fricke offered a career travelogue and joked, "U-Haul loved me." Fellow inductee Ed Salamon contrasted his accomplishment with the chilly reception his ideas received during his first CRS presentation.

New DJ Hall of Famer **Terry Dorsey** called it his "second-best Valentine's Day," noting he was celebrating his wedding anniversary. **Lon Helton** observed that induction is based on a person's contribution to Country

radio, but that for him, "This night is about how Country radio has enriched my life." **Arch Yancey** called the evening one of his proudest moments and ribbed Helton for his long acceptance, saying, "I didn't forget my watch."

Jack Lameier was presented the CRB President's Award, and **Ronnie Milsap** was honored with CRB's Career Achievement Award. **Joe Nichols** and **Phil Vassar** performed.

- Opening Session: The Tom Rivers Humanitarian Award was bestowed on KEEY/Minneapolis morning personality John Hines, and Neal McCoy received the Artist Humanitarian Award. Radio Humanitarian Awards were awarded to KDXY/Jonesboro, AR, in the Small Market category; WIVK/Knoxville, in the Medium Market category; and WQYK/Tampa, in the Large Market category. The morning keynote was delivered by retired General Tommy Franks.
- Group Decision Makers Panel: Ongoing investigations of the radio-and-record-label relationship were a central topic. Calling the issue "a bigger media event than it should be," CBS Radio Chairman/CEO Joel Hollander added, "As far as I know, we're adhering to what we're supposed to be doing." Citadel COO Judy Ellis said, "We all know where the line is drawn."

Pressed by moderator and R&R Publisher Erica Farber about just where the line was, the panel seemed less self-assured. "It's like being on double-secret probation," Ellis said of the lack of clearly defined parameters. "Anything that gives the appearance of wrongdoing we have to stay away from." Farber punctuated the discussion by noting the CRS hotel bar broke its all-time record the night before, grossing \$19,800.

at the afternoon Record Label Heads panel. UMG's **Luke Lewis**, Sony's **John Grady**, RLG's **Joe Galante**, Capitol's **Mike Dungan** and Warner Bros.' **Bill Bennett** presented upbeat snapshots of their companies' performances in 2005, even against on overall 3% dip in country sales.

Paid digital downloads aren't making up the difference, Galante said, noting that only 6% of paid downloads are country. When asked what the one thing was that radio could do better, most on the panel echoed the sentiments of Lewis, who said, "Play more currents."

- Research Presentation: The CRB-commissioned study by Edison Media Research of more than 29,000 P1 Country listeners showed strong listener satisfaction with the format and its music. During a post-presentation panel focused on applying the study's findings, Arbitron's Gary Marince called the report "a healthy state of the union." Pointing to last year's study, JRN's Jim Murphy noted the year-to-year consistency. "That gives a lot of credence to the data," he said.
- Kenny Rogers Panel: An engaging and insightful session with Rogers was one of this seminar's best attended. Rogers told moderator and WSIX/Nashville morning man Gerry House he no longer seeks success but rather significance. Rogers said of his upcoming Capitol album, "Whether it happens or not is immaterial. It gives me a reason to try."

CRS Music Wrap Up

- Curb Lunch: Clay Walker headlined, previewing new music from an album he's currently recording. New act Bomshel opened. The label also took the opportunity to preview new singles, including "That's How They Do It in Dixie," by Hank Williams Jr. with Gretchen Wilson, Big & Rich and Van Zant. Tim McGraw's next single is "When the Stars Go Blue," the Ryan Adams song that has also been covered by The Corrs.
- > Music City Jam: Though needing no such justification, Keith Urban affirmed his recent win as CMA Enter-



tainer of the Year. **Dolly Parton** joined him for two songs, flirting playfully with him on "Two Doors Down" after admitting she answered a reporter's question about how she keeps passion in her marriage by saying, "I just make out with my husband and pretend it's Keith Urban." **Pat Green's** two songs with Urban and band included a cover of Bruce Springsteen's "Glory Days." **Ronnie Dunn** delivered an aweinspiring vocal performance on "Believe."

- Sony Lunch/Relay Race: Van Zant and Miranda Lambert turned in rousing sets, as did newcomer Ashley Monroe in a video presentation. Immediately afterward, teams from seven companies competed in the Crazy Radio Relay Race Spectacular. The frenetic event involving tricycles, leapfrog and bananas was won by Sirius Satellite Radio, which barely edged the R&R Flying Adds for the trophy.
- **RLG Boat:** Highlights of the 20th anniversary cruise included a double-platinum plaque presentation to **Carrie Underwood**, a 25

million-career-sales plaque for **Kenny Chesney**, and **Ronnie Milsap** singing "I Can't Stop Loving You" with **Martina McBride**. The night's emotional pinnacle came when **Alan Jackson**, delivering his first-ever Boat Show performance, helped the label salute former Arista VP/Promotion **Bobby Kraig**, who attended with his family. Jackson lightened the misty moment by joking, "I haven't had a hit since you quit."

- Capitol Lunch: Capitol's Mike Dungan introduced newcomer Eric Church by proclaiming Church's album the label's best during Dungan's tenure with the company. And Church lived up to the billing with a star-launching set. Dierks Bentley thanked the radio audience for his success and played several of his hits.
- New Faces: Despite breaking his tailbone in a fall Thursday, Jeff Bates performed as scheduled at the R&R-sponsored New Faces Show. His set included a medley of "Long Slow Kisses," "I Wanna Make You Cry" and "The Love Song," as well as a group of bikini-clad dancers for the final song, "Rub It In." Keith Anderson, introduced by Dr. Phil during his video opener, showed off his classic rock-infused country on sides including "Three Chord Country and American Rock & Roll" and "Pickin' Wildflowers."

Hot Apple Pie, a band and the night's dessert, launched their set with a UMG "Boot Camp" video starring MCA VP/Promotion Royce "Leg Warmers" Risser. The band showcased their next single, "Easy Does It," as well as prodigious instrumental and vocal chops. Jason Aldean and band ran through a hardedged set including "Amarillo Sky," "Hicktown" and new single "Why." Aldean thanked the crowd for his "hit-and-a-half." Little Big Town, who featured pig calls in their comical video intro, were arguably the best-received of the night's performers. Their set included "Good as Gone," the hit "Boondocks" and new single "Bring It on Home."




