Capitol Nashville Steals Chart Headlines

Urban & Bentley Bow, But Carrie Still Reigns

Capitol's Nashville shop dominates this week's chart ink as Keith Urban's "Stupid Boy" takes the Hot Shot Debut on the R&R country list at No. 38, and **Dierks** Bentley's "Long Trip Alone" pops on at No. 42. While Urban's arrival becomes the chart's 11th title to debut inside the top 40 since Jan. 1, Bentley's new tune opens at his highest level to date, topping the No. 45 start he posted with "Every Mile a Memory" on the Nielsen **Broadcast Data Systems**-driven chart dated July 7.

Urban's single also claims the Most Added prize on the R&R country list with 35 reports. His audience is led by 383,000 impressions during the tracking week at KSCS/Dallas, and Bentley's song got the most spins at WCKT/Ft. Myers (51 plays).

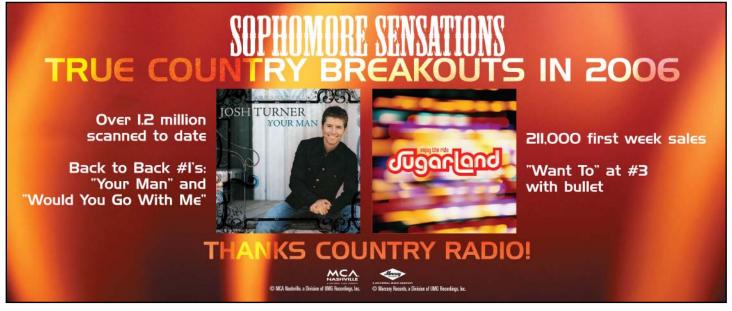
Although Urban's No. 38 debut is certainly nothing to sneeze at - it is his third to bow inside the top 40 he continues to hold the Nielsen BDS-era record for high debuts. For the monitored era (which began in January 1990), Urban's "Once in a Lifetime" is the chart's highest debut at No 17. That single peaked at No. 6 in the R&R dated Oct. 6 and tumbles to No. 10 this week. At least in the modern era, quick starts don't always translate into No. 1 records. Garth Brooks' "The Thunder Rolls" held the Nielsen BDS-era record (No. 19) for more than 14 years before he broke it in October 2005 when "Good Ride Cowboy" opened at No. 18, then peaked at No. 3. The two Brooks singles and Urban's "Lifetime" are the only three titles in the monitored era to debut inside the top 20.

A deeper look into the chart's highest debuts also reveals a pattern of peak positions just shy of No. 1. Among the 19 singles that opened and peaked inside the top 30 during the Nielsen BDSera, only eight of those titles spent time at No. 1. Five others peaked elsewhere inside the top five, four more dented the top 10 but missed the top five, and two others didn't even make the top 20.

For Bentley, the new arrival follows what can only be described as stellar chart performances to date. Of his seven previous singles, only one peaked outside the top five ("My Last Name" stopped at No. 17 two years ago), and all but three have reached No. 1. With just nine charted titles, Bentley has already amassed 201 weeks on the Nielsen BDS-fueled chart. He spent four weeks on the list with "Domestic, Light and Cold," based on unsolicited album play.

High atop the chart, Carrie Underwood's "Before He Cheats" (Arista Nashville) logs a fourth week at No. 1, placing the song in a three-way tie for third place among titles that have spent the longest atop the chart since Jan. 1. Underwood's new single matches the four weeks at No. 1 logged by Rascal Flatts' "What Hurts the Most" and Rodney Atkins' "If You're Going Through Hell (Before the Devil Even Knows)." Kenny Chesney's "Summertime" is the only title so far this year to amass five weeks at No. 1, and Underwood's "Jesus, Take the Wheel" has the longest No. 1 run so far in 2006 with six weeks at the summit.

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Underwood still has time to beat her own record, though. If she ends up capping the chart for seven weeks, "Before He Cheats" will be the chart's first title to dominate that long since **Tim McGraw**'s "Live Like You Were Dying." That track spent seven cumulative weeks at No. 1, interrupted for one week by **Reba McEntire**'s "Somebody" in August 2004.

In other chart action, **George Strait** collects his 73rd top 10 with "It Just Comes Natural" (MCA Nashville), which gains 2.1 million audience impressions and hops 11-9. Of course, Strait's camp is undoubtedly hoping "Natural" will pad his lead as the artist with the most No. 1 country singles since *Billboard* launched the nation's first country chart in 1944. He achieved his 41st (and record-breaking) chart-topper with "Give It Away" earlier this year.

Among current country stars that rank on the alltime list, **Alan Jackson** has 22, Tim McGraw has 21, **Brooks & Dunn** have 20 and Garth Brooks has 18.

Meanwhile, Rodney Atkins' "Watching You" (Curb) advances 16-13 and takes the Most Increased Audience applause, up 3.2 million impressions. Airpower honors are handed to **The Wreckers**' "My, Oh My" (Maverick/Warner Bros./WRN) and **Jason Michael Carroll**'s "Alyssa Lies." Airpower is awarded to songs that appear inside the top 20 in audience and detections for the first time, with increases in both. The duo's single rises 21-19, and Carroll's song leaps 23-20 on the **R&R** country chart.

