

"Toby Keith's 'Get Drunk & Be Somebody' is the No. 1 song overall, up from No. 2, and is the No. 3 passion song in the sample. Strong growth continues for Jason Aldean, with 'Why' ranking No. 2, up from No. 4. Tim McGraw's 'When the Stars Go Blue' is just exploding with radio listeners, ranking No. 8 overall, up strongly from No. 16. Jack Ingram stays strong, with 'Wherever You Are' ranking No. 10 for the week. And at just four weeks of age on this data, Carrie Underwood stays strong with 'Don't Forget to Remember Me.'"

More Than Nine Million Watch CMT Music Awards

Last week's CMT Music Awards telecast proved to be a ratings home run for CMT. Among the highlights, according to CMT Sr. VP/GM **Brian Philips**:

- CMT ranked No. 1 across all ad-supported cable TV networks with women 18-49 and women 25-54 in the awards time period (8:00-10:30pm ET)
- CMT ranked No. 2 with adults 18-49 and adults 25-54 in the 8:00-10:30 ET period in all adsupported cable
- 9.2 million viewers watched CMT Music Awards programming.
- The 2006 CMT Music Awards was the network's second most-watched original telecast ever, adults 18-49.
- The audience composition was 60% female and 40% male.

Philips was also very excited about the growth in online voting. "The night-of-event online voting was up 451% over last year," he said. "We were up from 200,000 votes in 2005 to almost 900,000 this year."

According to the latest Media Monitors Spot 10 Country Radio Chart, it was the commercial for **Toby Keith**'s new Show Dog Nashville/UMG CD *White Trash With Money*. R&R Country Daily, Thursday, April 13: The Country Music Hall of Fame & Museum has partnered with 821 Entertainment Group to produce and distribute three feature documentaries for release in theaters, digitally and as DVDs. A Carter Family documentary titled *The Winding Stream* and a look at radio stations broadcasting into the U.S. from Mexico are the first two films, both executive-produced by 821 partners Anastasia Brown and Eric Geadelmann.
