Chesney Snags Second CMA Entertainer Trophy

Underwood & Urban Take Top Female, Male Honors As Hosts Dominate

For the first time in its modern history, the annual Country Music Assn. Awards ceremony weren't held in the 4,400-seat WSM Grand Ole Opry House in suburban Nashville. Staged in downtown Nashville for the first time since the groundbreaking network special left its early home at the Ryman Auditorium in the early 1970s, the trade association's 40th anniversary awards ceremony took place Monday (Nov. 6) at the Gaylord Entertainment Center arena, where **Kenny Chesney** was named entertainer of the year. The coveted annual award also went home with Chesney in 2004.

Show hosts **Brooks & Dunn** took home the most trophies with wins in the duo, single and video categories (the latter two for "Believe"). **Ronnie Dunn** was also awarded along with fellow songwriter **Craig Wiseman** for song of the year for Brooks & Dunn's "Believe." Brooks & Dunn's duo award is the pair's 14th trip to the podium in that field.

Brad Paisley celebrates his first win in the album of the year category with "Time Well Wasted," and his collaboration with Dolly Parton on "When I Get Where I'm Going" yielded a musical event nod.

In the female vocalist category, **Carrie Underwood** pulled an upset victory in a category that inlcuded format vets Martina McBride, Faith Hill, Sara Evans and 2005 winner Gretchen Wilson. The CMA audience was audibly as surprised and pleased as Underwood, who also won the CMA Horizon award for career development.

The "American Idol" winner spent six weeks at No. 1 on the Nielsen BDS-driven **R&R** country chart with "Jesus, Take the Wheel" in January and tops the chart this issue with "Before He Cheats."

Top male vocalist honors went to **Keith Urban**, his third. Urban was the CMA's 2005 male winner and entertainer of the year. Vocal group of the year applause went to **Rascal Flatts**, the trio's fourth consecutive win on that slate.

Hall of fame inductees as previously announced are veteran session guitarist and Music Row pioneer **Harold Bradley**, all-time No. 1 singles leader **George Strait** and '60s and '70s chart kingpin **Sonny James**. Respected instrumentalist/producer **Randy Scruggs** won the CMA musician of the year award for a third time. He first won in 1999 and repeated in 2003.

The show was telecast for the first time on ABC-TV after many years on CBS-TV.



BMI, SESAC Recognize Top Writers And Publishers

The BMI Country Awards turned 54 in style with a gala at the performing rights organization's Nashville headquarters on Saturday (Nov. 4).

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When it came to the evening's biggest honors, **Toby Keith**'s hit "As Good As I Once Was," co-written by Keith and **Scotty Emerick**, was named song of the year. Big Yellow Dog Music, Florida Cracker Music, Sony/ATV Tree and Tokeco Tunes published the tune.

Keith picked up his third songwriter of the year crown (he also won in 2001 and 2004), this time sharing the honor with **Ed Hill** and **Vicky McGehee**. The three songwriters each laid claim to three of the top 50 award-winning songs. For McGehee, it was "All Jacked Up," "Hicktown" and "Like We Never Loved At All," while Hill's hits included "Georgia Rain," "Somebody's Hero" and "Songs About Me." It was Hill's first BMI songwriter of the year title. Keith, meanwhile, scored with "Big Blue Note," "HonkyTonk U" and "As Good As I Once Was."

With 17 entries among this year's top 50 mostperformed songs, Sony/ATV Music Publishing Nashville snagged publisher of the year honors for the fifth consecutive year. The publisher picked up similar honors from rival performing rights group ASCAP a few weeks ago.

Meanwhile, American music legend Merle Haggard was honored as the newest BMI Icon. One of the evening's highlights was the tribute to Hag, which included performances by Martina McBride, John Anderson and Hank Williams Jr. Over the years, Haggard has picked up 48 BMI Country Awards, nine BMI Pop Awards, a BMI R&B Award and 16 BMI "Million-Air" awards for hits like "Big City," "The Fightin' Side of Me," "Mama Tried," "Okie From Muskogee" and "Workin' Man Blues."

