You Won't See Hide Nor Hare Of Him

When Citadel Broadcasting takes over 22 ABC Radio stations on June 12, one very big player will be conspicuous by his absence. John Hare, president of ABC Radio and a 36-year radio veteran, has decided not to make transition to Citadel. Hare took over as president of ABC Radio's 72 stations in 1999 after managing ABC stations in Washington, Detroit and Dallas. He began his broadcast career in 1969 as an account executive with KXYZ-AM & FM, former ABC Radio stations in Houston. During his watch as ABC Radio president, Hare oversaw properties such as WABC/New York and WLS/Chicago, which became some of the best ratings and revenue success stories in the industry. Another ABC station, KGO/San Francisco, has been at the top of the ratings rankers for more than a quarter-century. So far, Hare has made no announcement about his next move. When next week's merger is completed, Disney will still own its branded radio station properties, including 50 Radio Disney and five ESPN radio stations.



I think the proper term for this is "compartmentalizing." Now say hello to Ray Massie, PD at KNIX. He just said goodbye to longtime MD/mid-day maven Gwen Foster, who will be grabbing a hump and hangin' on with CBS Radio's crosstown KMLE (Camel Country 108) as its new midday personality starting Wednesday (June 6). That gig opened up when Lisa Malay recently resigned to move back to her childhood home ... in Missouri. According to KMLE PD Jay McCarthy, Foster will also serve as MD, while current KMLE MD Dave Collins is upped to APD for KMLE and PD of its HD2 station.

The trio left Cox Radio's crosstown WAPE (The Big Ape) in December and have an 11-year history in the market. According WGNE GM Gary Spurgeon, Sutton, Kendall and Amadeus are "huge country fans" and will host a "family-friendly and entertaining" morning show, officially called "Jacksonville's Hometown Morning Show" on The Gator, beginning June 20. There's probably no one in the Wolf pack happier than Laurie Arbore, who was handling a marathon noon-6 p.m. airshift ever since the January relaunch.

This Week At Callout America

Once again, the most popular song with country radio listeners is "Good Directions" from **Billy Currington**, which also repeats as the No. 1 passion song. This song is the No. 1 song with men and the No. 2 song with females. The strength in demo is with younger 25-34s, where it's No. 1 in both positive and passion.

Emerson Drive's "Moments" kicks big ranking as the No. 2 song overall, up from last week's No. 4, and as the No. 2 passion song, up from No. 3. Females rank "Moments" as the No. 1 song positive and passion. Core 35-44 listeners rank the song at No. 1, and younger 25-34s rank it at No. 2.


George Strait moves to No. 7 this week with "Wrapped" moving up from No. 10 last week and No. 13 two weeks ago. This song is also the No. 7 passion song. Both male and female listeners rank it at No. 7 for the week.

Kellie Pickler continues to outperform the radio spin chart with "I Wonder" ranking at No. 10 for the week, up from No. 14 two weeks ago. Females are the strength at No. 9, men are at No. 12. Females 45-54 are the power point, ranking the song at No. 6 in the demo and as the No. 3 passion song. Men 45-54 are also at No. 6.

Keith Urban is still in a strong growth trend with "I Told You So" ranking at No. 12 this week, up from No. 17 last week and No. 26 two weeks back. Men rank this song at No. 11, women rank it at No. 13. Females 35-44 are the power point at No. 11 and No. 5 passion.

David Kirth was immediately announced as the new East Coast rep for Lofton Creek Records, replacing Tonya Campos, who went back to radio in March as APD/MD/midday personality at Mt. Wilson Broadcasters' KKGO/Los Angeles. Kirth has a radio background as PD of Clear Channel's KTOM/Monterey. Baumgartner's immediate plans aren't known at this time.

