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Hall Of Famers, Class of 2008 ... More Than Worthy

The Country Radio Broadcasters (CRB) on Monday (Oct. 22) announced this year's Country Music DJ Hall of Fame and Country Music Radio Hall of Fame inductees. Bill Cody and Bob Robbins will be inducted into the Country Music DJ Hall of Fame. Jaye Albright, Bobby Kraig and Michael Owens will be inducted into the Country Music Radio Hall of Fame.


Bill Cody, currently doing mornings at Gaylord's WSM-AM/Nashville, started his career in country radio in 1971 in Lebanon, Ky. Cody is also known as host of Jones Radio Network's GAC's "Classic Country Weekend With Bill Cody" and Great American Country's two-hour daily show "GAC Classics."

Bob Robbins of KSSN/Little Rock has been recognized as the No. 1 disc jockey in his market for more than 20 years. His career started at top 40 powerhouse KAAY/Little Rock in 1967. Robbins has been with KSSN since its inception in 1979 and has not only won individual honors during that time, but, under his leadership, KSSN has been recognized with CMA Awards, Marconis and Billboard Awards for Station of the Year. Robbins continues to do mornings at KSSN.

Jaye Albright consults radio stations and broadcast companies in the U.S. and Canada. She is a partner in Albright & O'Malley Country Consulting/RadioIQ. During her time as an air personality and day-to-day programmer, Albright worked for stations such as KUZZ/Bakersfield, KEEN/San Jose and KMPS/Seattle. In fact, when Albright was the OM at KUZZ, her GM was a very young Michael Owens. "If I'm going to go into the hall, I'm going in with some great people; it feels mighty good,"Albright told **R&R**.

Bobby Kraig is thought of by many people as perhaps one of the finest-ever label promotion executives, yet before he left radio, he built one of America's most successful country stations, KPLX/Dallas. During Kraig's leadership, KPLX dominated ratings and industry awards and, at one point, was the most listened-to country station in America. Upon hearing the news of his induction, Kraig told

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R&R, "I am honored to be included and very surprised by the news. There are so many talented, deserving people out there, and to be selected as one of inductees into the County Radio HOF is simply unbelievable to me! I'm looking forward to the night! "

Michael Owens was GM of country station KNIX/Phoenix, which was honored as Radio Station of the Year by the Country Music Association, the Academy of Country Music and *Billboard* magazine and received the Marconi Award for excellence in broadcasting. He started his country radio career in 1965 as a janitor and weekend announcer at KUZZ/Bakersfield, a station owned by his father, legendary country artist Buck Owens. Owens is still part owner of KUZZ & KCWR in Bakersfield. Reached by phone this afternoon, Owens told R&R, "I am surprised.... I've always been hopeful that I'd receive this honor, but I'm just extremely humbled, and can't believe it; I'm just thrilled to death, and I look forward to being there in March."

Part of the criteria for induction to the Country DJ and Radio Hall of Fame is making a significant contribution to the country radio industry. Each of these 2008 inductees not only meet that criteria, but have exceeded it. This year's class is a who's who of difference makers. I'm proud to serve as chairman of the DJ and Radio Hall of Fame Committee for the CRB Board this year and would like to say on behalf of the HoF selection committee and the CRB Board of Directors, we're honored to not only congratulate each inductee, but welcome them to their rightful place in the Hall of Fame. The DJ and Radio Hall of Fame inductions will take place Tuesday, March 4, 2008, one day prior to CRS-39 at the Nashville Convention Center.

Kenny Chesney spends his fourth consecutive week at No. 1 and the fifth consecutive week as the No. 1 passion song with "Don't Blink," which is also at No. 1 positive and passion with male and female listeners. Younger 25-34s rank this song at No. 1, as do core 35-44s.

Tim McGraw is new to the top five with "If You're Reading This" at No. 4, up from No. 8, and ranking as the No. 2 passion song for the week. Younger 25-34s rank this song as the No. 2 passion song, as do core 35-44s and both male and female listeners.

Chris Cagle is on the move with "What Kinda Gone" ranking at No. 16, up big from No. 29. Men are at No. 18, females at No. 16. Younger 25-34s are at No. 16.

Bucky Covington is showing potential early with "It's Good to Be Us" ranking at No. 21, up from No. 23. Females are the strength at No. 19, and younger 25-34s are strong at No. 14.

Ed Hill for his insight, Hill replied, "What insight? Heck, here we go in another chapter of radio fragmentation. It's not about the ratings! It's about the billing!" KEGA's PD, Cody Alan, told **R&R** he believes "it would be long, uphill road for another country station. I know Simmons Media is very committed to a country station here also, so we're dug in and determined to be strongly competitive in the country arena."

No Summertime Blues For Portland, Vegas, Indy

More summer books continued to roll today, and we finally saw a few markets showing some gains. We know Portland, Ore. has always been pretty competitive — after spring, CBS Radio's KUPL (4.8) was basically tied with Entercom's KWJJ (The Wolf) at a 4.7. KUPL distanced itself in summer, improving 4.8-5.9 for a No. 1 rank, which begged the question to John Paul, KUPL's PD ... how'd they do it? "If I could pinpoint exactly why we did so well, then I'd be a genius." Paul told R&R this afternoon. "But really, we were everywhere this summer. Tons of street exposure and some really cool promotions on the air too. Plus, I overhauled my entire airstaff in the middle of July ... hired Leela K. from WSOC for afternoons, moved Rick Taylor to middays, moved my midday jock to nights and my night jock to morning news. I'm really hoping those changes had something to do with it."

