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WSM-FM/Nashville Fit For A King

Kevin King has been on the job as the new PD at Cumulus WSM-FM (95.5 The Wolf)/Nashville for about a week, and he's already hoping to set down some serious roots in Music City. This will be King's third stop in the last seven months, so his desire to stay awhile is understandable. It's not that he can't hold a job. For the last four months, King was at the Cumulus/Lexington, Ky. cluster, where he basically redefined the term "multitasking." King was the cluster OM, programmed active rock WXZZ day-to-day and did afternoons on country clustermate KLXX (The Bear). Prior to his short stint in Lexington, King was at WYGY/Cincinnati for just two months. His resume also includes a much longer stop at WYCT/Pensacola, Fla. King said he'll stay in Nashville "as long as they'll have me" and will focus on programming The Wolf, telling R&R, "We'll continue to build on the vision John Sebastian had here." Sebastian relaunched WSM-FM as "The Wolf" in September 2004 then left to program WJMK (Jack-FM) in Chicago, but recently returned to Cumulus, country and the Wolf brand when he took the KPLX (99.5 the Wolf)/Dallas PD gig. King replaces Sebastian's successor at WSM, Buddy Van Arsdale, who left earlier this year to take the PD position at Cox's WKHK/Richmond. According to King, "This is an important market for Cumulus, and I'm thrilled to be at the Wolf" While occasionally doing a fill-in airshift to stay close to the product, King will be an off-air PD at the Wolf.

Wolf Howling Live & Local In San Francisco ... Mostly

Just one piece of the puzzle remains for Entercom's KBWF (95.7 the Wolf)/ San Francisco ... oh yeah, it's only the *morning show!* Expect an announcement Thursday of this week, when Wolf PD/Prime Minister of Twang **Scott Mahalick** reveals "very exciting news" about the permanent wakeup team. Craig Coffey was on loan from sister KKWF/Seattle, along with Sue Hall. The remainder of the airstaff has been up and running for the last week; **Nikki Landry** is doing middays and handling MD duties, **JoJo Kincaid** is in afternoons, and **Tictak** (the actual human, not the breath mint) is handling

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nights. Additionally, Mahalick announced **Matt Ganssle** will be director of imaging for the Wolf. Ganssle has plenty of chops when it comes to imaging the Wolf brand, as he comes over from KPLX (99.5 The Wolf)/Dallas. He's also worked at KFRR/Fresno; KXTE/Las Vegas; KSNI/Santa Maria, Calif.; and KRAB/Bakersfield.

They Love The Smell Of Bull In the Morning

Segueing from Wolves to Bulls, Clear Channel's WUBL (94.9 The Bull)/Atlanta launched back in December and has just announced a morning show: the syndicated **Big D & Bubba**, who will make the Bull their 36th affiliate. For Bull PD Clay Hunnicutt, it's a reunion of sorts; he worked with Big D & Bubba at Clear Channel sister WSIX/Nashville, where they do afternoons. Together for 11 years now, the pair is also heard on WNOE/New Orleans, WYNK/Baton Rouge and WYGY/Cincinnati, among other stations. They started live in Atlanta this morning (April 9). The Bull also announced a night show last week: **Kix Layton** will track nights from Clear Channel sister WSSL/Greenville, S.C. Layton handles middays at WSSL and is APD/MD.

Hippo Goes Belly Up In Merced ... Long Live Hank!

You may be familiar with the term "there's a hippopotamus in the room." Well, for the last 10 days, we've known Mapleton Communications KHPO (Hippo 106.3)/Merced, Calif. was going to make the flip to country; the question was when? The answer came Saturday afternoon, April 7 at 4 p.m., when recently acquired PD **Brian Montgomery** harpooned the hippo and gently eased "Hank 106.3" into this world. A quick recap of the drama in Merced: Montgomery was APD/ afternoons at Buckley Broadcasting's crosstown KUBB, but left to flip the Hippo. The first song on the new Hank Saturday afternoon was Willie Nelson's "My Heroes Have Always Been Cowboys." Montgomery will do mornings; an announcement about the rest of the staff is said to be coming later this week.

This Week At Callout America

Kenny Chesney repeats as the No. 1 song and as the No. 2 passion song with "Beer in Mexico." Men are the strength at No. 1, females rank it at No. 2, and younger 25-34 listeners rank the song at No. 1.

Carrie Underwood's "Wasted" is the No. 1 song with female listeners and the No. 1 female passion song too. Men rank "Wasted" at No. 4 in both positive and passion rankers. The demo strength is core 35-44s, where it's also at No. 1.

Billy Currington is new to the top five with "Good Directions" at No. 3, up from No. 6, This song is at No. 2 with male listeners and No. 4 with females. In demo, listeners 45-54 are the strength, ranking the song at No. 1.

Tim McGraw is also new to the top five with "Last Dollar" ranking at No. 4, up from No. 7 overall, and as the No. 4 passion song. Females rank the song at No. 3 and men at No. 5; younger 25-34 listeners are the strength at No. 2 in the demo.

Rascal Flatts round out the top five at No. 5 with "Stand," which is the No. 6 passion song. Females rank "Stand" at No. 3. Listeners 25-44 rank the song at No. 4.



On The Charts:

Underwood Reigns; Vince Logs Career-High Debut

Carrie Underwood continues to draw applause on the R&R Country chart, where "Wasted" (Arista/Arista Nashville) becomes her third No. 1 on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-fueled rankings. Up 1.5 million audience impressions, "Wasted" amasses 35.2 million impressions during the tracking week (2-1) and follows previous chart-toppers "Jesus, Take the Wheel" (six weeks at No. 1 starting on the chart dated Jan. 13, 2006) and "Before He Cheats" (five weeks at No. 1 starting in the Nov. 3, 2006 issue). Underwood's "Don't Forget to Remember Me" peaked at No. 2 on the Nielsen BDS-driven country chart dated July 28, 2006.

The new No. 1 makes Underwood the first act to score three No. 1 hits from a widely distributed debut album since The Dixie Chicks did it in 1998-99 with "There's Your Trouble," "Wide Open Spaces" and "You Were Mine," all from the "Wide Open Spaces" set. She's now just one chart-topper shy of matching the four No. 1 songs Brooks & Dunn collected from their first album, "Brand New Man." The title track began its No. 1 run in September 1991, followed by "My Next Broken Heart" (December 1991) "Neon Moon" (May 1992) and "Boot Scootin' Boogie" (August 1992).

Concurrently, **Vince Gill** posts a new career-high debut as "What You Give Away" (MCA Nashville) starts at No. 49 (770,000 impressions). Previously, Gill's highest openers came when "High Lonesome Sound" (April 1996) and "A Little More Love" (March 1997) both popped on at No. 50. Gill last saw top 10 ink on the country chart when "Feels Like Love" peaked at No. 6 in November 2000.

Rascal Flatts top the R&R Country Indicator list with "Stand" (Lyric Street), while **Craig Morgan**'s "Tough" is Most Added on that panel (18 reports).
