
New Hall Of Famers Honored At Medallion Ceremony

The Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum's annual medallion ceremony, which is affectionately becoming known as the annual family reunion of Country Music Hall of Fame members, was held Sunday night in Music City.

The event honoring the newest Hall Of Fame inductees once again delivered many of the magical moments for which it has become known in the last few years. Receiving their Hall of Fame medallions on one of the most special nights of the year were Alabama's Jeff Cook, Teddy Gentry, Mark Herndon and Randy Owen; Glen Campbell; and the family of the late DeFord Bailey.

Among the evening's many highlights was an incredible performance of Bailey's "Fox Chase" by Chicago-based harmonica expert **Joe Filisko**, who has mastered the DeFord Bailey style, and a performance from Music Row session great **Charlie McCoy**.

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Among those singing in tribute to Glen Campbell was Jamie Hartford, son of the late composer John Hartford, who sang "Gentle on My Mind." Singer-songwriter Shawn Camp, like Campbell an Arkansas native, followed with "By The Time I Get To Phoenix." Famed songwriter John D. Loudermilk then performed a solo version of his composition "I Wanna Live," which became Campbell's first No. 1 country hit in 1968. Following his acceptance remarks, Campbell strapped on a guitar and sang his trademark "Rhinestone Cowboy" with an incredibly pure voice that sounded very much like the one on the single from more than 30 years ago.

Paying musical tributes to Alabama were **Lonestar** with "Mountain Music," **Sawyer Brown's Shayne Hill, Hobie Hubbard** and **Mark Miller** singing "Dixieland Delight," **Kenny Chesney** accompanied only by a piano singing "Lady Down On Love," and **Rascal Flatts** with Alabama's signature hit, "My Home's In Alabama."

As part of his acceptance speech, Randy Owen donned an RCA jacket and thanked **Carson Schreiber**, **John McNamara**, the late **Gaylon Adams** and the late **Wayne Edwards** — the RCA promo team when Alabama was signed — calling them "the most incredible promotion staff, ever."

The evening ended with what has become tradition, as the honorees, performers and members of the Country Music Hall of Fame came together on stage singing "Will the Circle Be Unbroken?"



CMA has posthumously honored **Louise Scruggs** with the Joe Talbot Award for her "outstanding leadership and contributions to the preservation and advancement of country music's values and traditions." The CMA board voted unanimously to recognize her last year, and she was aware of the honor. But Scruggs' health prevented her from accepting prior to her passing in February. **Earl, Gary** and **Randy Scruggs** have accepted on her behalf.

The first 22 dates of a multi-city run have been set for the 2006 Nashville Star Tour. The tour kicks off July 7 in Dothan, AL, and all dates will feature 2006 Nashville Star winner and new RCA artist **Chris Young**. Other artists on the tour include the talent search series' second-, third- and fourth-place contestants Casey Rivers, Nicole Jamrose and Matt Mason. Hardison was killed in June 2002. **Ronnie Skipper** was charged with murder but convicted of reckless homicide and aggravated assault. He served seven months in prison.

For the first time, balloting for the 40th annual CMA Awards will be conducted solely online this year. CMA members have been able to choose paper or online balloting during a twoyear transition period but will now cast their votes only through Election Services Corp.



Chart Chat

Heartiest congrats to all the folks at Big Machine — who may still be partying at the Tin Roof as you read this on notching their first No. 1 record with **Jack Ingram**'s "Wherever You Are." VP Jack Purcell and his crew did it in style, as they motored to the top with an incredible increase of 1,699 points. To put the feat in perspective, that's the single-largest point increase by a song leaping to No. 1 in almost 2 1/2 years. (We got tired when we got to January 2004, so we're not sure if anyone has ever had a bigger leap in recent chart history.) In January 2005 Darryl Worley's "Awful Beautiful Life" rocketed to No. 1 with a 1,557-point increase. Kenny Chesney and Uncle Kracker were up 1,553 points as "When The Sun Goes Down" vaulted to the top in March 2004; Montgomery Gentry had a 1,445 point increase when "If You Ever Stop Loving Me" went No. 1 in June 2004; Carrie Underwood's Jesus Take The Wheel" had a 1,432 point increase when it hit the top in January of this year; and Josh Gracin's "Nothing To Lose" posted a 1,299 point increase when it zoomed to the peak in March 2005.

R&R Country Daily, Friday, May 5: The \$1.2 billion acquisition of Susquehanna by Cumulus Media Partners officially closed, with CMP taking ownership and operational control of 33 radio stations in eight markets. Nationally, Cumulus Media now operates the second-highest number of stations in the U.S., with 345 properties in 67 markets. Country properties acquired include KPLX/Dallas, WFMS/Indianapolis and WYGY/Cincinnati.

Arista's Keith Anderson signed with The Fitzgerald Hartley Company for management. RRCD, May 4: Staff cuts related to Cumulus Media Partners' purchase of Susquehanna Radio began yesterday in Dallas, as Sr. VP/GM, Group Operations **Dan Halyburton** exited after seven years in the role and more than 20 years with the company. KPLX (The Wolf) VP/GM Lon Bason and several staffers in accounting, traffic and other administrative departments also left the company. Current Susquehanna/Dallas VP/ Market Manager **Dan Bennett** is staying in a similar role for Cumulus. Additionally, KPLX morning personality Bobby Mitchell and nighttime air personality Hollywood Henderson have exited the station. Mitchell had been with The Wolf since its 1998 launch, while Henderson joined the station in 2001.

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
