## **Everything I Need To Know About PPM I Learned At The Fly-In**

It's a slightly different list than the one about kindergarten, and we're pretty sure they didn't take a nap every afternoon, but the annual Arbitron Consultant Fly-In did feature some interesting information. On day one (Dec. 12), three panels, "Panel Compliance and Management," "Panel Methodology" and "PPM in the Future," were presented. One idea that could possibly help with that all-too-slippery slope — non-compliance — would be signing up individual panelists from households; right now participation from an entire household is required. The difficult-to-recruit 35-and-under crowd could be wowed by personalized Web pages for panelists, so they could track not only their progress/compliance, but that of others in their household as well. When discussing the future of PPM, Arbitron reps talked about studying new designs for the electronic doohickey, including slimmer units, choices of colored skins for the meters, and making the devices easier to wear for fashion-conscious women.

On day two (Dec. 13), Dr. Ed Cohen, VP of domestic radio research for Arbitron, provided an update on efforts to include "cell-phone-onlys" in diary-based survey samples. The move is seen as long overdue by many broadcasters, who note that entire segments of listeners are out of reach of Arbitron's surveys. For example, the rapid rise of men 18-24 without landlines has coincided with dramatic declines in proportionality in the demo, leading to erratic ratings swings for young-targeting stations. The most up-to-date estimates from the federal government show the percentages of Americans living in cell-phone-only households to be significantly higher among specific demographics and lifestyles: 55.3% of adults living with unrelated roommates; 28.2% of adults renting their homes; 27.9% of adults ages 18-24; 31% of adults ages 25-29; 18% of Hispanics. As age increased, the percentage of adults living in households with only wireless phones decreased.

According to Cohen, Arbitron is moving from a phone-based sample frame to one based on addresses. The company has purchased an address-based sample from Philadelphia-based Marketing Systems Group. While 60% of the address-

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

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based sample can be matched to phone numbers, the remaining 40% cannot. That's where Arbitron goes fishing for cell-only households, using mailing incentives as bait. The process involves mailing pre-surveys to the address-based sample. Pre-surveys returned by households that identify themselves as cell-phone-only (and that give Arbitron permission to contact them on their cell phone) are earmarked to receive a ratings diary.

Cohen said Arbitron will conclude its first cell-phoneonly test using the address-based sample on Dec. 31. A larger field test in the first half of 2008 will involve diaries being mailed, returned and processed. While Arbitron had hoped to implement the new procedure next year, it is now aiming for a 2009 implementation.

## This Week At Callout America

**Carrie Underwood** stays strong with "So Small," the No. 1 song overall and No. 1 passion song. Both male and female listeners rank the song at No. 1.

**Leann Rimes** continues to build strength with "Nothin' Better to Do" at No. 2, up from last week's No. 4. Females are the strength at No. 2 overall, core 35-44 females rank the song at No. 1, and 25-54s are at No. 2. Core listeners overall rank this song at No. 2.

**Taylor Swift** is still a powerhouse with "Our Song," the No. 2 passion song overall for the week. Core 35-44 listeners rank the song at No.1 passion, as do core females. Core males are at No. 1 overall and No. 2 passion.

**Sugarland** are producing strong passion scores, ranking "Stay" at No. 3 passion and the No.2 passion song with younger 25-34 listeners. Listeners 25-44 rank "Stay" at No. 4 passion. Females overall are at No. 3 passion and men at No.2 passion.

**Faith Hill** stays well in front of the spin chart with "Red Umbrella" ranking as the No. 13 song this week, up strong from No. 19. Both men and women rank the song at No. 15. Core 35-44 listeners rank it at No. 11, as do listeners 25-44. Females 25-44 rank the song at No. 10, while male strength is with core 35-44s at No. 14.

**Josh Turner** shows passion with radio listeners, ranking "Firecracker" as the No. 8 passion song for the week. Females are at No. 7 passion, with 45-54 females at No. 2 passion. Male strength is with core 35-44s at No. 8 passion and men 45-54 at No. 6 passion.

## Those Were The People, These Were The Stories

In case you haven't seen or read last Friday's (Dec. 14) **R&R**, I listed the top stories of the year. They're not in any particular order, but these were some of the most noteworthy events for country radio and records in 2007:

PPM Goes Live in Philly & Houston: PPM news was huge all year, especially toward the end, as the rollout for markets like L.A. and New York was pushed back. Houston and Philadelphia lived the PPM reality all year, however, with Bob McKay, PD at Beasley's WXTU/Philadelphia; Johnny Chiang with Cox Radio's KKBO/Houston; and Jeff Garrison at CBS Radio's crosstown KILT sifting through reams of brand-new data such as 6+ cume, 52 weeklies and 13 monthlies. The bottom-line consensus from all three: "Don't overreact."

Tracy Lawrence Finds Out Who His Friends Are: Radio responded to Tracy Lawrence during a race for No. 1, making "Find Out Who Your Friends Are," with pals Kenny Chesney and Tim McGraw, Lawrence's first chart-topper since 1996. The song went on to win a CMA for music event of the year.

Garth Brooks Comes Out Of Retirement — Sort Of: New single "More Than a Memory" debuts at No. 1 ... 34-song "Ultimate Hits" box set hits stores ... 160,000 tickets sold in less than two hours for nine Kansas City dates. Garth follows that up in December by selling out five L.A. shows in less than an hour.

