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Roberts Reviews Three Rs With Universal South...

Return: Denise Roberts will come back to the record business after a year with Blair Garner's "After MidNite," where she served as director of affiliate relations and marketing. Effective Dec. 3, Roberts will assume director of national promotion responsibilities at Universal South Records. Teddi Bonadies, VP of promotion at Uni-South, said in a statement, "I have known Denise from the time we were both regionals in the Northeast 15 years ago and have observed her career path all these years, witnessing nothing but professionalism and class."

Rejoin: This will be Roberts' second tour of duty at the label. She originally signed up in 2002 as senior director of West Coast promotion when the label started up, but, within a year, was summoned to Nashville and took on national director of promotion duties. In 2004, Roberts was named VP of promotion for Toby Keith's Show Dog Records before moving to Los Angeles to work with Garner.

Relocate: When Roberts officially joins the label in December, she'll be heading back to Nashville. She's been involved in record promotion since 1993, when she handled the Northeast for MCA Nashville. In 1997, Roberts was upped to senior director of West Coast promotion, where she proceeded to win four consecutive R&R Industry Achievement Awards as country promotion executive of the year. Commenting on her move back to Universal South, Roberts said in a statement, "Because of the history I have with the staff at Universal Records South, Mark Wright and Joe Nichols, working again for the company is a bit like coming home for me. I look forward to working with Fletcher Foster and Teddi Bonadies to build our artists' profiles at radio by taking our current artists to the next level and breaking our new artists. It's going to be an exciting time."

Sink Or Swim, You've Gotta Give It A Whirl

Hey, life's a dance, remember? So why not start your very own record label, one with lots o' familiar names attached? Country star John Michael Montgomery is doing just that with Stringtown Records. The label takes its name from a small community near Montgomery's home in Mercer County, Ky. Montgomery will serve as the label's CEO, and Nashville music veteran Shelia Shipley Biddy takes on the role of president. The first project to be released will be Montgomery's 10th studio album, which he will record this fall with Byron Gallimore (Faith Hill, Tim McGraw). The two men worked together on Montgomery's 2004 "Letters From Home." Montgomery will also be looking for other artists to sign. Hallmark Direction, which manages Montgomery, will provide management, business management and publicity for the label. The radio promotion team and a distribution deal are still being finalized. Montgomery has scored 20 top singles, including seven No. 1s on Billboard's Hot Country Songs, and has sold 10.5 million records in the U.S., according to Nielsen Soundscan. Shipley, who has served at MCA Nashville, Decca Records and RCA Nashville, among other labels, is currently an artist manager at Hallmark Direction. She will continue to oversee the careers of Trent Willmon and Ray Scott.

Valory, Meet Jewel; Jewel, Meet Valory

Everybody met everybody else at a press conference Friday (Nov. 2) where Scott Borchetta announced the launch of Valory Music Company, It's the new sister label to Borchetta's Big Machine, for which Borchetta serves as president/CEO. Details for the new label include the signing of Jewel to a multi-album deal. Joining her on the label will be Jimmy Wayne, who'll make the jump from Big Machine, and Justin Moore,

Kenny Chesney continues dominating with "Blink" spending a sixth week at No. 1 and at No. 1 passion too. Both male and female listeners rank the song at No. 1 positive and passion.

Trisha Yearwood is really tuning up the heat with "Heaven, Heartache and the Power of Love" charting at No. 7 for the week, up from No. 14 last week. This song also shows strong passion, ranking at No. 9 passion, up from No. 18. Females are the strength at No. 5, men are at No. 11. Core 35-44s rank the song at No. 6.

Billy Currington continues to be way out front of the radio spin chart with "Tangled Up" ranking at No. 9 overall and as the No. 15 passion song. Females rank this song at No. 4, and younger 25-34 listeners overall rank it at No. 6.

Sara Evans stays strong with "As If" at No. 11 for the week and as the No. 10 passion song, up from No. 19. Core 35-44s rank this song at No. 5 passion. Females 25-44 rank it at No. 5 in the demo and as the No. 8 passion song.

Joe Nichols' "Another Side Of You" is on the move, ranking at No. 13, up from No. 23. Men are at No. 8, and core 35-44 listeners overall are at No. 9.

It's another strong move from **Bucky Covington** with "It's Good to Be Us" at No. 18, up big from No. 29. Females are the strength at No. 13, and core 35-44 listeners are at No. 11. **Sugarland**'s "Stay" is showing big passion scores, ranking as the No. 7 passion song overall. Females are at No. 5 passion, younger females are at No. 6.

who's been in development up until now. VMC will have its own promotion department, headed up by Jon Loba, who will be called VP of promotion and development. Since Loba left Broken Bow in August,



everybody has been speculating he'd join up with Borchetta, and he used his free time wisely, putting together a staff that includes Chris Loss, who will handle both West Coast and national duties. Another non-shocker is JoJamie Hahr, who worked the Southeast for Loba at BB and will do the same for Valory Music Company. Also joining the promotional team is Miranda Williams, formerly of CMT Radio, who will handle the Southwest. One more regional will be added soon.

