


A Couple Of Bills That Were Due

Today was a good day if your name was Bill and you've been involved in record promotion over the years. Bill Mayne, former VP of 903 Music, was named president of Graham Bros. Entertainment Nashville Operations. Mayne is already on the job, which entails Graham Central Station's roster of clubs; Rainey Graham Publishing; Country Thunder Festivals; Graham Artist Management; and a new label, Country Thunder Records. In short, Mayne will have his hands on pretty much everything. Mayne told R&R, "Herbert [Graham] has built an amazing array of entertainment companies over the years, and I'm honored by his trust in me to help take the company forward with great music, artists and people." In a statement, Graham said, "The time is right for us to step to the next level. I've been after Bill for some time, and the timing finally worked for both of us. This announcement caps a somewhat wrenching week for Mayne, whose wife, Sallie, underwent an eight-hour procedure last Wednesday to remove a benign tumor on her brain. Things went so well, Sallie is already home and is expected to fully recover.

Former Category 5 VP of promotion **Bill Mackey** got back into the game today too when he was named to a similar position with 1720 Entertainment, which is launching a new country division. Mackey has already built a staff that includes former Warner Bros. VP Jim Malito for West Coast promotion; former Category 5 regional Rosey Fitchpatrick will work mid-America; Stacy Blythe, also formerly of Category 5, is set to handle the East Coast. Sales and marketing vets Neal Spielberg and Derek Simon will handle those respective duties. The first artist on the label is Rissi Palmer, whose debut single hits radio on June 4. 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Watson Lands On the Beach In Ventura, Calif.

In Ventura, beach = good. We're talking about **Tom Watson**, the radio guy, *not* the famous golfer, but if this Watson programs half as good as his namesake hits that little white ball, Cumulus' KHAY/Oxnard-Ventura, Calif. will be just fine. Watson is the new PD at KHAY, and has a long background in programming that includes WNTR/Indianapolis, KJR/Seattle, KVIL/Dallas, Jones Radio Networks, KXKL/Denver and even his own consultancy. He replaces Jim Hayes, who left KHAY and radio altogether a month ago to become a full time minister in his home state of Texas.

17 Months, \$2.7 *Bee-lee-yon* Later, ABC-Citadel Happening

The mega-merger between Citadel and ABC, which was first announced in February 2006, finally has a closing date of June 12. The \$2.7 billion, 22-station deal affects four country outlets: KSCS & KTYS/Dallas and WKHX & WYAY/Atlanta.

Disney, ABC's parent, will first spin the assets into a subsidiary called ABC Radio Holdings, which will then merge with a wholly-owned subsidiary of Citadel. The transaction does not include ESPN Radio and Radio Disney. Following the spinoff, Disney will not own any shares of ABC Radio Holdings. Shares of Citadel common stock will continue to trade on the New York Stock Exchange under the symbol "CDL."

Billy Currington has been in the Callout America top 10 for over 10 weeks now with "Good Directions" and this week takes the No. 1 spot, up from No. 2 last week. This song also repeats as the No. 1 Passion song. "Good Directions" is the No. 1 song with male and female listeners and in all demos.

Toby Keith is new to the top five with "High Maintenance Woman" ranking at No. 3, up from No. 7, and as the No. 4 passion song, up from No. 9. The song is No. 3 with female listeners, No. 4 with males and the No. 2 song with core 35-44 listeners.

Jake Owen continues to gain strength and strongly outperforms the radio spin charts with "Startin' With Me" ranking as the No. 7 song, up from No. 16 just two weeks ago and No. 8 last week. The song ranks as the No. 7 passion song, up from No. 12. Core 35-44 listeners are strong at No. 6, younger 25-34s at No. 8.

George Strait's "Wrapped" is new to the top 10 for the week at No. 10, up from No. 13, and ranking as the No. 9 passion song overall. Men are still the strength at No. 9, while females rank the song at No. 11, up strong from No. 15. Younger 25-34 listeners are the strength at No. 6. Listeners 25-44 rank this song at No. 9.

Keith Urban has the week's strongest mover with "I Told You So" ranking at No. 17, up big from No. 26 last week. Men are the strength at No. 14, females at No. 19. Younger 25-34s are at No. 16 for the week.

"'Breakfast at the Brickyard' is on the air race day [Sunday] from 7 a.m.-noon, with the morning show hosting and a cast of thousands," said Richards, adding, "Literally, hundreds of thousands! They're in town for the race and make our broadcast a part of their race day tradition." "Seriously, the start of the race is one of the most exciting moments in sports," Richards said. On The Charts:

Big & Rich Celebrate First Top 10; Emerson Drive Cap Indicator List

After more than three years and 11 charted singles, **Big & Rich** finally crack the top 10 on the R&R Country chart with "Lost in This Moment" (Warner Bros./WRN), which gains 1.8 million audience impressions and rises 12-9. The quirky duo came as close as possible without landing a top 10 when the highly commercial (CD single certified gold) "Save a Horse (Ride a Cowboy)" stopped at No. 11 on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven chart dated July 30, 2004. The new single introduces "Between Raising Hell and Amazing Grace," due at retail June 5. The new album title is borrowed from a line in **Hank Williams Jr.**'s 1986 single "Country State of Mind."

Big & Rich's 11 chart singles include three collaborative outings with **Cowboy Troy**, **Gretchen Wilson**, Hank Williams Jr. and **Van Zant**. A former member of **Lonestar**, Rich also charted a pair of solo singles, "I Pray for You" (2000) and "Forever Loving You" (2001).

On the R&R Country Indicator list, Canadian group **Emerson Drive**'s "Moments" (Midas/New Revolution) gains 110 plays and steps 2-1 in its 21st chart week. On the R&R Country scorecard, "Moments" trails **Billy Currington**'s "Good Directions" (Mercury) by 708,000 audience impressions with an eye on the top prize. If the group dominates next week, "Moments" will be the first No. 1 on an independently distributed label since **Heartland**'s "I Loved Her First" (Lofton Creek) reigned for one week in the **R&R** dated Oct. 20, 2006.

In the Most Added column, "Because of You," **Reba McEntire**'s duet with **Kelly Clarkson** (MCA Nashville), has another good week, finishing with 28 adds on the R&R Country panel and 22 reports on the R&R Country Indicator panel.