Taylor Swift: She turned 18 just last week, but Swift is the poster child for using technology like MySpace and

L.A. & San Francisco Flip Over Country: In four days, two top-five markets welcomed the return of country radio. Feb. 26 marked the debut of Mt. Wilson Broadcasters' KKGO (Go Country 105)/Los Angeles. Three days later, Entercom flipped recently purchased KMAX/San Francisco to "95.7, the Wolf" and later changed the calls to KBWF.

### Hannah Montana Mania Welcome Here

When some country PDs told us they'd been informed that proposals for Hannah Montana promotions wouldn't be considered at upcoming tour stops, that came as news to the gang over at Lyric Street. Ditto for parent company Walt Disney Records. Remember that Hannah is actually Milev Cyrus, the daughter of country superstar Billy Ray Cyrus. Together, they have a duet, "Ready, Set, Don't Go," which moved 14-13. The pop-culture phenomenon that is Hannah Montana has gripped the nation, including country radio, which has a natural tie-in with the Billy Ray/Miley single and the fact that many country listeners have daughters



obsessed with Hannah. Lyric Street VP of promotion Kevin Herring assures country radio that Lyric Street has your back on this, but urges patience too, saying, "While nobody is getting everything they want when it comes to tickets and promotions around the hottest show on the planet, we have made tickets and promotions available to country radio in every market Miley has played, and that will be true for all the markets she just recently scheduled as well. The demand is high, and it's coming from every format, sponsor and media outlet. Walt Disney Records has gone above and beyond to provide as many tickets as possible and, in many cases, meet and greets for country radio. While all this is going on, its fun to hear Billy Ray Cyrus on the radio again with a big ol' hit record with his daughter!"

## Radio & Records-O-Rama And Stuff ...

Sanctuary Artist Management opened its doors in September of this year, and they just signed Universal Records South artist Joe Nichols for exclusive management representation. In addition to the Nashville offices, CEO Carl Stubner operates out of Los Angeles, New York and London, representing the likes of ZZ Top, Fleetwood Mac, Tommy Lee, Elton John, the Who and James Blunt. Stubner called Nichols "quite possibly one of the most gifted vocalists I have come across."

Sinclair's WNRJ/Norfolk pulled a switcharoo Friday, junking the rhythmic AC format for country and stunting with all Garth, even calling itself "Garth 106." It's the second go-'round with country on this signal, which was called WKCK (Kick 106) from 2004-2005.

CBS Radio/Detroit elevates 10-year company man and director of sales Kevin Murphy to senior VP/market manager of the six-station cluster ... Simon says, "Let's move to Miami!" Scott Simon will reunite with PD Ken Boesen at Beasley's WKIS (Kiss Country)/Miami.

## **ON THE CHARTS**

## Swift Settles In; Paisley, Allan Hit Top 10

As **Taylor Swift** continues to dominate both charts with "Our Song" (Big Machine), two artists add to their respective top 10 tallies on the R&R Country list. **Brad Paisley** claims his 17th top 10 with "Letter to Me" (Arista Nashville), which hops 12-9. Paisley first cracked that part of the chart when "He Didn't Have to Be" rose 14-10 in October 1999. That title and eight subsequent Paisley tracks have done time at No. 1. He most recently saw the chart's crest when "Online" led the chart dated Oct. 5. Meanwhile, **Gary Allan** posts his 10th top 10 as "Watching Airplanes" (MCA Nashville) hops 13-10. Allan has three No. 1 singles so far, a slot he most recently held when "Nothing On But the Radio" spent two weeks there in November 2004.

A little lower on the list, **Garth Brooks** brings **Huey Lewis** back to our charts for the first time since 2001, as the pair duet on Lewis' 1982 pop hit (with **the News**) "Workin' for a Livin'." That track bows at No. 50 with spins detected at 38 monitored stations. Although this is Lewis' first Country chart ink, he's no stranger to country fans and artists. He played **Reba McEntire**'s husband in the videoclip for her 1992 chart topper, "Is There Life Out There."

In the Most Added ring, **Carrie Underwood**'s "All-American Girl" (Arista/Arista Nashville) delivers the knockout punch. The R&R Country Indicator panel swings the gates open with 46 adds, followed by 33 reports from the R&R Country panel. **Kenny Chesney** takes the biggest gains on both charts, as "Shiftwork" (BNA) improves 804 detections on the R&R Indicator list and gains 4.4 million audience impressions on the R&R Country chart.

**Kenny Chesney** played to more than a million fans and grossed over \$71 million with 2007's "Flip Flop Summer" tour, earning it Billboard's designation as the top country tour of 2007. Chesney is already planning 2008 and plans to include even more NFL stadiums on the schedule.

2007 was a very good year for **Taylor Swift**, too. iTunes' Best of 2007 Editors Choice list names Swift as best new artist, and "Teardrops on My Guitar' as the No. 1-selling country song for the past year. Swift just turned 18 last week.

Alan Jackson's next CD is due March 4 and will be the first one that features Jackson as the sole writer of all the songs on the album. You've already heard one song from the album; "Small Town Southern Man" is the lead single, and currently sits at No. 18 on the R&R Country chart.

A good time was had by all when making the upcoming **Willie Nelson** CD, "Moment of Forever." Due in January, the CD was produced by Kenny Chesney and Buddy Cannon. The title track was written by Kris Kristofferson.