The 2006 awards also honored **Brett Beavers**, **Ronnie Dunn**, Emerick, **Aimee Mayo**, **Terry McBride**, **Tom Shapiro**, **Shaye Smith**, **Jeffrey Steele**, **George Teren**, **Keith Urban** and **Phillip White**, who each supplied two songs to the top 50 list.

Interestingly, "Goodbye Time," co-written by **Roger Murrah** and **James Dean Hicks**, earned its second BMI Country Award this year. **Conway Twitty**'s 1989 version won the first time around, and **Blake Shelton**'s

"Tim McGraw moves into the No. 1 position with 'My Little Girl,' up from No. 4, and also repeats as the No. 1 passion song. Females rank this song at No. 1, as do listeners 45-54. Men rank it at No. 8.

"Montgomery Gentry hop into the top five this week with 'Some People Change,' ranking at No. 5, up from No. 7 last week. The song ranks as the No. 2 passion song overall. Both male and female listeners rank this song at No. 6, and core 35-44 listeners rank it at No. 2.

"Brad Paisley's 'She's Everything' is new to the top 10 at Callout America as the No. 8 song, up from No. 11, and as the No. 8 passion song, up from No. 10 last week. Females are the strength, ranking this song at No. 7 for the week, up from No. 12.

"Toby Keith makes another strong move with 'Crash Here Tonight' at No. 12. Up from No. 17 last week and No. 24 two weeks back, this song also the No. 11 passion song, up from No. 13. Females are the strength, ranking the song at No. 10, up from No. 14. In the demos, core 35-44 listeners rank the song at No. 12, up from No. 17.

"After just seven weeks, **Rodney Atkins** pops up at No. 20 with 'Watching You,' up from No. 24 last week. This song is also the No. 17 passion song, up from No. 23."

Sagrabeaux Songs, Songs of Windswept Pacific, Tokeco Tunes and Warner-Tamerlane Publishing Corp. BMI first honored the genre's songwriters and publishers with its own awards show in 1953.

On Sunday (Nov. 5), SESAC staged its annual awards ceremony at its Music Row headquarters. This year, one song, "If You're Going Through Hell (Before the Devil Even Knows)," as recorded by **Rodney Atkins**, dominated the SESAC country awards. Husband and wife songwriting team **Sam** and **Annie Tate** were named SESAC's country songwriters of the year on the strength of the song, and "If You're Going Through Hell" was named country song of the year.

In addition, Carnival Music, the publisher of the four-week No. 1, was named SESAC's country publisher of the year. **Frank Liddell** and **Travis Hill** of Carnival were in attendance and accepted the honors.

SESAC also recognized the impact of the Americana format during the night's festivities, handing out awards to several top artists and songwriters in the genre including Ray Wylie Hubbard, Kevin Welch, Buck Jones, Kieran Kane and Walt Wilkins. Among the evening's many highlights was a standout performance by Americana awardwinning group The Greencards. A spirited version of "If You're Going Through Hell" was offered up Atkins, who was joined by songwriters Sam and Annie Tate.

In other publishing news, **Beth Mason** has joined BMI's Nashville office as associate director, writer/publisher relations. Mason was previously catalog/creative manager for Windswept Pacific and will start at BMI on Nov. 27, reporting to VP of writer-publisher relations, Nashville, Jody Williams.

Radio News: New Morning Show For WDAF; Chase To San Antonio

Veteran country morning team **Darren Wilhite** and **Tim Wall** land at Entercom country WDAF/Kansas City, where they replace **David Lawrence**, who recently retired. Most recently at Citadel country WTNR (Thunder)/Grand Rapids, the pair first hooked up at KKIX/Fayetteville, Ark. in 1988. They later moved to WFMB/

Springfield, Ill.; WIVK/Knoxville, Tenn.; and WYCD/Detroit. They won CMA broadcast personalities of the year awards in 1992 and 2001. Wilhite tells **R&R** that the duo has "wanted to work in Kansas City for years. Tim went to grade school in [nearby] Blue Springs [Mo.] before moving to St Louis." "[We] hope we can eventually fill the large shoes left by David Lawrence," Wilhite added.

