





Urban, Sugarland Dominate Airplay News

McBride Brings Martin Back To Country Chart

With the Most Increased Audience honor on the R&R country chart, **Keith Urban**'s "Stupid Boy" (Capitol Nashville) spends its second week in the chart limelight. Up more than four million audience impressions, Urban's new single flies 38-28 with spins detected at 77 of the 114 stations monitored by Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems for chart tabulation. It is one of three titles inside the top 40 (and the highest rank of the three) with spins detected at fewer than 80 stations on the panel — the others are **Dierks Bentley**'s "Long Trip Alone" (Capitol Nashville) with 66 stations at No. 39 and Ashley Monroe's (with Ronnie Dunn) "I Don't Want To" (Columbia) with 67 stations at No. 40. Urban's top audience gain is tracked at WUSN/Chicago (+408,000 impressions), followed by **KEEY/Minneapolis** (+377,000), **KPLX/Dallas** (+324,000), **KILT/Houston** (+389,000) and WKLB/Boston (+386,000). The single aggregates 6.5 million impressions during the tracking week.

In the Most Added columns, Urban's single dominates for a second week with 23 adds at the **R&R** country panel. On the **R&R** country Indicator panel, "Stupid Boy" repeats its Most Added feat with 25 new reports. **Martina McBride**'s "Anyway" (RCA) returns as the Most Added runner-up on both panels (18 and 14 adds, respectively).

Sugarland's "Want To" (Mercury) claims top honors on the **R&R** country Indicator list, where it gains 67 plays and rises 2-1. The duo's single collects 4,032

plays during the tracking week and is active at 101 Indicator reporters. However, **Rascal Flatts** don't give up the top box without a fight — the trio's "My Wish" (Lyric Street) turns in 3,977 plays and bullets at No. 2 with an increase of eight spins.

Keith Urban's "Stupid Boy" takes the chart's highest debut this week at No. 33, while Dierks Bentley's "Long Trip Alone" also bows at No. 36. These two titles are active at 59 and 56 Indicator reporters, respectively.

Concurrently, Capitol Nashville and RCA have teamed up to promote Martina McBride's new duet with the late **Dean Martin** titled "Baby, It's Cold Outside." The new duet can be found on new pressings of Martin's 2004 collection "Christmas with Dino," a holiday package culled from Martin's holiday sides first issued on Reprise and Capitol. The duet pairing starts on the **R&R** country chart at No. 58, with spins detected at 22 monitored reporters. All recap points in the (promotion) label field will be split evenly between Capitol Nashville and RCA. This marks Martin's second visit to the country singles list. He first appeared when "My First Country Song," issued by Warner Bros., spent 12 weeks on the chart in 1983. That single peaked at No. 35 and featured vocals by **Conway Twitty**, who was also signed to Warner Bros. at the time.

While Martin wasn't a frequent competitor on the country singles charts, he recorded scores of

country-leaning material. He appeared twice on *Billboard's* Top Country Albums — first in 1971 with "For the Good Times" and in again 1983 with "The Nashville Sessions." Before the magazine introduced the nation's first country albums chart in 1964, Martin scored on Billboard's pop albums chart in 1963 with "Country Style," billed as Dean "Tex" Martin.

Speaking of holiday music, **Brad Paisley** brings an old favorite back to the chart with "Santa Looked a Lot Like Daddy" (Arista Nashville), which opens at No. 59 with spins detected at 27 monitored signals. The only previous version to impact the chart was **Garth Brooks**' 1992 reading from his "Beyond the Season" album, but the song was written by **Buck Owens** and **Don Rich** and first appeared on "Christmas with Buck Owens" in 1965.

