Wreckers Make Chart History

The Wreckers make a permanent mark in the chart history books as "Leave the Pieces" (Maverick/Warner Bros./WRN) gains 1.3 million audience impressions and rises 2-1, marking the first time in 15 years that a debut single by a new duo hits the summit. That hasn't happened since **Brooks & Dunn** took "Brand New Man" to the top of the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven chart in September 1991.

When sister publication *Billboard*'s 62 years of country chart history are applied to this feat, it is only the second time during that frame that a new female duo's debut single rings the top bell. No new female duo has reached No. 1 with their first outing since **The Davis Sisters (Skeeter Davis** and **Betty Jack Davis)** did so in the fall of 1953 with "I Forgot More Than You'll Ever Know." That song remained atop *Billboard*'s country chart for eight weeks.

The Wreckers (**Michelle Branch** and **Jessica Harp**) dominate with 35.8 million impressions, with spins detected at each of the 138 stations monitored for the **R&R** country chart by Nielsen BDS. They interrupt a four-week run atop the chart by **Rodney Atkins**' "If You're Going Through Hell (Before the Devil Even Knows)" (Curb), which dips 1-3.

In other chart news, **Keith Urban**'s "Once in a Lifetime" (Capitol Nashville) achieves Airpower in its second chart week. Airpower is awarded to songs that appear inside the top 20 in spins and audience for the first time with increases in both. One week after becoming the highest debut in the history of *Billboard* and **R&R**'s country singles charts, Urban's track makes 18.3 million audience impressions at 133 monitored stations. To find another single that young on this week's chart, you have to drop down to No. 45, where Urban's labelmate **Eric Church** sees his "Two Pink Lines" gain 415,000 impressions.

She landed at Capitol in 2004.

"**Billy Currington** is new to the top five with 'Why, Why, Why,' ranking at No. 2 overall — up from No. 6. It is also the No. 5 passion song. Men rank the song at No. 2 and females at No. 5. Both younger 25-34 and core 35-44 listeners rank the song at No. 2.

The Week's News In Review

Here are some of the major stories that appeared in last week's R&R Country Daily:

RRCD Monday, Aug. 21: Arriving with 15 million audience impressions at No. 17, **Keith Urban** shatters the **Nielsen Broadcast Data** Systems-era record for the highest debut on the **R&R** Country chart, topping a No. 18 start by **Garth Brooks'** "Good Ride Cowboy" in October 2005. The new Urban single introduces an as-yet-untitled new album, which starts scanning at retail Nov. 7. Get complete details in tonight's R&R Country Update.

The country radio and record communities were saddened to receive the news over the weekend that longtime WTCR/Huntington, W. Va. MD/afternoon drive personality **Dave Poole** (a.k.a. **Dave McClain**) succumbed to a second cerebral hemorrhage on Saturday afternoon (8/19). A 25-year veteran of the station, Poole suffered the attack while at work last Monday (8/14). After recovering from a similar attack in 1996, Poole authored a book about the experience titled "One In a Million." Poole, age 50, is survived by his wife, Charlotte, and two grown stepchildren.


RRCD Tuesday, Aug. 22: The Dixie Chicks documentary *Dixie Chicks: Shut Up and Sing* has secured a worldwide distribution arrangement with The

Weinstein Company, according to VNU sister publication *The Hollywood Reporter*. The documentary, which chronicles the lives and career of the trio is slated to make its world premiere next month at the Toronto International Film Festival, but The Weinstein Company has not yet released a firm street date for the project. The THR report, however, indicates that a fall release could put the film's debut somewhere close to the mid-term congressional elections which happen on Tuesday, Nov. 7.

RRCD Wednesday, Aug. 23: Following Emmis' flip of country KZLA/Los Angeles to Rhythmic AC, industry forces have set about to make sure country listeners in the market don't go without options. The Country Music Assn. offered marketing assistance, and XM Sattelite Radio, Live Nation and the Academy of Country Music have now joined the effort. Satcaster XM has replaced KZLA as the new sponsor of Country Bash '06, the market's largest annual country music festival, slated for Oct. 14 at the Verizon Wireless Amphitheatre. The event features **Gretchen** Wilson, SheDaisy, Phil Vassar, Jamie O'Neal and REO Speedwagon. Tickets go on sale for the event on Saturday (8/26). XM Executive VP/Programming **Eric Logan** says, "By sponsoring 'Country Bash '06," XM is sending a message loud and clear to country fans in L.A. and across the country [that] XM radio loves country music." In teaming with Live Nation as promotional partners, the Burbank, CA-based ACM's Romeo adds, "Country music has been a huge part of Southern California's heritage. With the loss of KZLA, we need to keep country alive in Los Angeles now more than ever."

RRCD Thursday, Aug. 24: Curb Records Chairman and former California lieutenant governor **Mike Curb** has pledged \$10 million to California

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State University/Northridge to endow his alma mater's arts college. The gift will help launch the university's new regional performing arts center that will double as a learning laboratory for its students. Curb launched his music-industry career as an 18year-old student composing songs while attending the college. The university's board of trustees is expected to approve a name change for the arts college to the Mike Curb College of Arts, Media and Communication.

RRCD Friday, Aug. 25: Clear Channel Radio has initiated a new way of running its operations, with fewer layers of management. In the new alignment, there will be four senior VPs managing specific groups of markets, four senior VPs of programming, 12 regional VPs managing specific markets and 10 markets will have a president & market manager with exclusive responsibility for that single market.





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
