## **A Universal Truth: Bonadies Back**

Well, so much for that long, deep swim in lake Teddi. After a few months in chill mode, longtime Music Row promotion executive Teddi Bonadies is toweling off and getting back into the game, as VP of promotion for Universal South Records, Nashville. The announcement came down this morning from Michael Powers, senior VP of promotion for the label, who said in a statement, "Teddi is a promotion executive of the highest quality," adding, "I have admired her many accomplishments over the years on Music Row, so you can only imagine how excited I am to work alongside her. She is the final piece of the puzzle to complete our promotion staff and will help make us one of the very best teams in the industry." Bonadies left Columbia Nashville in February after serving as senior VP of promotion for the label. Prior to her stint at Columbia, Bonadies had a successful 13-year run with Arista Nashville, where she was instrumental in breaking the careers of Alan Jackson, Brad Paisley, Brooks & Dunn and Carrie Underwood, among others. One of the "others" was Phil Vassar, who recently left Arista and joined Universal South. Bonadies will be reunited with Vassar just as he gears up for an album launch. **R&R** caught up with Bonadies, who said, "I will tell you that I am genuinely looking forward to Chapter 2 of my promotion career," adding, "It's very rare that one stays with one label for 13-plus years; I feel fortunate to have been able to do that." Bonadies mentioned that she is looking forward to working with label president Fletcher Foster again, as well as Phil Vassar, who recently signed with Universal South, and his manager, Greg Hill.

"There's quite a bit of history," Bonadies told **R&R**. "There is a familiar comfortable feeling already. I also am excited to work with my new Universal South promotion family. There is a lot of to look forward to." In a statement, Foster said of Bonadies, "I've worked with her on and off for the past 12 years [at Sony BMG], having seen her work with radio, artists and within the industry. And her reputation is stellar." Bonadies will report directly to Powers and starts Monday June 25.

The entire promotional team for Country Thunder Records was rolled out today in an announcement from Graham Brothers Nashville Operations president Bill Mayne. Doc Gonzales will move from company artist management into the role of VP of promotion. According to Mayne, Gonzales brings "a fresh perspective to lead our promotion team and represent our artists at radio." Additionally, regional field reps were announced: Ray Randall will handle West Coast; RJ Jordan, Northeast; Jim Dorman, Southeast; and Bill Heltemes, Midwest. Wendy K. Duffy joins the team as executive assistant beginning July 2. Most recently, Duffy was doing affiliate relations for ABC Radio's "American Country Countdown." More staff announcements are said to be coming soon. Country Thunder artists Heartland and Jamie Lee Thurston will both have releases coming this summer.

**Brad Paisley** takes the No. 1 spot this week with "Ticks" up from last week's No. 5 and also ranking as the No. 4 passion song. Men rank the song at No. 1, and females rank it at No. 5.

"Because of You" by **Reba McEntire** with **Kelly Clarkson** stays strong, moving into the top five at No. 4, up from No. 6 last week. The song ranks at No. 3 passion for the week. Females are the strength at No. 2 and as the No. 1 passion song. Both core 35-44 females and females 25-44 are at No. 1. A heads up here as we see **Bucky Covington**'s "A Different World" producing strong passion scoring, ranking at No. 13 for the week overall, No. 9 passion with 35-44s, No. 10 with core females and No. 9 with core males.

Back in Augusta, where, before hearing this news we thought they only played golf at that majestic course, there's a fairway sized opening for a PD at WIBL.

Citing his commitment to "ensuring that the unique culture and proud heritage of this state is preserved and promoted," Kershaw announced his candidacy recently, saying he'll run as a Republican. **R&R** hears unconfirmed reports Kershaw will introduce legislation recommending a National Working Woman's Holiday.

#### Hey Radio: How Does This Work For Ya?

Over 100 artists of all genres, including Tim McGraw, Toby Keith, Big & Rich, Sheryl Crow and Jimmy Buffett, have signed on as founding members of an organization called musicFIRST, a coalition dedicated to obtaining a performance right for artists and copyright holders from U.S. broadcast radio. The "FIRST" stands for "Fairness In Radio Starting Today." Mark Kadesh is the coalition executive director and says that other industrialized nations pay performance rights, adding, "It's time to make sure that when music is played on the radio, people who perform the music are simply being paid fairly to do it." Supporting organizations include the American Association of Independent Music, the American Federation of Musicians, the Recording Academy, the Latin Recording Academy, the RIAA, SoundExchange and the Rhythm & Blues Foundation.

NAB executive VP Dennis Wharton responded by saying in a statement, "NAB will aggressively fight RIAA's proposed performance tax on local radio stations. Congress has long recognized that radio airplay of music generates millions of dollars in revenue for record labels and artists. Were it not for radio's free promotional airplay of music on stations all over America, most successful recording artists would still be playing in a garage."

## **On The Charts:**

#### Paisley Rides To Summit; Toby Gets 'Adds' Vote

**Brad Paisley** tops the R&R Country chart for an eighth time with the clever "Ticks" (Arista Nashville), which steps 2-1 (32.5 million impressions). The new chart-topper is Paisley's first since "She's Everything" reigned for three weeks starting with the chart dated Dec. 29, 2006. He first reached No. 1 with "He Didn't Have to Be" on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven country list dated Dec. 3, 1999. The new single introduces Paisley's fifth nonseasonal set, titled "5th Gear," which starts scanning at retail tomorrow (June 19). His 2006 holiday release, "Brad Paisley Christmas," spawned five chart entries on the lower end of the final chart of last year, the same week "She's Everything" dominated.

On the R&R Country Indicator list, **Montgomery Gentry**'s "Lucky Man" (Columbia) gains 104 plays and hops 3-1.

Concurrently, **Toby Keith** claims the Most Added honors with both stables of country reporters. The second single from "Big Dog Daddy," titled "Love Me If You Can," (Show Dog Nashville) draws 32 adds on the R&R Country panel, while the final tally on the R&R Country Indicator panel is 29 reports. The new album is expected to debut at or near the top of Billboard's Top Country Albums this week, so watch for an exclusive retail update in Wednesday's (June 20) R&R Country Daily.

**LeAnn Rimes** has a new CD coming out Aug. 28, and it will include a duet with Bon Jovi called "Till We Ain't Strangers Anymore." Just before the recent CMA Music Festival got underway, Rimes flew to New York to perform the song as part of Bon Jovi's "Unplugged" taping for MTV. The tune will also be on Bon Jovi's upcoming album, due for release this month. No word yet on an airdate for the "Unplugged" episode.

You'll probably be hearing **Carrie Underwood**'s mega-hit "Before He Cheats" coming out of somebody's phone pretty soon. That song just received something called Mastertone status, which signifies one million purchased ringtones. It's only the second country song to achieve that benchmark; Waylon Jennings' "Theme from 'The Dukes of Hazzard'" was the first, back in March.

Since we're on the subject of digital, congrats to **Rascal Flatts**, whose song "Bless the Broken Road" recently became their third and latest tune to surpass the one million mark for digital downloads, according to Nielsen SoundScan. "What Hurts the Most" and "Life Is a Highway" are the other two; Flatts is the only country act to reach this level three different times.