Other highlights on this week's **R&R** country chart include Airpower honors for **Trace Adkins**' "Ladies Love Country Boys" (Capitol Nashville), which rises 22-20. Airpower is awarded to songs that appear for the first time inside the top 20 in both audience and detections, with increases in both. This week's Breakers (60% of the reporting panel showing detections) are **Brooks & Dunn's** "Hillbilly Deluxe" (Arista Nashville) and **Billy Currington**'s "Good Directions" (Mercury). Those titles move 37-34 and 39-37, respectively.

With a fifth week atop the **R&R** country chart, **Carrie Underwood**'s "Before He Cheats" (Arista/Arista Nashville) pads the "American Idol" winner's lead as the artist with the most cumulative weeks at No. 1 so far in 2006. She spent six weeks at No. 1 earlier this year with "Jesus, Take the Wheel," and her 11 cumulative weeks tops eight weeks at No. 1 for runner-up **Kenny Chesney**. So far in 2006, he's spent five weeks atop the chart with "Summertime" and logged three weeks at No. 1 with "Living in Fast Forward."

Meanwhile, **Lonestar**'s "Mountains" (BNA) rises 12-10 and becomes the group's 18th top 10 single. Lonestar remain in third place among groups with the most top

"Sugarland's 'Want To' continues to be the favorite of country radio listeners, repeating as the No. 1 song this week. Females are the strength, ranking the song at No. 1, while male listeners rank it at No. 3. Core 35-44 listeners rank 'Want To' at No. 1 in that demo, as do listeners 45-54.


"Tim McGraw is strong with 'My Little Girl' ranking at No. 3 overall this week. Females are his strength, as they rank this song at No. 2 — and as the No. 3 passion song. Younger females 25-34 rank the song at No. 1, while core 35-44 females rank it at No. 2 overall and as the No. 2 passion song.

"As awareness grows, **George Strait** continues to see meteoric growth in positive scoring with 'It Just Comes Natural.' This song is only eight weeks old, so it is early. This week, it ranks as the No. 11 song overall, up from No. 19 two weeks back. Men are the driving force, ranking the song at No. 7 for the week, up from No. 15 two weeks back. Females rank the song at No. 15, up from No. 20 two weeks back. Core 35-44 males and 45-54 males both rank this song at No. 4.

"The No. 1 song with men for the week is 'Ladies Love Country Boys' from **Trace Adkins**. Younger men 25-34 rank this song at No. 1, core males 35-44 rank it at No. 1, and men 45-54 rank the song at No. 2.". Females overall rank the song at No. 22, and men rank it at No. 17 — a solid debut."

10 songs in the 16-year-long Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-era. With 23 titles, **Alabama** have the most Nielsen BDS-era top 10s among country groups, followed by **Diamond Rio**'s 19 top 10 singles during that timeframe.

Also noteworthy in country's top 10 is the third



title to compete in that part of the chart by **Rodney Atkins**. His "Watching You" (Curb) rises 13-9 in its 11th chart week.

Radio News: Anemic Day On Wall Street

The major indexes charts looked like a stairway to the basement Monday (Nov. 27) as Wall Street tripped over its worst day in four months due to rising concerns from **Wal-Mart**'s disclosure that it had a 0.1% drop in same-store sales. While the world's No. 1 retailer reported strong sales over the long Thanksgiving weekend, investors and analysts worried that the company's first decline in a decade could be a sign of weaker holiday season sales. The Dow Jones Index of 30 industrials slipped 158.46 points, to 12,121.71; the NASDAQ fell 54.34, to 2,405.92; and the S&P 500 dropped 19.05, to 1,381.90.

Two dozen issues on the **Radio & Records Index** of 30 industry stocks fell into negative territory, while only five finished in the green, and one, **Interep**, was unchanged at 34 cents a share.

Saga was in front of winners with a 19-cent jump to \$8.91; **Salem** followed with a 9-cent gain to \$12; and **Corus Entertainment** grabbed 12 cents to \$35.87. **Clear Channel** gained 7 cents to \$35.35 while **Univision** earned 6 cents to \$35.44.

