Radio Goes Ga-Ga For Garth

On the heels of a record-setting week for Kenny Chesney's "Don't Blink," here comes new music from Garth Brooks. Remember him? Oklahoma native, sold a few records back in the day, full-time soccer dad of late? Yeah, that guy. The G-man appears to be steaming up behind Chesney with "More Than a Memory," and, so far, any doubt about radio's enthusiasm for Garth has been pretty much squished. Mike Culotta, PD of CBS Radio's WQYK/ Tampa, is kicking off every hour this week with the song; Clear Channel's KHGE (Big Country 102.7)/Fresno is playing it every 102.7 minutes, according to PD Chuck Geiger. Beverlee Brannigan, who programs Journal's KFDI/ Wichita, shared the report card for its "test tune" feature with **R&R**, and it was littered with A+ results. Yes, there were some polarizing scores too, but the majority of verbatim responses were positive. Tonya Campos, MD at Mt.Wilson's KKGO (Go Country 105)/Los Angeles, vowed to play it once an hour and, at press time, had made good on that promise. As we watched the Nielsen BDS RealTime data throughout the day, the total spins column resembled the tote board at Jerry Lewis' annual telethon; updated often and heading north. Three stations lead the pack all day: CBS Radio's WQYK/ Tampa and Clear Channel sisters WTQR/Greensboro and WKKT/Charlotte: 47 stations had recorded double-digit spins on the song as of 6 p.m. ET. Somewhat surprisingly, 25 stations hadn't played the song at all by that time.

Chesney Starts Big, Atkins Makes It Three

Kenny Chesney shatters the monitored-era benchmark for high debuts on the R&R Country chart and matches an all-time record for high debuts as "Don't Blink" (BNA) takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 16. The second single from Chesney's Sept. 11 release, "Just Who I Am: Poets & Pirates," handily achieves Breaker and Most Increased Audience status as "Blink" pops on with 12.7 million impressions at 105 monitored stations. The lead single, "Never Wanted Nothing More," steps aside after five weeks atop the chart (1-3) as **Rodney Atkins** logs his third straight No. 1 with "These Are My People" (Curb).

EXCLUSIVELY PROMOTED BY BIG MACHINE RECORDS Chesney's quick start is the highest since Nielsen BDS pioneered technology-based airplay tracking in January 1990, topping the previous record set when **Keith Urban** arrived at No. 17 with "Once in a Lifetime" in the Aug. 25, 2006 issue. Prior to the introduction of Nielsen BDS-based chart rankings, the highest opener was a No. 16 start by **Buck Owens'** "My Heart Skips a Beat" in December 1964.

Although Chesney's feat is a mighty one, **Carrie Underwood**'s No. 20 arrival with "So Small" (Arista/ Arista Nashville) a month ago packed a bigger punch. That single bowed with spins at 111 stations and popped on with 13 million impressions. One year ago, Urban's "Lifetime" opened on a panel that numbered 138 stations, but managed 14.9 million impressions at 125 of those stations.

Chesney's new record may be short-lived, depending upon how enthusiastically country programmers receive **Garth Brooks**' new single titled "More Than a Memory" (Pearl/Big Machine) during the seven-day tracking week (Aug. 27-Sept. 2). Brooks' new song was serviced to country stations on Monday (Aug. 27) and will debut next week. Brooks will likely end up reclaiming the BDS-era high-debut crown he held from the time "The Thunder Rolls" blew in at No. 19 in May 1991 until he broke his own record with "Good Ride Cowboy," which debuted at No. 18 in October 2005. Of course, Urban topped that bow with "Lifetime" less than a year later.

Chesney's head fits comfortably beneath the Most Added crown, with 78 reports on the R&R Country panel and 44 adds on the R&R Country Indicator panel.



Speaking of retiring, let's all hum "For He's a Jolly Good Fellow" quietly to ourselves as we tell you about Chuck Sebastian, who's decided to chuck his job as PD of RP Broadcasting's country WBJI, hot AC KKBJ and news/talk KKBJ-AM in Bemidji, Minn. Sebastian also pulled morning duty on WBJI. Sebastian will step down Set. 14.

It's back to the future for Cody Carlson, who will return to Zimmer's KIXQ (Kix 102.5)/Joplin, Mo. as PD. Houston, We Have A Problem In Philly

Yup, there too. And how about the timing for Arbitron, right on top of the largest Fly-In crowd in history last week? Arbitron ended up re-issuing Portable People Meter ratings for the first week of the Houston August survey, a report that includes the roughly 200-persons records that were inadvertently left out of the weekly unified (cume rating) sample in the original ratings report issued on Monday, Aug. 20, which generated a wave of industry hysteria. Arbitron chief research officer Bob Patchen reminded Fly-In attendees on Thursday (Aug. 23) morning that the glitch was a reporting error and not a real change in sample size. The blunder, for the period covering July 26-Aug. 1, "should have been caught in the quality control process and was not, and that process is being reviewed." Patchen said. Separately, Patchen conceded that Arbitron is running below target levels on in-tab sample goals in Houston and Philadelphia. Most problematic is PPM sample performance in the 18-34 demo in Philadelphia. In July, Arbitron's Demographic Delivery Index (the PPM equivalent of the diary¹s proportionality index) was only 55 in for Philly. In other words, only 197 persons aged 18-34 were in the average daily sample against a target of 358. "We're not happy with where we are," Patchen said, adding that the company has initiated a multipoint recovery plan and is meeting multiple times per week to get its panels back to full strength. 

and Arbitron CEO Steve Morris emphasized that despite the undersampling, PPM data is accurate and reliable and that, apart from major holidays, there is little correlation between in-tab sample size and listening levels. "We believe the data is accurate and reliable and can be tracked with confidence," Morris said.

CMA Goes Public with Nominees, Tickets

We can hardly wait for until Thursday, Aug. 30 when we not only find out who's nominated for a CMA Award, but how to attend. The nominations will be announced on ABC-TV's "Good Morning America" with a little help from Sara Evans. For the third straight year, The CMA is selling tickets for the Nov. 7 awards show to the public, and tickets are officially up for sale on Thursday, Aug. 30. Tell listeners they can log on to *ticketmaster.com*, call 615-255-9600 or just show up at the Sommet Center box office. Tickets start at \$164, and they don't include the usual service and handling fees. The show will be broadcast live from 8-11 p.m. on ABC-TV Nov. 7.

Fifteen songwriters have been nominated for induction into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame; among them are Thom Schuyler, Bob Dipiero, Hank Williams Jr. and Amy Grant. At a press conference in Nashville on Monday Aug. 27, a slate of nominees divided into songwriter and songwriter/ artist categories was announced; two from the songwriter category and one from the songwriter/ artist category will be inducted Oct. 14. The group of nominees was recommended to the board by the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame Foundation (NaSHOF) nominating committee, which comprises Hall of Fame members and Music Row historians.

Bob Romeo, executive director of the ACM, said in a statement, "As the Academy's reining Top Male Vocalist, he is sure to make it a great show and a good time for all CRB registrants." Paisley was scheduled to host the Music City Jam at this year's CRS, but was forced to cancel due to the birth of his first child.