In other late-breaking radio news, veteran programmer **Randy Chase** leaves Double O Radio's Columbia, S.C. country/classic country combo WWNU (New 92) and WWNQ for the PD gig at Cox country combo KCYY (Y100) and KKYX/San Antonio. He replaces **Roger Allen**, who as previously reported, remains OM for KCYY, KKYX and rhythmic KPWT, as well as PD for oldies KONO-AM & FM. Chase joined Double 0 two years ago from Guaranty Broadcasting/Baton Rouge, where he served as director of programming for the cluster and PD for country WYPY and classic country WTGE.

Back in Columbia, morning man and former WSOC/Charlotte OM **Jeff Roper** becomes interim PD.

Clear Channel WWYZ/Hartford MD **Evan Boyer** exits in a budget-based realignment. PD **Pete Salant** takes over MD duties.

Meanwhile, Beasley WKML/Fayetteville, N.C. PD **Paul Johnson** has been named interactive sales manager for the company's cluster there. In addition to WKML, Beasley's holdings in Fayetteville include classic hits WFLB, urban WZFX, urban AC WUKS, gospel WTEL and adult standards WAZZ. WKML MD **Deano** has been named interim PD.

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On The Charts: Carrie Takes Two; McGraw, Montgomery Gentry Advance

Carrie Underwood's second No. 1 on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven R&R Country chart becomes her second multiple-week chart topper as "Before He Cheats" (Arista/Arista Nashville) gains 162,000 audience impressions (37.6 million impressions during the tracking week) to encore at No. 1. Underwood's "Jesus, Take the Wheel" spent six weeks at No. 1 earlier this year. Although her wide lead of more than four million impressions over the No. 2 title might tempt Underwood to get comfortable in the No. 1 box, the runnerup has designs on top ink. Rascal Flatts' "My Wish" (Lyric Street) gains more than 2 million impressions and vaults 5-2 with the third-largest increase on the chart.

Rodney Atkins' "Watching You" (Curb) logs the Most Increased Audience, up 2.4 million (23-19), while **George Strait's** "It Just Comes Natural" (MCA Nashville) posts the second-largest gain, up 2.3 million (18-12).

Concurrently, **Tim McGraw**'s "My Little Girl" (Curb) advances 8-5 to become the artist's 34th top-five hit (+2.0 million impressions). McGraw's top-five tally includes 21 singles that have risen to No. 1, most recently achieved with "Back When," which topped the chart dated Dec. 10, 2004.

Meanwhile, **Montgomery Gentry**'s "Some People Change" (Columbia) hops 11-9, marking the duo's 10th title to compete in that part of the chart. The 10 top 10 titles includes two No. 1 singles, "If You Ever Stop Loving Me" (2004) and "Something to Be Proud Of" (2005).

In other chart highlights, **Brooks & Dunn** claim the Most Added nod on the **R&R** Country chart with 15 new stations as "Hillbilly Deluxe" (Arista Nashville) takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 57 (1.0 million impressions). **Danielle Peck**'s "Isn't That Everything" (Big Machine) bows at No. 60 (730,000 impressions). Airpower honorees this week are Rodney Atkins' "Watching You" (Curb) and **Craig Morgan**'s "Little Bit

Sugarland set the bar high with their first album, *Twice the Speed of Life*, which spawned two top-five singles and won numerous awards. No wor-

ries about a sophomore slump here. From the frenetic small-town anthem "County Line" to the Springsteen-esque blue-collar country rock of "These Are the Days" and "One Blue Sky," Sugarland's sophomore offering is right on target. When Jennifer Nettles sings, "You've got my heart and your daddy's boat, we've got all night to make it float," the listener is immediately privy to the exploration of young love as detailed on "Want To." Nettles recently told *Billboard* that country music is "still there telling the story of the everyday man and woman." She's right, and the same can be said of Sugarland. —Ken Tucker

Haggard's take on "The Window Up Above" is a memorable retelling of Jones' classic tale of love gone wrong, and their duet on Bob Russell and Duke Ellington's "Don't Get Around Much Anymore," complete with playful patter, is a perfect close to this wonderful collection. The only disappointment is that it took almost 25 years for Haggard and Jones to team up again. —Ken Tucker



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