On the **R&R** country Indicator chart, Rascal Flatts spend a second week at No. 1 with "My Wish" (Lyric Street), which collects 3,969 plays (active at 99 reporters), up 47 plays. Keith Urban's "Stupid Boy" repeats its Most Added feat on the Indicator list with 34 reports. **Martina McBride's** "Anyway" (RCA) takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 33 (753 plays, active at 59 reporters), and **Blake Shelton's** "Don't Make Me" (Warner Bros./WRN) starts at No. 40 with 514 spins (active at 49 reporters). McBride's single turns in the biggest increase, up 390 plays.

From R&R CHR/Top 40 chart manager, **Gary Trust** in New York: While **Hinder**'s "Lips of an Angel" (Universal Republic) drops to No. 2 after a three-week reign on the

"Following an awesome Country Music Assn. (CMA) awards show performance, **Sugarland** take over the top spot in this week's R&R Callout America. Up from No. 2 last week, 'Want To' is also the No. 1 passion song for the week. Females are the strength, ranking the song at No. 1 while men rank it at No. 2.

"Tim McGraw is still a powerhouse with 'My Little Girl,' the No. 2 song overall and the No. 4 passion song. Females rank this song at No. 2, and men rank it at No. 7. Females 25-34 rank the song at No. 1, while younger radio listeners 25-34 rank the song at No. 2 in the demo. Seventy-five percent of all female listeners say they want to hear this song more on the radio.

"The No. 1 song with male country listeners is 'Ladies Love Country Boys' from **Trace Adkins**. The song is also new to the top five at R&R Callout America, ranking as the No. 4 song — up from No. 8 last week. Core 35-44 listeners also rank this song at No. 1, and 74% of those core listeners want to hear the song more.

"Billy Currington is off to a strong start with 'Good Directions,' which debuts as the No. 20 song at R&R Callout America and as the No. 22 'Like a Lot' song. Younger 25-34 listeners rank this song at No. 17 in its first week. Females overall rank the song at No. 22, and men rank it at No. 17 — a solid debut."

R&R CHR/top 40 chart, a new version of the song debuts on the **R&R** country list, as **Jack Ingram** bows at No. 48 with a cover on the Big Machine label. How rare is it for top-peaking pop titles to appear at country? In the Nielsen BDS-era (beginning in 1990 at country and in 1992 at CHR/top 40), no original versions of a CHR/top 40 No. 1 hit have crossed to the country list, and "Lips" is just



the third CHR/top 40 No. 1 to make the country chart as recorded by a different artist. The previous two both topped their respective charts: "I Don't Want to Miss a Thing" by **Aerosmith** at CHR/top 40 in1998 and **Mark Chesnutt** at country in 1999; and "I Swear" by **John Michael Montgomery** first at country, then by **All-4-One** at CHR/top 40, both in 1994.

Housekeeping: As previously announced, our policy for removing recurrents from the R&R country and R&R country Indicator charts changes this week. Descending non-bulleted titles are now removed from the chart after 20 weeks when they fall below No. 10. Under the previous rule, such titles were removed after 20 weeks when they fell below No. 15.

Radio News: KASE/Austin Expands Morning Show

Veteran air personality **Julie K** will join Clear Channel's KASE/Austin as part of the morning team on Dec. 4. K, who is currently part of the morning show at Entercom adult hits **WSMW** (98-7 Simon)/Greensboro, N.C., joins incumbents **Bama** and **Rob Mason** at KASE. She has worked in Colorado Springs, Dallas, Washington and Wilkes Barre, among other markets.

Financials: Investors appeared to take a wait-and-see approach Monday (Nov. 20), delivering mixed results on Wall Street as the Dow Index stumbled, dropping 26.03 points to a 12,316.54 close. But the tech-filled NASDAQ managed to land 6.86 points into positive territory at 2,452.72, and the S&P 500 took a slip of 0.70 to 1,400.50.

Radio stocks had a tougher time with 18 of the 30 radio issues on the Radio & Records Index in the red. **Salem**, which has had some tough trading days recently, led winners with a 42-cent increase to \$12.15, gaining most of its increase very late in the trading day. Volume was generally light, with 17,302 SALM shares traded. **Journal Communications** gained 40 cents to \$11.90, and **Saga** picked up 17 cents to \$8.84.

FastChannel Network rose 16 cents to \$12, while **Harris** had a 48-cent gain to \$43.06.

Interep, struggling since last week when it released miserable Q3 earnings, lost a nickel, or almost 12% of its value, Monday to close at 37 cents. Westwood One, also a beaten issue of late, fell 16 cents to \$6.62. Cumulus dropped 23 cents to \$11.01, XM Satellite Radio fell 22 cents to \$14.47, Cox Radio dipped 18 cents to \$16.54 and Sony slid by 67 cents to \$40.12. Spanish Broadcasting System was unchanged at \$3.96 a share.