According to Borchetta, "I had to either stop taking meetings with artists and stop digging the new music I'm hearing or find another way to put this music out." As for Jewel, five of her last six albums have been recorded in Nashville, and she said, "I've been wanting to do this record my whole career," adding that her label (she previously recorded for Atlantic Records) "was always scared of country music. I've always had country songs on my records." Though she lives in Texas with bull-riding star boyfriend Tv Murray, Jewel has spent a lot of time in Nashville over the last few years. Earlier this year, she hosted the country reality show "Nashville Star," and she has made a number of appearances at Muzik Mafia events. She also co-wrote and dueted with Jason Michael Carroll on "No Good in Goodbye," which appears on his debut album, "Waitin' in the Country." She will be a presenter on the Country Music Association Awards show with Murray on Nov. 7. "As a singer/ songwriter and as a storyteller, I'm old-fashioned," says Jewel, adding, "I like a beginning middle and end to my songs. That's pretty much country radio now."

CMA Week: Good For You, Good For Me, *Great* For Genovese

chairman of the CMA board, said in a statement, "The board has a tremendous amount of confidence in Tammy's abilities and the exceptional job she has done at CMA." Genovese, who started working at CMA in 1985, said in a statement, "I'm really excited about taking the necessary time to focus on the challenges ahead — especially as we approach the 50th anniversary of CMA in 2008."

Country Music Is Everywhere on ABC

The teasers for the show, which ABC ran in heavy rotation over the weekend (at least during college football), look terrific, with Brad Paisley, Carrie Underwood and Kellie Pickler among other stars inviting people to watch. ABC has been integrating the CMAs into other shows as well. On Tuesday's "Dancing With the Stars," Leann Rimes will be a guest and perform two songs; Wednesday, she'll duet with Reba on the awards show. On Wednesday morning, Big & Rich will perform on "Good Morning America" on the Chevy Stage at the Sommet Center's outside plaza at the corner of Broadway and Fifth Avenue in Nashville.

A Monster Week For Garth Too

It started early today in Hollywood, where the Academy of Country Music and the RIAA presented Garth Brooks with fresh hardware commemorating his ability to sell bazillions of albums.



OK, we exaggerated just a bit, it's a mere 123,000,000 units. The ACM gave Garth its Country Music Crystal Milestone Award, the first ever given to an artist, commemorating a specific, remarkable achievement. Moments later, the RIAA stepped up and recognized Garth-Zilla as the largest-selling solo artist in the history of recorded sound, according to its figures. The ceremony took place in front of the famous Capitol Records Building, which, coincidentally, is where Garth's star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame sits. By the way, here's a programming note: Garth was scheduled to appear on "The Tonight Show With Jay Leno" tonight (Nov. 5), but the show won't air now, due to the Writers Guild strike in Hollywood. Garth can use the free night to rest ... he kicks off a nine-day concert run in Kansas City tomorrow night.

Tomorrow Morning In Huntsville, All Garth, All The Time

Hey, why not? His "Ultimate Hits" collection drops, so it makes sense to have at least one radio station playing nothing but the G-Man. Clear Channel's WDRM/Huntsville, Ala. has been teasing a "major announcement" that will take place tomorrow morning at 7:20 a.m. 'DRM's PD Jim Tice has custom imaging with drops from Garth recorded specifically for his one-day format flip when the station will be transformed into "Garth 102.1." The station will give away the "Ultimate Hits" every hour all day, qualifying winners for a trip to K.C. for Garth's show.

PPM is Already A Winner

It's listed as one of three "Best Inventions of the Year" in the entertainment category by none other than *Time* magazine, right next to advanced 3D technology for the upcoming "Beowulf" movie and glasses that provide subtitles for deaf moviegoers. In bestowing the honor, *Time* describes PPM this way: "Forget consumer diaries. Arbitron is shaking up the ratings industry with its Portable People Meter, a wearable gizmo that picks up identification codes embedded in the audio portion of a broadcast and automatically records what radio or TV station consumers are really flipping to."

Cyrus Duet Picks Up Steam; Chesney Slows No. 1 Churn

With daughter Miley Cyrus, Billy Ray Cyrus claims the Most Increased Audience prize on the R&R Country chart with "Ready, Set, Don't Go" (Walt Disney/ Lyric Street), the elder Cyrus' highest charted title in seven years (23-22). The single improves 2.7 million impressions in its first seven days after promotion duties shifted from independent firm C05 to Disney corporate sister label, Lyric Street. For the elder Cyrus, this marks his highest chart position since "You Won't Be Lonely Now" peaked at No. 17 in November 2000. He last saw the top 10 when "Busy Man" stopped at No. 3 in March 1999, and his debut single, "Achy Breaky Heart" (1992), is his only No. 1 single to date. The new song is detected at 108 of the 111 stations monitored for this chart, a net gain of 14 stations during the tracking week. It leaps 25-18 on the R&R Country Indicator list.

As he logs a fourth straight week at No. 1 on the R&R Country list, **Kenny Chesney** slows the turnover rate at the top of the chart with his "Don't Blink" (BNA). So far this year, the longest No. 1 run also belongs to Chesney, who logged five weeks at No. 1 with "Never Wanted Nothing More" this summer. Chesney's single is the 22nd No. 1 so far this year, compared to 21 different chart-toppers during the same time frame in 2006. Last year, a total of 23 different titles did time in the top box.

In the Most Added columns this week, **Toby Keith**'s "Get My Drink On" (Show Dog Nashville) pops the cork with 21 reports, while **Brad Paisley**'s "Letter to Me" (Arista Nashville) and **Brooks & Dunn**'s "God Must Be Busy" (Arista Nashville) tie for the honor with 21 adds apiece on the R&R Country Indicator stable of stations. The Brooks & Dunn title is the runner-up on the R&R Country panel (20 reports).
