# **Musical Chairs On Music Row**

We can only imagine how happy and relieved our friends in the music business must have been Friday afternoon when it was finally quitting time in Nashville. Picture, if you will, the opening scene from the animated '60s sitcom "The Flintstones," where, upon hearing the 5:00 whistle, Fred Flintstone gleefully surfs down the tail of a huge dinosaur, lands directly behind the wheel of his car and peels off, screaming, "Yabba-dabba-doo!"

The week of musical chairs began Tuesday, Dec. 4 when George Briner, director of national promotion at BNA Records, exited after just over a year on the job. Twenty-four hours later, VP of national promotion Rick Moxley announced the appointment of Buffy Cooper as his replacement, effective immediately. Cooper had been serving as Southeast regional promotion manager for BNA since joining the label in 2006. Prior to joining BNA, Cooper had a ton of promotion experience, including national chops; at one time, she was national promotion director for Columbia Nashville and the former Epic Nashville labels. Cooper originally started in record promotion with Curb/Universal in 1996. As of this afternoon, BNA seemed to have finished its makeover when Moxley announced another hire: RJ Meacham will join the label as Northeast regional promotions manager, effective Dec. 18. Most recently, Meacham held a similar position for Curb/Asylum, but this is actually a return to familiar territory for Meacham on a couple levels; Meacham worked the northeast for Monument Records from 1996-1998. By comparison, Thursday was the eye of the hurricane, followed by UMG serving up a doozie first thing Friday morning when Luke Lewis announced executive VP of promotion Bill Catino was leaving the label. Catino's exit triggered a series of moves that were the equivalent of tectonic plates shifting beneath the Earth's surface. MCA VP of promotion Royce Risser was immediately elevated to UMG senior VP of promotion. Bruce Shindler, who was recently named to a similar post at Mercury Nashville, was named as Risser's successor, while Mercury senior director of Southeast promotion Damon Moberly was quickly named VP of promotion, succeeding Shindler. In a statement, Risser said of his promotion, "I am completely thrilled to take the helm of this amazing team at UMG Nashville; I have the pleasure of working with a killer group of professionals and the most talented artists in our genre. I am honored."

# From Bay To Bull In Two Business Days

We're guessing it actually took longer than that, but to non-insiders like us, it happened pretty quickly. On Thursday morning, CBS Radio's WQYK/Tampa morning personality Cledus T. Judd said goodbye to listeners, saying he was relocating to his hometown of Atlanta to be closer to his daughter and mother. This morning (Dec. 10) brought the announcement that surprised just about nobody: Cledus will be the new morning personality at Clear Channel's WUBL (94.9 The Bull)/Atlanta, beginning Monday, Jan. 7. In a statement, Judd said, "Around 1983, I spent the end of high school figuring out how to get out of this town, and I have spent the last 20 years trying to get back." Judd called mornings at The Bull "a dream gig for me" and said he looked forward to telling stories "to everyone who grew up with me and watched a hillbilly's career blossoming out of control." Judd will apparently replace Big D & Bubba on the Bull's morning show, and, echoing what he told his Tampa listeners late last week, he said the move to Atlanta, "allows me to be a better son to my mother, a better father to my daughter and a better friend to my friends."

Sticking with bull news for a moment, Citadel's KUBL (The Bull)/Reno, Nev. named Brad Hansen program director. The last 13 months have been similar to a wild bull ride for the radio station. After longtime PD Tom Jordan left to open a bed and breakfast facility in Bozeman, Mont., legendary top 40 radio personality and programmer Cleveland Wheeler was recruited in January and lasted what seemed like less than eight seconds at



**Bucky Covington** is making noise with "It's Good to Be Us" as core 35-44s rank the song at No. 10 overall in the demo. Core females rank it at No. 5 overall, and core males rank the song at No. 12 passion. Listeners 25-44 rank this song at No. 16. Females in the demo are at No. 13.

The Bull, exiting in March. Derek Gunn was named interim PD in addition to his many other duties, which included music, promotion and APD chores. Gunn has held down the fort since March. Now it's Hansen's turn to saddle up, and he's all too familiar with the animal kingdom, having just served as PD at

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Triad's WGZR (Lucky Dog)/Savannah, Ga. Hansen had a brief run at Beasley's KYCE (The Coyote)/Las Vegas after a long run at Journal/Springfield, Mo. Hansen begins his new gig on Jan. 7, and it looks like he'll stick to his Gunn, who will retain his MD/APD and promotional duties for KUBL.

Apparently, running a bed and breakfast in the mountains 15 miles north of Bozeman doesn't provide the dayto-day stimuli found inside the walls of a radio station; thus, the return of the aforementioned Tom Jordan to the biz. Jordan was named PD at Peak Broadcasting's KSKS (Kiss Country)/Fresno, succeeding Steve Pleshe, who exited the station on Oct. 29. Jordan told **R&R**, "I truly miss radio; to sit up here secluded, no cell service for anybody, that's nice for a while, but a year and half later, I'm goin' nuts ... I'm not ready for retirement yet." Jordan started the new gig today.

