A (Ratings) Tale Of Four Cities

The spring 2006 Arbitron ratings are being released daily and can be viewed at *www.radioandrecords.com*. Page 7 of this week's Country Hot Fax contains an overview of a number of Country stations from markets released thus far. Here's a look behind the numbers in four major markets.

Chicago: WUSN slid 3.6-3.1 and fell from seventh to 11th in the market. It was not an unexpected hit for PD **Mike Peterson**. "We had a terrible May," he said. "We lost 200,000 [persons] in cume and were 1 1/2 shares below our lowest low, 25-54. Even though we came back in June, we just couldn't recover from that hit in May."

Peterson added, "We knew it was going to be bad, but we were hoping it would be salvageable. Thankfully it looks like it is." Helping that cause was continuing market compression, which is responsible for WUSN's ranking seventh in the Windy City 25-54 despite falling to a 3.3 in that demo.

Detroit: WYCD vaulted to a tie for first with a 5.1-5.2 move. PD **Tim Roberts** noted, "This is the first time in over 15 years a Country station has reached No. 1 in the Motor City."

He also pointed out that WYCD performed extremely well with adults 25-54, moving to No. 3 with a 5.5. "The All New Dr. Don Morning Show with Rachael and Grunwald now is No. 4 25-54 with a 4.6. Middayer Mike Scott is No. 2 with a 6.3 while afternoon hosts Edwards and Lee were also No. 2 with a 6.1. WYCD's weekends also were strong with a 5.6 and a No. 2 ranking as well.

R&R Awards Presented At Dallas Convention; Nominees Named Soon

The **R&R** Industry Achievement awards for Country will be handed out in Dallas during R&R Convention 2006's two Country format sessions. The radio honors for PD, MD and Personality of the Year will be presented at the end of the "Texas Music: Boon Or Bane" session, set for Wednesday, Sept. 20 from 3:30-5pm.

The awards for the Station of the Year for markets 1-25, 26-100 and 101+, respectively, and for Platinum and Gold Labels of the Year will be given out immediately following the panel set for Thursday, Sept. 21 from 3:30-5pm. The session is called "The Talking Hats Of Country Programming" and will include some of the top corporate Country programmers.


The finalists in all categories will be highlighted in the Aug. 18 issue of **R&R**, which will also contain an awards ballot.

"WYCD is No. 3 in women with a 6.8. The morning show moves 5.7-6.1 among women 25-54 and is fifth among women 18-49. In middays we are tied for first among women 25-54 with a 7.1. Middays also have us No. 1 in women 18-49, with an 8.4." As for men, Roberts noted, "WYCD is No. 3 with men 25-54, with a 4.6, and No. 3 in men 18-49, with a 5.3."

WYCD also did well among 18-34s. "We're fourth with a 6.8," said Roberts. "Middays shows us No. 2 with an 8.3, and in afternoons we're third, also with an 8.3."

Los Angeles: KZLA moved 1.8-1.7 and from No. 21 to a tie for 20th place, 12+. PD R. J. Curtis gave **R&R** this overview of KZLA's spring book:

"While KZLA was basically flat from winter to spring, we had a lousy Phase Three and a low wobble with 25-54 females. But we're in good shape overall. TSL for KZLA is up year to year, Whitney Allen is growing audience every book in afternoons and is driving the station, and KZLA continues to grow in Orange County, where we're consistently top 10 and up every book for the last five ratings periods."

Orange County is where the L.A. metro Country life group is densely concentrated. Curtis also notes that KZLA improved among listeners 25-54 by five-tenths of a share from winter to spring."

Philadelphia: WXTU jumped 3.9-5.1 and rose from eighth to fifth place, 12+. In the 18-49 demo, WXTU's shares rose 3.7-4.5. PD **Bob McKay** was ecstatic, telling **R&R**, "This is one of the books from the gods you want to bronze. It starts and ends with music, which has never been better and deeper than it is now."

Looking beyond 12+, McKay says of the spring results, "Our Evans and Andi morning show had an awesome book. This was the first time ever our morning show has been in the Top 5. It's one of the few morning shows in the country that plays 10 records an hour plus has lots of entertainment value and lots of spots. It's a challenge to get it all in there, but we're now seeing the benefits."

Especially noteworthy was the Sunday afternoon ratings, where WXTU was No. 1 with men 25-54. "We've never done that before," said McKay. "It's because of NASCAR. This was our second year with it — we were the first major market to carry NASCAR. We have three tracks — Dover, Pocono and Watkins Glen — in the area. I was opposed to it at first, but when you remove yourself from being a purist programmer, it does make sense. We don't run the collateral programming — just the race. We announce a \$500 song during the race, with the winner announced the next morning."

This Week At Callout America

Our weekly analysis of Country callout research is brought to you by Bullseye President John Hart. Here's a look at some of the biggest stories Hart looks at in next week's issue.

"Carrie Underwood moves into the No. 1 slot this week with 'Don't Forget to Remember Me,' up from last week's No. 2 spot. Gary Allan's 'Life Ain't Always Beautiful' sees strong gains as the No. 2 song, up from last week's No. 4 position. Eric Church's 'How 'Bout You' shows real strength as the No. 6 song for the week. Rodney Atkins is new to the top 10 with 'If You're Going Through Hell...,' which rises from No. 12 to No. 9. Josh Gracin moves ahead strongly with 'Favorite State of Mind,' which climbs from No. 18 to No. 13."

WXTU's primary promotion was a take off on NBC-TV's *Deal Or No Deal*. "We called it 'Deal or Not,'" said McKay. "I credit it for our TSL increase of 90 minutes. People chose two of 92 cases that contained cash, airline tickets, concert tickets in other cities, signed guitars and other stuff. It had all kinds of drama and sounded great — it's a contest made for radio."


Janese Joins Broken Bow

The GM is **Frank Calderaro**, and **Jim Radler** is the PD. Radler's background includes stints at WWFG/Salisbury-Ocean City, MD; WXTU/Philadelphia; WPKX/Springfield, MA; WKLB/Boston; and WIOV/Lancaster, PA.

Equity Music Group has renewed the contract of Sr. VP/National Promotion **David Haley** through 2008. He joined the label in 2005. Label President **Mike Kraski** noted, "There's no doubt that David is one of the most talented promotion executives in the music business today, so I couldn't be happier that we have come to terms on a contract extension. 
