Montage Coming Into View

Last week former Sony/Nashville President **Allen Butler** hung the shingle for Montage Music/Nashville, which will comprise a record label, publishing house and management division. While artist and executive details will likely come to light over the next few weeks, Butler has a clear vision of how Montage will operate.

The man behind Montage Music is **John Simmons**, a founding partner of Illinois-based law firm SimmonsCooper LLC. His company, Hedgewood International, is based in East Alton, IL and appears to be a venture capital firm with entertainment, retail, media, finance and development divisions.

Butler's involvement with Simmons began several months ago. "He's an entrepreneur with a number of investments, and he'd been talking to a couple artists about being financially involved in their careers," Butler says. "Originally, I was going to be brought on as a consultant, but with all the label consolidation going on, John and I realized our timing couldn't be better to jump in with both feet."

The roster will be kept small initially, Butler says, mixing new artists with proven performers, though not exclusively country. Montage's first single is expected in October, with an album release slated for Q1 2007. A distribution deal is close to being finalized.

"Inside the Radio Studio with Whoopi Goldberg" will feature a one-on-one interview between the famous actress, comedian and producer and Clear Channel VP/AC Programming and WLTW/New York PD **Jim Ryan**. The panel will be held on Sept. 21 from 3:30-5pm.

New Reporters: Joining the **R&R** Country panel as reporting stations are WWNU/Columbia, SC; KKNG/ Oklahoma City; KKWF/Seattle; and WSJR/Wilkes Barre. Their music information will be included in next week's **R&R** Country chart.

Breaking from the "promotion" moniker, Montage will field five radio marketing staffers, in addition to the department head. "Promotion has become a bit tainted in the last year thanks to a

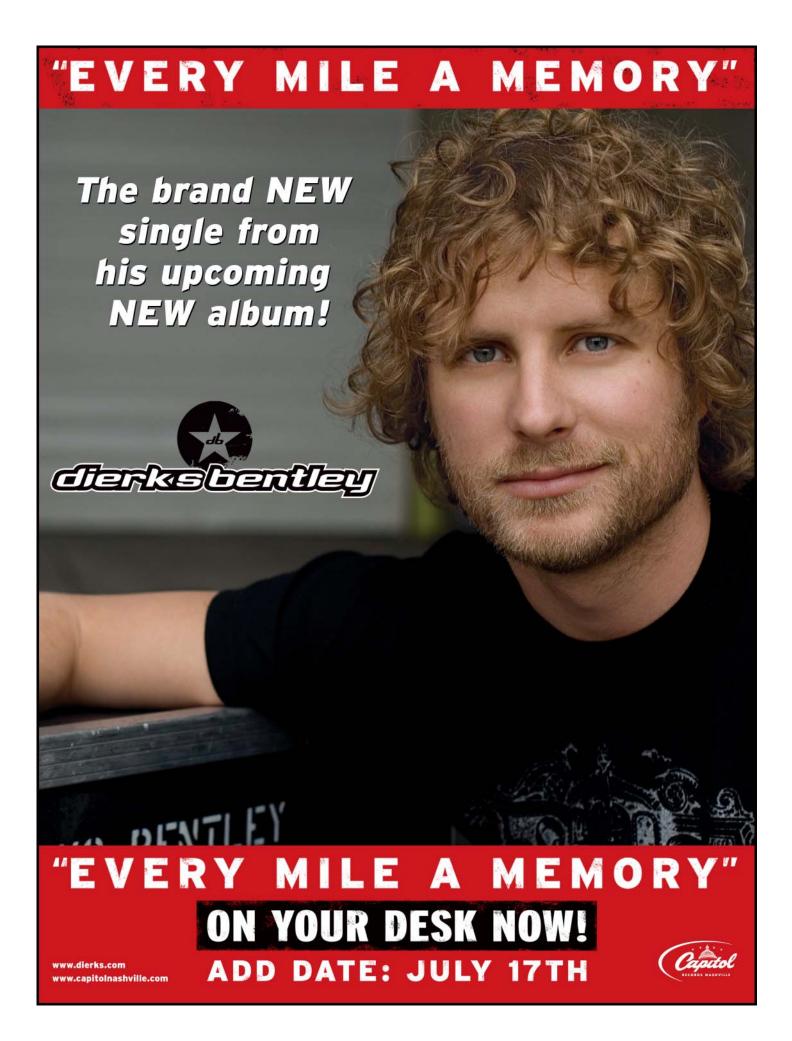

few people out there," Butler explains. "The people we're bringing in didn't think we needed to call it promotion per se — kind of the way the term 'disc jockey' became overused, sometimes not in a complimentary way, and people started calling themselves 'air personalities.'"

Publicity, A&R administration, legal and sales will be outsourced. Marketing and A&R will be handled inhouse, though Butler says the creative department will not be directed by someone who also is a producer.

He promises artist-friendly deals that will likely seek to include revenue sharing across Montage's publishing and management divisions. "We've got an open-door policy toward artists and music," he says. "We've got a window here and feel this is a very exciting opportunity for this town and for artists — especially in light of the way we're structuring our contracts.

Butler says he recognizes that even as major label consolidation has created a deep pool of artist and executive talent, the independent label landscape is becoming increasingly competitive. "After 26 years in this business, I'm in a unique position and have a lot of insight into the talent and people in Nashville that someone coming in from somewhere else doesn't have."