XM Satellite Radio topped losers with an 83-cent drop to \$14.44; **Warner Music Group** slipped \$1.20 to \$25.67; and **Emmis** fell 33 cents to a 52-week low of \$8.52. **Harris** lost \$1.48 to \$42.54, and **Sirius Satellite Radio** dropped 14 cents to \$4.12.

Regent, which also fell to a 52-week low, lost a nickel to close at \$3.16.

Geisler comes to the Marketing Group from his post as GM at KULM-FM, KNRG-FM & KZAM-FM/Columbus-Victoria, Texas. His resume includes stops at Houston stations KIKK and KILT and KVET/Austin. Geisler also hosts Impact Radio Network's daily feature, "Today in Country Music History."

Capitol Nashville has promoted **Dixie Weathersby** to senior director of media and public relations. Since joining the company three years ago, she was director of media and public relations. Weathersby will remain based in Nashville, reporting to **Fletcher Foster**, senior VP of marketing. In a prepared statement, Foster says, "Dixie's contributions in building this label's publicity



department, as well as her contributions in the development of our artists over the past 3 1/2 years, have been truly apparent. I'm really glad that we can recognize her hard work and dedication." Prior to joining Capitol Nashville, Weathersby held similar postions at CMT and the Country Music Assn.

Country Radio Broadcasters, Inc. (CRB) reminds attendees that the early bird registration rate of \$499 will end this Thursday, Nov. 30. CRS-38 will be held Feb. 28 through March 2, 2007 at the Nashville Convention Center.

Touring: The Coachella Valley Music & Arts **Festival** will expand to a three-day event for the first time in 2007 when it overtakes the Empire Polo Field in Indio, Calif. on April 27-29. The following weekend (May 5-6), Coachella promoters Goldenvoice will launch an as-yet-unnamed country music festival at the same venue, featuring **George** Strait, Kenny Chesney, Sugarland and Willie **Nelson.** According to a spokesperson, the new event will sport four performance stages: the main stage, an "outlaw" stage, a bluegrass stage and a "storytelling" area, the latter of which will feature appearances by "Prairie Home Companion" creator Garrison Keillor and Texas poet laureate Red Steagall. Lucinda Williams, Emmylou Harris, Nickel Creek, Ricky Skaggs, Earl Scruggs and Sparrow Quarter featuring Bela Fleck will also perform at the inaugural festival, which was booked by Coachella producer Paul Tollett, Louis Messina of TMG/AEG Live and Steve Moore of AEG Live Nashville.

"Kenny and George committed immediately, and they love the idea," Messina tells **R&R**. "This is the first year, and I think this is something that's going to be around for a long time and grow into something really special. This is Paul's dream, and I'm just happy to lend a hand."



Artist News: Gentry Makes Plea In Bear Case

Montgomery Gentry's **Troy Gentry** today (Nov. 27) pleaded to a lesser offense of inaccurately tagging a bear, based on the prosecution's recent decision to reduce the initial charge from a felony to a misdemeanor. While the case had nothing to do with the actual hunt — a legal act — Gentry accepts responsibility for a tag incorrectly submitted on his behalf, according to a press statement issued by Sony BMG Nashville.

The statement also says U.S. District Judge **Paul Magnuson** cited on record that to date, he received "a number of communications that did not reflect the charge at all" and therefore concurred that "Mr. Gentry didn't tag this bear properly. That's the charge." At no time was it ever alleged that the bear was harvested illegally.

Gentry's attorney, **Ron Meshbesher**, further explains that his client's response was to a "simple charge having to do with improper tagging of a game animal. That's all it ever was." Subject to the courts approval, the incorrect tagging could result in a \$15,000 fine and the forfeiture of his weapon and mounted bear.

Troy Gentry adds, "I did participate in improperly tagging the animal I shot without realizing the seriousness of what I was doing. For that, I am truly sorry. I relied on the experts around me for guidance, and I regret that today. Not so much because I was fined and punished, but because it appears that I