Defying all odds — even for Sin City — the newly announced market manager for Beasley/Las Vegas, Mike Glickenhaus, pulled a big-time switcheroo by announcing his resignation from the five-station cluster that includes country KYCE ... just two days into the job! Glickenhaus, most recently the founder & president/CEO of Finest City Broadcasting, cited personal reasons for the decision to leave Beasley. Said the company's VP of operations, Brian Beasley, "Although this has caught us by surprise, we remain committed to our staff, clients and listeners in Las Vegas."

In what amounted to a six-month roll in the hay ... as in Cumulus/Oxnard-Ventura, Calif., cluster OM and KHAY PD Tom Watson left the building last week, with no replacement named. Watson left his most recent gig, PD of Entercom adult hits WNTR (107.9 The Track)/Indianapolis, in April and had returned to Los Angeles to reopen his consultancy before Cumulus came calling.

Just in time for the holidays, Ray Quinn is the newly minted market manager for Clear Channel's Birmingham and Tuscaloosa, Ala. stations and the Alabama radio Network. Quinn will fill the seat vacated when Jimmy Vineyard transferred to Panama City, Fla. as market manager. Most recently market manager for Entercom/

# **Christmas Music Scheduling Hint: Go Familiar**

Edison Media Research just did a study of Christmas music, and that's our takeaway after seeing the results. They tested about 600 Christmas songs with 30-49-year-old females who said they liked or loved Christmas songs on the radio. Compared with newer songs, standards showed greater familiarity, and older titles were less susceptible to burn as well. Newer, more novelty-leaning titles showed high burn, even when they also showed high preference. Of the top 100 testing songs, 48% were from prior to 1967, and these went as far back as 1939. Twenty-four percent were from 1968-1988, 14% were 1989-1994, and another 14% were from 1995-2007.

# **ON THE CHARTS**

# Swift's Flying Leap; Chesney Gets Thumbs-Up

Not counting **Garth Brooks**' history-making bow at No. 1 this fall with "More Than a Memory" (Pearl/Big Machine), **Taylor Swift** takes the R&R Country chart's biggest jump to No. 1 by any artist in almost 10 years and the biggest for a solo female in 14 years. Swift's "Our Song" (Big Machine) gains 2.8 million impressions and surges 6-1, marking the chart's biggest leap since **Tim McGraw**'s "Just to See You Smile" shifted 6-1 in January 1998. Among women, Swift's improvement is the biggest No. 1 blast since **Faith Hill's** "Wild One" flew 6-1 in December 1993.

Up 2.8 million impressions, Swift's gain is second only to McGraw's improvement of 2.9 million impressions with "Suspicions" (Curb), which jumps 37-27. This also marks the first time this decade that one solo female replaces another atop the country chart. That hasn't happened since January 1999 when **Jo Dee Messina**'s "Stand Beside Me" followed **Martina McBride**'s "Wrong Again" at the summit. Swift's song dominates both R&R country charts in the U.S. and leads the R&R Canada Country scorecard.

Concurrently, **Carrie Underwood's** "So Small" (Arista/ Arista Nashville) takes the sharpest plunge from No. 1 by any country title in more than 11 years. Underwood's song dips 6.8 million impressions and tumbles 1-10, the most drastic fall from the summit since **Shania Twain's** "You Win My Love" fell 1-11 in May 1996.

The R&R Country Indicator panel grabs headlines with 54 adds on **Kenny Chesney**'s "Shiftwork" (BNA), which snares the Most Added trophy on both panels. The slightly smaller R&R Country panel offers a less enthusiastic but still handsome 31 new adds. With a 46-34 move on that chart, "Shiftwork" also crosses the Breaker threshold this week. R&R Music Tracking reports 49 R&R Country stations on Chesney's new song, while the R&R Country Indicator stable of stations finishes with 68 reporters onboard (new at No. 28).

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# **MUSICNOTES**

Country Thunder Records' artists **Heartland** have announced they'll be working with James Stroud, who will produce their next album.

A good year consists of many good weeks. As an example, take this past week for **Taylor Swift**. She received a Grammy nomination; was announced as a performer of Dick Clark's "New Years Rockin' Eve"; surpassed the 31 millionmark for music streams on her MySpace page; and owns the No. 1 spot on the **R&R** chart with "Our Song," which is her first chart-topper.

**Toby Keith** is ready for his second film; "Beer for My Horses" will start filming in February. Rodney Carrington helped write the script, and rocker Ted Nugent will have a role in the movie.

**Brooks & Dunn's** tune "Cowboy Town" is the official song of the National Finals Rodeo for the next two years. The duo will be in Las Vegas on Thursday night (Dec. 13) to perform it live at the NFR, which is going on now through Dec. 15.


