Soul2Soul Sizzles Til The Very End

It's not an understatement to say you'll probably never see the likes of Tim & Faith's Soul2Soulconcert ever again. Country music's first couple have said they won't tour together in the future, so the only people who get to witness them singing together on a regular basis are, presumably, their three daughters. The show wrapped in Anaheim, Calif. on Saturday night after 44 dates and is expected to once again post some head-spinning box office records. It won't match 2006 totals, which topped \$90 million, only because this year's edition of Soul2Soul did about 30 fewer dates. Soul2Soul is really three major concerts in one evening. There's Tim McGraw, who could do three hours of his own ginormous radio hits, yet opens the show with a cover of Steve Miller's "The Joker" and not only has the crowd going berserk, but he pulls it off without a hitch. One of Faith's early hits was a cover of Janis Joplin's "Piece of My Heart," which she performed Saturday in an arrangement closer to the original Joplin version. Throw in the rest of her catalog, mix in a cover of ABBA's "The Winner Takes All," then add the personal touch of Faith bringing four young, awestruck sisters onstage to coach them on how to strut with attitude as a lead-up to "Mississippi Girl," and you've got an evening both entertaining and unpredictable. Then there's the Tim & Faith component of the show, which opened with a cover of "Chasing Cars" by Snow Patrol and ultimately included their own stellar set list of duets. Whether onstage or alone, both Tim & Faith made a constant connection to fans, shaking as many hands as possible. They probably have a lot of solid reasons not to do this tour again, but I saw many reasons that make me wish they'd reconsider.

Meanwhile, Garth Just (Supposedly) Getting Started

Nobody's talking about it officially, but Garth Brooks is coming out with new music very soon, and it looks like Big Machine will be the delivery vehicle. There's a press conference scheduled for this Saturday (Aug. 18) in Nashville, along with a huge fly-in for major-market programmers to preview new music from the G-man. To underscore the strength of "Proud of the House We Built," **Brooks & Dunn** repeat as the No. 1 song overall. This song is No. 1 with males; No. 3 with females; and, in the demos, No. 1 with younger 25-34s, No. 3 with core 35-44s and No. 2 with listeners 45-54.

The No. 1 passion song for the week is "Because of You" from **Reba & Kelly Clarkson**, who also rank as the No. 2 song overall. Females rank this song at No. 1, males are at No. 4. In the demos, core 35-44s rank the song at No. 1, as do listeners 45-54. Younger 25-34s rank it at No. 5.

At just five weeks of age, "Take Me There" from **Rascal Flatts** is on the move, ranking as the No. 6 song overall and as the No. 8 passion song. On The Charts:

Chesney Slows Turnover Rate At No. 1; Radio Hears Strait's 'Cowgirls' Plea

Kenny Chesney's "Never Wanted Nothing More" (BNA) posts a fourth week atop the R&R Country chart, marking the longest chart-topping stretch since Rodney Atkins logged four straight weeks with "Watching You," starting with the chart dated Jan. 19. No single has notched more than four weeks since Carrie Underwood's "Before He Cheats" spent five weeks at the summit last fall. That song spent its fifth week at No. 1 in the R&R print issue dated Dec. 1, 2006.

On the Nielsen BDS-driven Country chart, this current January-to-mid-August frame is the first since 1996 during which there hasn't been a song that's spent more than four weeks at No. 1.

Concurrently, **George Strait** nabs a pair of Most Added trophies with "How 'Bout Them Cowgirls" (MCA Nashville), which claims 34 adds on the R&R Country panel. The new track also collects 41 reports on the R&R Country Indicator bank of stations.

Meanwhile, "Love Me If You Can" (Show Dog Nashville) becomes **Toby Keith**'s 34th top 10 single (13-10) and gains 1.7 million audience impressions. So far, 15 of Keith's prior top 10 singles spent time at No. 1, including two that are tied for Keith's longest No. 1 run at six weeks apiece: "Beer for My Horses" (2003) and "As Good As I Once Was" (2005).

The CMA Award nominations are coming up Aug. 30, and they'll be covered on two different networks from two different cities. **Sara Evans** will appear on ABC's "Good Morning America" to announce nominees from Times Square in New York City. Meanwhile, **Taylor Swift** and **Montgomery Gentry** will be back in Music City on a special edition of "CMT Insider" with more nomination announcements.

Brooks & Dunn originally teamed up back in 1990 when they started writing together in hopes of improving their fledgling solo careers. Now, the most successful duo in country music history will work on separate projects, but that won't affect their duo status. A new album, "Cowboy Town," is still due on October.

When **Rascal Flatts** play The Sommet center on Sept. 21, proceeds will benefit the Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. Over the past two years, the guys have donated \$1.4 million to the hospital from their Nashville shows. The Children's Hospital is a leading provider of pediatric healthcare and serves middle Tennessee and beyond.

There's a brand new 7,100-seat venue in Los Angeles called the Nokia Theatre, and it opens Oct. 18 with a show by **The Dixie Chicks** and **The Eagles**. This will be the only U.S. appearance for both groups.

Get ready for more good times when Time-Life releases "Goodtimes Again," a DVD collection of highlights from the "Glen Campbell Good Time Hour." It's available Oct. 2 and features Glen singing with Cher, Linda S Ronstadt, Willie and others.







To be included in the weekly callout, songs must have entered the top 40 positions on R&R's Country airplay chart. The sample is composed of 400 25-54-year-olds who identify country as their favorite music and who listen daily to competitive Country radio in the sample markets. The sample is 50% male/female and evenly distributed in the 25-34, 35-44, and 45-54 demos. The sample is balanced by region and markets within that region.
