Rascal Flatts A 'Gang' At Retail

Official first-week sales figures for the new **Rascal Flatts** CD *Me And My Gang*, featuring the four-week **R&R** No. 1 single "What Hurts The Most," will be released on Wednesday. But by all accounts, expectations are huge.

Lyric Street President **Randy Goodman** told **R&R** late Monday afternoon, "Right now the numbers look to be in the 650,000 range. That's extremely exciting, especially considering we did 200,000 first-week sales on the last album, which went on to sell over 4 million units. To put that into context, the following are some of the top first-week debuts for our genre:

- *Double Live*, Garth Brooks; 1,085,373 units, Nov. 1998.
- Sevens, Garth Brooks; 896,932 units, Nov. 1997.
- *Up*, Shania Twain; 874,137 units, Nov. 2002.
- Home, Dixie Chicks; 779,822 units, Sept. 2002.
- Live Like You Were Dying, Tim McGraw; 765,739 units, Aug. 2004.
- *Tim McGraw & The Dance Hall Doctors*, 601,516 units, Nov. 2002.
- "Obviously that's great company," said

Goodman. Offering an insight into Country's and music's progression into the digital age, Goodman added, "iTunes sold just under 30,000 album downloads, which was 500 units more than **Coldplay**'s first week. That made Apple our fifth overall account, behind Anderson, Handleman, Target and Best Buy. That's pretty amazing."

Schurr Adds NE SVP Duties For Clear Channel Clear Channel SVP/Southeast Tom Schurr has added responsibilities and will also lead the company's Northeast region as its SVP. As SVP/Southeast region, Schurr had responsibility for 27 markets and 138 stations. In his new role as SVP/Southeast & Northeast Region, he will have oversight for 58 markets. He remains based in Florida.

"Tom is a dynamic, talented manager who has proven his ability to improve performance," said CC President/CEO **John Hogan**. "I have every confidence that by extending his leadership to the Northeast, we will be providing local managers and advertisers with a very valuable resource."



Reba McEntire will return as host of the 41st annual Academy of Country Music Awards, airing live on CBS-TV from Las Vegas on May 23.




