It's Country! It's *Alt*-Country! It's Southern Rock! It's ... 'Lone Star 92.5'!


Already home to over a dozen AM and FM country signals, including Cumulus Media's KPLX (99.5 The Wolf) and ABC Radio's KSCS and KTYS (The Twister), the Dallas-Ft. Worth Metroplex woke up to yet another iteration of the format this morning following the midnight flip of Clear Channel classic rock KZPS to "Lone Star 92.5." Programmer Duane Doherty is the architect of a unique music mix, which will run the gamut from Willie Nelson to ZZ Top, Stevie Ray Vaughan and Pat Green. Additionally, Willie Nelson will be the voice of the station. According to Doherty, "In a sense, we're recapturing the early days of FM, when your jock was a trusted guide through what was new and important." During a streaming session today, the following titles were heard (though not in exact order): Bob Seger's "Turn the Page"; The Outlaws' "Hurry Sundown"; Lynyrd Skynyrd's "You Got That Right"; Johnny Cash's "Folsom Prison Blues (Live)"; Waylon Jennings' "T for Texas (Live)"; Travis Tritt's "10 Feet Tall & Bullet Proof"; Bob Dylan's "Shelter From the Storm"; ZZ Top's "Cheap Sunglasses"; Billy Joe Shaver's "The Real Deal"; George Thorogood's "One Bourbon, One Scotch, One Beer; "Stevie Ray Vaughan's "Voodoo Child (Slight Return)"; The Grateful Dead's "Uncle John's Band"; Bad Company's "Burnin' Sky"; and Travis Tritt's "Put Some Drive in Your Country."

The "Lone Star" format was originally road-tested on the KZPS HD side-channel, and, according to Doherty, "Response was incredible." An additional twist is the approach to commercials on "Lone Star." Rather than running traditional spots, "Lone Star" will give "sponsors" one to two minutes of integration in an hour and will be treated as "part of the fabric of the experience, not as an interruption." Early sponsors include Southwest Airlines, AT&T, Coors and Guitar Center. The station's lineup will include current morning men **Bo & Jim**, who are taking this week off while the station launches and establishes its music position, although they are running

recorded promos assuring the audience of their return. Former night guy **Jon Dillon** is now in middays, and longtime Dallas radio personality **Redbeard** is in afternoons. **Cousin Deke**, the station's imaging director, will handle nights. KZPS midday jock **Cindy Scull** and afternoon driver **Crash** exit due to the format flip.

R&R was curious to get market reaction to "Lone Star" and reached Cumulus KPLX (99.5 The Wolf) PD John Sebastian via e-mail, who observed, "Lone Star is very male, probably 35-54 males, maybe even 40-54." Sebastian also said he takes the format flip as a compliment, explaining, "Before this change, The Wolf was going to get some of this audience by default. I think [Clear Channel/Dallas market manager] JD Freeman realized without doing something to stop us, we'd go right to No. 1 25-54 adults." Asked how he sees "Lone Star" affecting the country landscape in the market, Sebastian told R&R, "As far as P1s to country, this change essentially doesn't make any difference. If KZPS were still a classic rock station, this new hybrid would share most with ... the old KZPS." Across the street, Chris Huff, MD at KSCS, told R&R he thinks there will be a lot of sampling, adding, "Just having Willie as a station spokesperson is going to elicit some curiosity from country listeners." Huff says "Lone Star" has a "decidedly rock lean, kind of like a 'Texas Jack,' and it seems like they will have their greatest impact in the rock arena."

Country radio listeners continue to rank **Billy Currington**'s "Good Directions" as their No. 1 song and as the No. 2 "Like a Lot" song for the week. Male listeners rank it at No. 1 and as the No. 1 passion song, while females rank the song at No. 3 and as the No. 4 passion song. Younger 25-34s rank this song at No. 2.

Dierks Bentley is new to the top five with "A Long Trip Alone" ranking at No. 4, up strong from No. 8 last week. Female listeners rank it at No. 4, up from No. 5, and men rank the song at No. 4, up from No. 8. Younger females 25-34 rank the song at No. 4 and as the No. 3 passion song.

Also new to the top five is "Settlin" "from **Sugarland**, ranking at No. 5, up from No. 7. The strength of this song is at the heart of country radio, with core 35-44s overall ranking it at No. 2, up from No. 7; core female listeners rank the song at No. 4, up from No. 7; and core males rank it at No. 2, up from No. 6. This strong is strong and trending stronger.

Montgomery Gentry have our growth song of the week with "Lucky Man" ranking at No. 12, up from No. 17 last week and No. 19 two weeks ago. Listeners 45-54 are the strength at No. 9 and No. 7 passion song. Men are driving the song so far at No. 8, younger 25-34 males rank the song at No. 6. Females overall are at No. 15. Females 45-54 rank the song at No. 12 and as the No. 8 passion song.

We all know the ACMs are coming up May 15 in Las Vegas, and the enormity of this event now borders on insanity. 

On The Charts:

Emerson Drive Return To Top 10, Flatts Reclaim No. 1

Call them the little band that could, or find any euphemism that applies. Any way you slice it, **Emerson Drive** serve notice this week that "Moments" (Midas/New Revolution) is the band's ticket to ride in the top 10. Up 2.7 million impressions, the single logs the second-fattest increase on this week's R&R Country chart and hops 13-10. It's the band's third top 10 and first since "Fall Into Me" peaked at No. 3 in January 2003. The first time the group logged time in that part of the chart happened when "I Should Be Sleeping" rose to No. 4 in June 2002. "Moments" is the first top 10 for the independently distributed Midas imprint, although Emerson Drive's "A Good Man" stopped at No. 17 last December.

The label is also active in the Christian music market, and Emerson Drive labelmates Rush Of Fools dominates the R&R Christian AC list this week with "Undo."

On the R&R Country Indicator chart, **Rascal Flatts** reclaim the No. 1 slot after being interrupted last week by **Sugarland**'s "Settlin'" (Mercury). The trio's "Stand" (Lyric Street) gains 43 plays and trades places with "Settlin'," which is pushed to No. 2. In a highly competitive week on the upper end of the chart, Sugarland narrowly miss bullet criteria with a dip of just eight plays.

Housekeeping: Due to unavoidable data-processing delays, our panel changes based on current music usage during the first quarter of 2007 will be delayed. Stations whose reporting status will be impacted by the first-quarter results will be notified starting this week, and we hope to have an industry-wide announcement of the new panels by the end of this week.



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


