U.S. Urban Invasion Begins With Desert Storm

There were two things that had me on pins an needles all weekend: "The Sopranos" series finale, and Keith Urban's first U.S. date for his Love, Pain and the Whole Crazy World Tour. Unlike many viewers of "The Sopranos" conclusion, I'm happy to report the end of the Keith Urban show was completely satisfying. Come to think of it, the beginning and the middle were pretty damn good too. Keith Urban and Tony Soprano actually have something in common: They both kill.

The stage presentation for Urban's show is spectacular and functional at the same time. A long runway extends from the main stage nearly to the back of the arena, where it mushrooms into a smaller, round stage. It was there the arena was musically transformed into a much smaller, intimate venue when Urban and his band sat on stools and surrounded the drummer for a set that ran about five songs, including "You'll Think of Me" and his current single "I Told You So." It wasn't completely acoustic, but it sure felt that way. Directly over the runway, on a tracking system, was a sky cam that provided some great angles of the band, particularly several overhead, hi-def shots never seen before. There are six cameras in all, and they provided images for a backdrop on the main stage with the biggest big video screen I've ever seen in an indoor arena, 56 feet wide by 28 feet high. The staging and presentation are clearly designed to emphasize a rewarding musical experience, as opposed to explosions, smoke machines and gimmicks.

That's not to say this show doesn't sizzle — it does. Urban is a great showman, and the pacing of this concert is spot on. The opening is energetic but not over-the-top, and, as the show progresses, you'll wish it would just keep going. During the show, Urban thanked country radio "for hanging in there with me." During the pandemonium of the crowd demanding an encore, we saw what is now the norm at shows ... people don't use lighters or matches anymore — the cell phone's digital display is a much stronger,

consistent light, and when there is an arena of at least 15,000 people waving their cell phones back and forth, it's quite a scene. As he introduced his final song of the night, "Got It Right This Time," he dedicated it to his wife, Nicole Kidman.

This is a show that radio people, who can be a bit on the fussy and hard-to-please side, will truly enjoy as a fan. Case in point was Jay McCarthy, PD of CBS Radio's KMLE/Phoenix, who not only attended Friday's show in Phoenix, but like a true fan, traveled to Las Vegas for Saturday's show, then to San Diego on Sunday. According to McCarthy, "I saw the opportunity and seized it! With nothing planned over the weekend, it just seemed to make sense. I'm not normally the type to watch a movie more than once, so it takes a lot to move me this much, and Keith did. To endure what he's probably had to go through recently takes incredible fortitude. To come back as strong as he has is nothing short of remarkable. Each of the shows was truly one of the 10 best concerts I've ever seen, and I've seen hundreds. What else can I tell you?!"

Urban makes a stop Saturday night (June 16) at Staples Center in Los Angeles, and I'll be there to see it all again.

Coming Soon, A Lobbyist Cage Match

Since the announced merger of Sirius and XM, the NAB has spent big bucks in Washington to make sure the \$13.6 billion deal gets a major "ix-nay" from D.C. regulators. Now, tearing a page out of that playbook, the two satcasters have hired their own team of lobbyists. According to a federal disclosure form filed last Tuesday (June 6), XM and Sirius have hired Quinn Gillespie & Associates LLC. The firm is headed by Jack Quinn, former counsel to President Clinton; and Ed Gillespie, who served as Republican National Committee chairman in 2004.

On The Charts:

Lawrence Finds Out Who His Friends Are

With the largest increase inside the top 10 and the third-biggest inside the top 40, Tracy Lawrence's "Find Out Who Your Friends Are" (Rocky Comfort/ C05) leaps 4-1 on the R&R Country chart. Lawrence's single replaces Emerson Drive's "Moments" (Midas/New Revolution), which dips to No. 2. This marks the first time in more than 50 years that an independently distributed single replaced another at No. 1. That hasn't happened since Hank Williams logged back-to-back charttoppers in 1953 with "Kaw-Liga" and "Your Cheatin' Heart" on the MGM imprint. A similar scenario involving two different artists hasn't occurred since the spring of 1950 when **Moon** Mullican's "I'll Sail My Ship Alone" (King) replaced Williams' "Why Don't You Love Me."

Lawrence's single is detected at each of the 127 stations on the R&R Country panel, and 20 of those signals turned in weekly increases of between 10 and 33 plays. Leading the gainers is WDTW/Detroit (+33 plays), followed by KSOP/Salt Lake City (+28); WGAR/Cleveland (+26); KSD/St. Louis (+21); KUSS/San Diego (+17); KILT/Houston (+17); WQMX/Akron (+15); KEEY/Minneapolis (+14); KKNG/Oklahoma City (+14); WKLB/Boston (+13); WCOS/Columbia, S.C. (+13); WSSL/Greenville, S.C. (+12); KFRG/Riverside (+11); KAJA/San Antonio (+11); and KSON/San Diego (+10).

For Lawrence, the new track is his eighth No. 1 and the first since "Time Marches On" led for three weeks in June 1996.

Toby Keith's "Love Me If You Can" (Show Dog Nashville) takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 42 with 2.5 million impressions.

Toby Keith will be all over the tube this week, plugging the release of his new "Big Dog Daddy" CD. It starts Tuesday night, June 12 with an appearance on "The Tonight Show With Jay Leno" and basically goes nonstop, with more TV slots like "Jimmy Kimmel Live," "The View," CBS' "The Early Show," ABC's "Nightline" and many others.

Jason Aldean — yes, the artist on Broken Bow Records — is now moonlighting as an overnight DJ, and the city is no hicktown. Just today, Beasley's WKIS (99.9 Kiss Country)/Miami launched "Jason Aldean's Overnight Music Machine." That sort of rhymes, and Aldean is sort of a DJ, doing a "virtual DJ" stint seven days a week from midnight-5:30 a.m.

Jason Michael Carroll will hook up with the Brooks & Dunn/Alan Jackson tour later this year. Carroll will open nine dates starting Sept. 26 and continue through mid-October.




