As the R&R Country Hot Fax went to press this evening, the current points leader for shocker-of-the-week is the news out of Sin City. Brooks O'Brian, PD at Clear Channel's KWNR/Las Vegas is O-U-T after 11 years. O'Brian originally came to KWNR as MD, moving over from Citadel's KBUL/Reno. She was elevated to PD three years ago. At one time, O'Brian also served as a programming assistant at WYNY/New York, working with Mike O'Malley. So far, no announcement has been made about O'Brian's successor. This News Was Officially Garth-Tacular

Neither Garth Brooks nor Scott Borchetta could ever be accused of being understated; put them together and you've got a Big Machine that's subtle as a sledge hammer. At a weekend news conference that coincided with a massive fly-in of radio programmers from all over the country, the new dynamic duo, heretofore known as Brooks & Borchetta, confirmed what we'd been hearing the last few weeks: Garth will release "The Ultimate Hits," a 34-track, two-CD greatest hits retrospective with four new songs, and a DVD with videos on Nov. 6. The album will be self-distributed via his Pearl Records to all retailers. "We're doing deals one-on-one with retail," Brooks said. His two-year exclusive deal with Wal-Mart expired on July 7. Joe Mansfield will head up the sales efforts, and the package will be sold at a retail price of \$11-\$14. Brooks' release will not be available via iTunes since Brooks does not want songs to be sold individually, only as a package.

Programmers got to hear the new song, "More Than A Memory," which will arrive digitally at the crack of midnight Aug. 27, and were treated to a seminar that provided a retrospective of Garth's career. Whew! Good thing, 'cause we almost forgot his significance to this format, but, we digress. Big Machine, which is also the new label home of Brook's wife, Trisha Yearwood, will handle promotion of the new music, and Garth joked that he didn't turn to the label for promotional support because "my wife told me to."

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As far as a live component to all this, Brooks said, "If we're going to do something on that scale, we're going to find a way to bring it locally into your town," noting that country radio would somehow be involved. While Brooks wouldn't give details on what is rumored to be an extended run in a single market, he did allow that he would be doing a "thank you" concert for Wal-Mart.

Most programmers and MDs **R&R** spoke to seemed pretty excited to have new Garth music to play. Tonya Campos, MD at Mt. Wilson Broadcasters' KKGO (Go Country)/Los Angeles, shared her reaction to "More Than A Memory" with **R&R**, saying, "I *love* the single and cannot wait to hear it on the air. Garth sounds great, the song is amazing, and I wish I had [co-writer] Lee Brice's bank account number. I know here at KKGO, I am going to play it every single hour Monday!"



On The Charts:

Chesney Extends No. 1 Run; Reba Tops Indicator List

Kenny Chesney scores the longest No. 1 run on the R&R Country list in almost a year as "Never Wanted Nothing More" (BNA) gains 324,000 audience impressions and spends a fifth week atop the chart. That's the longest reign since Carrie Underwood's "Before He Cheats" dominated for five weeks starting in the Nov. 3, 2006 issue. Underwood is also the most recent artist to claim more than five weeks at No. 1, which happened when "Jesus, Take the Wheel" ended a six-week stand on the Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems-driven chart dated Feb. 17, 2006. The format hasn't seen a solo male top the chart for more that five weeks since Keith Urban's "Better Life" clocked six straight weeks in autumn 2005. The new track is Chesney's 12th chart topper and his 10th to spend more than one week at the summit.

Reba McEntire's pairing with **Kelly Clarkson**, titled "Because of You" (MCA Nashville), gains 126 plays and steps 2-1 on the R&R Country Indicator chart, replacing Chesney's single following a three-week No. 1 stretch.

On the Most Added boards, **George Strait**'s "How 'Bout Them Cowgirls" (MCA Nashville) cleans house again this week on both panels. As the single achieves Breaker status on the R&R Country panel and collects 49 adds, it also claims 24 new reports on the R&R Indicator tally.

Finally, **the Eagles** have been occasional visitors to the R&R Country chart following a No. 8 peak with "Lyin' Eyes" in December 1975 — the group's highest-charted country single to date. The venerable group takes the Hot Shot Debut this week at No. 44 with "How Long" (ECR/Lost Highway/Mercury). They haven't competed on the country scorecard since "The Girl From Yesterday" peaked where it bowed at No. 44 in December 1994 (one week on the chart). Their longest chart run so far is 13 weeks, logged in '75 with "Lyin' Eyes," followed by 12 weeks with "New Kid In Town" in 1977.