Both stations in Sin City saw gains; Clear channel's KWNR/Las Vegas gained a share, 4.1-5.1, good for third place 12+, while Beasley's crosstown KYCE was up as well, moving 2.6-3.3. Cumulus' WFMS/Indianapolis busted out in summer too, improving 9.4-10.7, retaining its No. 1 ranking and returning the station into its usual double-digit shares. Emmis' WLHK was essentially flat, 4.0-3.9. Speaking of double-digit shares, that's pretty much the only reality Clear Channel's WAMZ/Louisville has known for years. Even though the station dipped slightly, 10.3-10.0, they're still top-ranked 12+ and the only station in the market in double figures. Cox Radio's crosstown WPTI was also off a bit: 3.3-2.9.

Even though Clear Channel's KNIX/Phoenix was off 4.4-3.9, it maintained a lead over CBS Radio's KMLE, which was off nearly a share, 3.9-3.0. Remember to log on to

After several days of speculation, BNA confirmed Mark Janese will take over the Southwest region, reporting directly to BNA VP of promotion Rick Moxley. It's a return of sorts for Janese, who spent 15 years with Columbia and Epic before joining Broken Bow. Janese replaces Scott Long, who exited the label Oct. 15. Meanwhile, Broken Bow got a double-whammy last week, as JoJamie Jahr announced she would leave as Southeast rep Oct. 29 for an opportunity to

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be announced later. In spite of Janese defecting to BNA and Jon Loba's recent departure, Broken Bow soldiered on, quickly announcing Lee Adams will take over as director of national promotion, and Nancy Johnson has been hired to replace Jahr in the Southeast. Adams has been with BB since 2001 and worked the Northeast before becoming a national. Johnson has previous promotional experience with Big Machine and Capitol Nashville.

Put yourself in the promotional shoes of Lincoln Financial's KYGO/Denver this week. The World Series begins Wednesday night, and the Colorado Rockies baseball's hottest team — will play in the fall classic for the first time in franchise history when they take on Boston. Oh, but wait, it gets bigger, people. Thursday night, Hannah Montana comes to town in a soldout Pepsi Center show. Naturally, KYGO has tickets ... tickets that every young girl under the age of 12 in Colorado is dying to get her hands on. Being a loving, caring father, any dad would do whatever it takes to make his little princess happy, even if it means dressing up like Hannah Montana and competing in a 50-yard dash Thursday morning. We're not sure if that's the "Best of Both Worlds" as Hannah would say, but winning those precious tickets would definitely be a home run for Dad.

Most PDs **R&R** has spoken to are eagerly embracing the Hannah Montana/Miley Cyrus phenomenon as the pop culture event it is. The natural entré for country radio into the world of Hannah Montana/Miley Cyrus is the duet with her dad, who you may be familiar with: Billy Ray Cyrus. Gregg Swedberg, PD at Clear Channel's KEEY/Minneapolis, explains why it makes sense to not only play the Billy Ray/Miley Cyrus duet, but take advantage of the Hannah Montana opportunity. "The Billy Ray/Miley duet is perfect for three reasons: 1) Hannah Montana unites moms and kids. That show, along with the program with the two obnoxiously cute twin boys, is in *heavy* rotation in almost every family's house where there are kids aged

Strait Fattens Top 10 Tally; Billy Ray's 'Kid' Paradox

Country kingpin **George Strait** adds more ink to his already remarkable chart history as "How 'Bout Them Cowgirls" (MCA Nashville) becomes his 75th top 10 as a lead artist on the R&R Country chart. That places the Texan in a third-place tie with **Conway Twitty** for the most top 10 songs, a tally led by **Eddy Arnold** (92) and

George Jones (78). Strait's top 10 log is extended to 76 titles when his collaboration with **Jimmy Buffett**, titled "Hey, Good Lookin,'" is counted. That title (which also featured **Clint Black**, **Kenny Chesney**, **Alan Jackson** and **Toby Keith**) peaked at No. 8 in July 2004. "Cowgirls" gains 865,000 impressions and rises 11-9.

The R&R Country top 10 also sees the return of Strait's fellow Texan, **Clay Walker**, who scores his 16th top 10 with "Fall" (Asylum-Curb). That track improves 1.2 million impressions and hops 12-10. Walker most recently cracked the top 10 when "I Can't Sleep" spent four weeks at its No. 9 peak position in September 2003. A fixture on the chart's upper reaches during the first half of the '90s, Walker hasn't landed atop the list since "Rumor Has It" spent two weeks at No. 1 in April 1997.

When his mega-monster hit "Achy Breaky Heart" claimed the format's biggest headline in 1992 (five weeks at No. 1 was unheard of in the early '90s) **Billy Ray Cyrus** — despite making competitive, credible and often compelling music — got pigeonholed as a one-hit wonder for doing what? Making a record kids liked and one that put lots of boots on the dance floor. Somehow, he never got over being penalized by country radio for having such a huge (albeit stylistically and lyrically off-the-menu) hit, even though the format was fairly hospitable to such an oddity at the time. Fast-forward to the present, and Billy Ray has his second successful television show and — surprise, surprise — an apparent hit record.

On the R&R Country Indicator panel, "Ready" is Most Added (37 reports), and it hits the Breaker goal with a 33-27 hop on the R&R Country list. Starting today (Monday), promotion responsibilities shift from C05 to Walt Disney Records' corporate sister imprint, Lyric Street.



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
