Anthony has radio roots in Western Pennsylvania and was the PD at WEEP/Pittsburgh in the '80s. Since 1998, Anthony has been the director of FM programming for WARM& WSOX/ Harrisburg. In a statement, Keymarket VP of programming Frank Bell said, "We are delighted to find an experienced programmer familiar with the country audience, the Froggy brand and the Pittsburgh market." Other stops on Anthony's long and winding road include KILT/Houston, WCXI/Detroit, WKIX/ Raleigh and prior experience with the Froggy brand at WGRX (Froggy 100.7)/ Baltimore. Anthony will start his new position on April 9.

The Academy of Country Music and CBS-TV announced today that "After Midnite" host Blair Garner will serve as the on-air talent and host for the ACM's behindthe-scenes newsfeeds, offered via satellite from rehearsals at the 42nd Academy of Country Music Awards. Garner is considered one of the premier interviewers in any genre and has a long association with the ACMs. Garner is a two-time winner of the ACM trophy for National Broadcast Personality of the Year. His backstage live broadcasts following the awards have always attracted the biggest stars in the format. In recent years, I can remember watching Garner moderate a live, impromptu rap session with the likes of Keith Urban, Kenny Chesney and countless other top-tier artists. The ACMs are set for May 15, live from the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas and will be broadcast on CBS-TV.



Kenny Chesney has the No. 1 song with "Beer in Mexico" up from No. 3. "Beer" is also the No. 2 passion song, the No. 1 song with men and No. 4 with females. In the demos, this song is at No. 1 with both younger 25-34 and core 35-44 listeners.

Joe Nichols' "I'll Wait for You" is new to the top five this week — it's at No. 5, up from No. 8, and ranks as the No. 3 passion song. Both male and female listeners are strong: men at No. 5 and women at No. 6; younger 25-34s are the strength at No. 4 and as the No. 3 passion song.

Toby Keith is in the top 10 with "High Maintenance Woman" ranking as the No. 8 song, up strong from No. 11, and as the No. 9 passion song, up from No. 12. Men, as you would imagine, are the strength at No. 3, women rank the song at No. 12. Strength in the demos is from core 35-44s, where it's at No. 4.


Gary Allan is also new to the top 10 with "A Feeling Like That" ranking as the No. 10 song, up from No. 12. Younger listeners 25-34 are the strength at No. 5, core 35-44 listeners rank this song at No. 9. Men rank it at No. 6 and women at No. 11.

Josh Turner moves to No. 14 with "Me and God," up from No. 17, and shows strong "Like a Lot" scoring, ranking as the No. 10 passion song.

Jack Ingram is inside the top 20 with "Lips of an Angel" at No. 17 and the No. 11 passion song. Females rank this song at No. 10.

Entercom's WBEE/Rochester, N.Y. has been a mainstay in the market. In 2007, WBEE will celebrate with a series of anniversary concerts, including Jamie O'Neal, Dusty Drake, Mark Wills, Donavan Chapman and Steve Holy at "The Guitars and Stars Showcase" at The Dome Arena on May 9. We also hear other dayparts went live, with **Nicky Landry** in middays; we listened to **JoJo Kincaid** in afternoons online, and nights will be handled by **Tic-Tak**.

WFUS Is Reshaped

Or, reshuffled, as Clear Channel's WFUS/Tampa PD **Travis Daily** put it. The on-air lineup looks like this now: **Jenny Dean**, formerly of "The Skip Mahaffey Morning Show," is now teamed with Daily for afternoons. **Paul Koffy** moves from afternoons to middays. According to a statement from Daily, "We are still building a new radio station, and sometimes you need to change the playbook to win the game. We feel these moves will give us a better product for both our listeners and advertisers."

Our New Favorite Word In 2007: Caveat

Jon Coleman used that word a lot when presenting PPM data at this year's CRS that suggested when playing new music, the audience actually grew, especially when playing up-tempo songs and new songs from established artists. On the panel following the data presentation, WXTU/Philadelphia PD Bob McKay said he believed the PPM "flushes out phantom cume." That observation proved somewhat prophetic after Philadelphia received phase two of PPM data last Thursday. The caveat this time: "It's only a monthly," but the cume increase is striking. WXTU's 12+ cume for winter Phase 1 was 776,000, and 774,000 in Phase 2. That's an amazing number, when you consider its 12+ cume for fall was 428,300. The increases are just as drastic in demo. Fall 25-54 cume for WXTU was 266,000; Phase 2, 429,000. Beginning this Friday, April 6, McKay says he'll receive data on a weekly basis and promised to keep **R&R** posted on those results as well.

This Retreat Was the Epitome Of Hasty

On The Charts:

McGraw Scores No. 1, Takes High Debut

Up 2.3 million audience impressions, **Tim McGraw** collects his 22nd No. 1 on the R&R Country chart with "Last Dollar (Fly Away)" (Curb), which rises 2-1. This marks McGraw's first trip to the summit since "Back When" led the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven chart dated Dec. 10, 2004. However, he's had a few near-misses during that frame, including three singles that peaked inside the top five and one title that stopped at No. 6. This marks McGraw's longest stretch between chart-topping singles. Prior to this gap, McGraw had never gone more than a year between No. 1 songs since "Don't Take the Girl" became his first chart-topper in May 1994.

He caps the radio chart just in time for the debut of his new "Let It Go" album, which arrived at retail on March 27 and is expected to bow at or near the top of Billboard's Top Country Albums this week. Watch your R&R Country Daily on Wednesday (April 4) for an exclusive retail update.

As programmers sample the new album, McGraw's duet with wife **Faith Hill** posts the chart's highest debut. Opening with 726,000 impressions at No. 48, "I Need You" is detected at 48 of the 123 stations monitored by Nielsen BDS for this chart.

In the Most Added column, **Rodney Atkins** reigns on the R&R Country panel with "These Are My People" (Curb), which rakes in 19 reports. On the R&R Country Indicator list, **Trace Adkins** is Most Added with 10 reports for "I Wanna Feel Something" (Capitol Nashville). **Carrie Underwood** claims a new No. 1 on that chart with "Wasted" (Arista/Arista Nashville), which hops 3-1.

Housekeeping: Now that we've closed the books on the first quarter of 2007, we'll announce our quarterly panel changes based on first quarter current music usage on or before April 16.
