### Straight From Spokane, Flush With Enthusiasm

After several days of bluffing, Cary Rolfe laid his cards on the table Friday (Sept. 14), confirming he's cashed in his chips at Citadel/Spokane and will high-roll it to Sin City, taking over as PD for Clear Channel's KWNR/Las Vegas. Rolfe succeeds Brooks O'Brian, who left the station last month. Rolfe was the OM for the Spokane cluster with additional day-to-day programming duties for KDRK. Prior to joining the Citadel cluster in January 2006, Rolfe programmed CBS Radio's KUPL/Portland, Ore., with additional programming stops at Citadel's KUBL/Salt Lake City and KKNU/Eugene, Ore. Rolfe also held APD/MD positions at both KZLA/Los Angeles and KMLE/Phoenix. Commenting on his impending move to Las Vegas, Rolfe told **R&R**, "These decisions are always tough; the Spokane cluster is full of great people who generate great local content every day, and I have the utmost respect for them. They have great things in store with GM Don Morin in charge, and I wish them nothing but the best. Taking the reins of KWNR and following in the footsteps of Gary Moss, Jaye Albright and John Marks is a great honor; I look forward to getting in there with Brandy Newman and Tom Chase and creating great radio." Rolfe's last day in Spokane will be Friday, Sept. 28; he'll start at KWNR in early October.


There was other breaking news Friday that happened almost simultaneously with the Rolfe story: After three years, Michael Powers exited Universal Records South as senior VP of promotion. Powers' contract was up at the end of this year, and it was not renewed. That leaves VP of national promotion Teddi Bonadies in the house to keep things moving forward for the label, and she'll head up the promo staff on an interim basis. The entire Uni-South promo team remains intact. No comment from Powers yet, but based on his cell phone message, we assume he's having a zippity-doo-dah-day at Disney World.

Wilson owner] Saul Levine for giving me this chance and believing in my abilities; I hope I serve him well." She added, "It's good I was here from the launch of the radio station; I think that will serve the station well too." Station OM Mike Johnson, a 17-year veteran of Mt. Wilson Broadcasters who had been programming KKGO since the flip to country, will stay on as senior OM.

### Allen Playing Familiar Favorites At KOUL

Additionally, Allen will bring along his former morning show partner at KYRS, Charlie McKay, who will do middays. Still not finished with this kumbaya moment, Allen is also bringing his former marketing director at KAJA, Marc Mujica. I think I feel a group hug coming on, so I'll be going now.

### This Week At Callout America

Another week as the No. 1 song with country radio listeners for "Proud of the House We Built" from **Brooks & Dunn**, which also ranks as the No. 4 passion song. Both male and female listeners rank this song at No. 1, as do younger 25-34 listeners.

Reba & Kelly Clarkson have the No. 1 passion song for the week with "Because of You," which ranks as the No. 2 song overall. This song has spent 16 weeks in the top five at Callout America. Both men and women rank the song at No. 2, and core listeners 35-44 rank it at No. 1 in that demo.

**Toby Keith** is at No. 3 for the week with "Love Me If You Can," which also ranks as the No. 2 passion song. Females are at No. 3, as are male listeners. Younger females 25-34 rank this song at No. 1 in the demo, and younger males are at No. 3 and No. 1 passion.

**Kenny Chesney** debuts as the No. 8 song with "Don't Blink" and as the No. 3 passion song in week one. Men are at No. 5 and No. 4 passion. Females are at No. 10 and No. 3 passion. Younger 25-34s are the strength at No. 5 and No. 4 passion.





### **Garth Bites The Bullet; Never Count Dolly Out**

After bowing atop the R&R Country chart in the Sept. 7 issue, **Garth Brooks** recaptures a bullet with

"More Than a Memory" (Pearl/Big Machine) after dipping 1-8 last week. Up 8-7, Brooks' single gains 1.9 million audience impressions in its third chart week and draws 28.9 million impressions during the Sept. 10-16 tracking week.

Also noteworthy on the R&R Country chart is the solo return of Country Music Hall of Fame member **Dolly Parton**. Released on Parton's recently launched Dolly imprint, "Better Get to Livin'" is the singer-songwriter-actress' first solo single to impact the Nielsen BDS-fueled country scorecard since "Hello God" spent one week on the clock in November 2002. The new track bows at No. 57, Parton's highest debut in the 17-year-old Nielsen BDS era. Previously during that frame, Parton's highest solo arrival was a No. 58 start with "Romeo" in February 1993. So far in the Nielsen BDS era, Parton's highest solo peak happened when "Silver and Gold" stopped at No. 15 in August 1991.

Parton will perform the single on the third episode of the three-day season premiere of ABC-TV's "Dancing with the Stars." The show's new season kicks off Sept. 24, and Parton is slated to perform on Sept. 26.

Meanwhile, **Dierks Bentley** logs his eighth top 10 (his seventh consecutive) as "Free and Easy (Down the Road I Go)" (Capitol Nashville) gains 1.7 million impressions and rises14-10.

Sugarland takes double Most Added roses with "Stay" (Mercury), the fourth single from "Enjoy the Ride." The new song pulls in 25 reports on the R&R Country panel and registers 20 adds at the R&R Country Indicator group of stations. The song takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 41 on the R&R Country chart (the duo's second-highest arrival so far) and leads the New & Active pack on the R&R Country Indicator tally.



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