Also of note, the FCC on Monday announced that there were 13,793 radio stations on the air in the U.S. as of Sept. 30. Of that, 4,751 were AM stations, 6,252 were commercial FM stations and 2,769 of them operated under educational or non-commercial licenses. The commission also said there are 746 low-power FM radio stations on the air and 4,087 FM translators and boosters.

There were 1,754 very-high-power and ultrahigh-power TV stations on the air and a slew TV translators and low-powered TV stations operating in all 50 states and its territories. In all, there were 27, 654 broadcast stations operating at midyear, the FCC reported.

Clear Channel Update: Anytime a public corporation makes a "significant move," it expects shareholder lawsuits to follow, a D.C. lawyer familiar with the process tells R&R. "They know what they're in for and plan for it." So, he wasn't surprised to learn that a Texas woman filed suit in Texas District Court against Clear Channel and its board of directors on Nov. 16, just hours after the San Antonio company announced that its board voted to accept a \$26.7 billion offer from a group led by of Thomas H. Lee Partners, L.P. and Bain Capital Partners LLC.

According to a report filed by Reuters, the woman, **Lou Ann Murphy**, wants the Bexar County District Court to grant her an injunction against the



deal or damages should the transaction be completed. She has also asked that her suit get class action status. In the suit, she claims that the \$37.60 per share price accepted by the board is a "wholly inadequate price." In a 23-point Q&A posted on corporate portion of Clear Channel's website on Monday, the company addresses a variety of stockholder questions and explains, "What happens next?" The company says "within 30 days, Clear Channel will file a preliminary proxy statement with the SEC. This proxy statement will contain information about the transaction and will be available to the public. Once any SEC review is completed, a definitive proxy statement will be filed with the SEC and mailed to shareholders. Following the mailing of the definitive proxy statement, a meeting will be held within 45 days after the proxy mailing and shareholders will vote on the transaction. If the merger is approved and all regulatory approvals and other closing conditions are met thereafter, the merger can be closed."

The company also notes that it will take a twothirds majority shareholder vote to approve the deal and that shareholders will continuing earning dividends on CCU shares until the merger closes, at which time they will get \$37.60. But it is also clear that it will take time to clear all of the hurdles. "In addition, if the completion of the merger occurs after Jan. 1, 2008, you will also receive an additional 'ticking fee' in an amount equal to the lesser of (i) the pro rata portion, based upon the number of days elapsed since Jan. 1, 2008, of \$37.60 multiplied by 8% per annum, per share and (ii) Clear Channel's Free Cash Flow (as defined in the merger agreement) generated during the period from Jan. 1, 2008 until closing," the Q&A explains. It adds, "We currently anticipate that the transaction will be completed by the end of year 2007, depending on regulatory approvals."

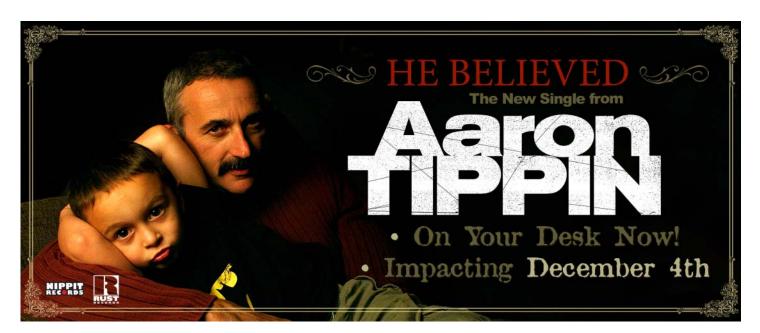

DARRYL WORLEY "Here And Now" (903 Music) Producer: Frank Rogers



In a recent exclusive interview with **R&R** about his new "Here and Now" album, Darryl Worley says, "We took a different approach to this new album, which is really raucous and rowdy and shows another side of me." Worley's description of his fifth

album is mostly accurate — taken as a whole, "Here and Now" is less of an extreme makeover for this appealing country traditionalist than he makes it out to be. A remarkable and compelling artistic growth experience would be a more apt description. To be sure, there's more rock and roll guitar and a self-assuredness found in noticeably smaller doses on his previous four outings.

For the most part, when established country artists proclaim a new album to be a dramatic stylistic departure, fans and critics are preconditioned to expect, well, a dramatic stylistic departure. While Worley's new album is certainly more amped-up sonically, it is an utter triumph in terms of song selection and delivery. Although the uptempo fare is certainly the star of this show, "Things I'll Never Do Again" wouldn't be half as effective in less capable hands, and only Worley could bring the authentic emotion necessary to avoid accusations of opportunism with "I Just Came Back From a War." Hopefully, the label won't overlook "Slow Dancing with a Memory" when picking future singles. Worley has a new record label, a new look and one of the year's

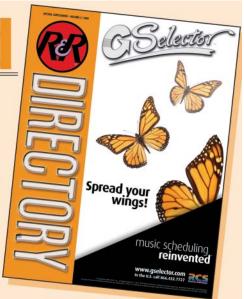