Even though Koch Records Nashville closed up shop, Chuck Rhodes continued to consult the company's New York operations and has now formed a partnership with Cody McCarver, a singer-songwriter who was once with the band Confederate Railroad. In a statement, company president Gene Sibbett said, "Tim Riley lends the company a door to marketing channels that could have a significant impact on the company's overall marketing plans through the coming years." No kidding. Riley has vast experience in sales, marketing and promotions and has been a fixture in Nashville since 1983.

We're not sure what a "reverse merger" actually is, but apparently it allows Debut Broadcasting Corporation to be traded publicly on NASDAQ. The parent company of Nashville's Impact Radio Networks and Impact Media Studios, Debut names president Jim Wood as its chairman, while EXO COO Steven Ludwig is now the president.





The site featured bios, pictures, music videos and song lyrics, all from you-know-who. Saturday on US 103.5, it was all Kenny, all the time, with nothing but Chesney music blasting over the airwaves, including many album tracks not usually heard on the radio. The station also played Kenny interviews and produced custom imaging, as the station was renamed "Kenny 103.5" for the day. Tourmate Pat Green provided updates from backstage, threatening WFUS PD Travis Daily, "Next time I come to town, it better be 'Pat 103.5.'"

Jocks have nightmares where none of the buttons work. PDs' bad dreams usually involve a listener commandeering the control room. Just as Ricky Bobby was urged to "face your fear" in that nowcinematic classic "Talladega Nights," Joel Burke, PD at Lincoln Financial's KYGO/Denver, is actually urging members of the KYGO nation to try out for a regular slot on the station. Listeners can send an MP3 or drop off a tape at the station. KYGO's night jock, known only as Flip, will feature entries on the air, then listeners will vote online for the eventual winner, who will ultimately become the permanent host for a Saturday night show called "Club KYGO."

Not only was "Airwolf" a most excellent Emmywinning TV thriller that debuted in 1984, it's a great name for the latest P.T. Barnum-like idea from Scott Mahalick, PD/prime minister of twang for Entercom's KBWF (The Wolf)/San Francisco. As Mahalick explains, "We have a full-time helicopter flying around the Bay Area that goes out to free-ticket Friday locations. Every Friday, we promote three locations and bring premier passes and concert ticket to each location. Occasionally, we have a guest artist do the give away at the landing location. Huge excitement!" We'd never presume to offer a way to enhance this idea, but does anybody know what Stringfellow Hawk — er, I mean Jan Michael Vincent is doing these days?

On The Charts:

Emerson Drive Dominate, Paisley Returns

Canadian group **Emerson Drive** top the country chart for the first time as "Moments" (Midas/New Revolution) gains 1.6 million impressions and steps 2-1. Previously, the group had climbed as high as No. 3 on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-fueled country scorecard when "Fall Into Me" peaked on the chart dated Jan. 10, 2003. That single followed a No. 4 peak with "I Should Be Sleeping" in June 2002.

The new No. 1 marks the first single on an independently distributed label to hit the country summit since **Heartland**'s "I Loved Her First" (Lofton Creek) led for one week in the issue dated Oct. 20, 2006. Emerson Drive are the first Canadian export to top the chart since **Terri Clark**'s "Girls Lie Too" did so in September 2004.

Concurrently, the lead single from **Kenny Chesney's** forthcoming "Just Who I Am: Poets & Pirates" album takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 37. The new single, titled "Never Wanted Nothing More" (BNA), pops on with 3.8 million impressions at 56 monitored stations, good enough for Most Increased Audience honors. So far, no firm street date has been set for the new album. That single also handily swipes the Most Added honors on both the R&R Country panel (47 reports) and the R&R Country Indicator panel (29 reports).

On the R&R Country Indicator list, **Brad Paisley**'s "Ticks" (Arista Nashville) returns to No. 1 for a second week after dipping to No. 2 last week.

Also noteworthy on the R&R Country chart is the 15th top 10 single for **Keith Urban**. His "I Told You So" (Capitol Nashville) rises 11-10. Seven of Urban's prior top 10 songs have also done time at No. 1.



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
