The World According To Garth

There was an endless supply of "aw-shucks"s, "gee-whiz"s and "oh-wow"s served up over the weekend at Staples Center in Los Angeles, and I, for one, drank it up. I drank it by the gallon and gulped it down as quickly as possible in order to take advantage of every free refill offered by Garth Brooks during his two-day, five-show iron man exhibition that doubled as a benefit for Southern California firefighters. I didn't see every show like that guy who was walking behind me as we exited the arena. Proudly, triumphantly — wearily — he waved five ticket stubs over his head, challenging the rest of us to match his endurance. The only human capable of that, naturally, was Garth himself.

I attended the final show after joking last week about Garth still having a voice by 9 p.m. on Saturday night. I'd seen Garth play a doubleheader in 1998 when he did a matinee followed by an evening performance during a six-show run in San Antonio, but three in one day seemed to border on sheer lunacy. Any concerns about Garth's voice (which were only half-serious anyway) proved to be unwarranted. Yes, there was a moment where a slight rasp was detectable. It happened during a slower part of the show — if there is such a thing at a Garth concert — as he offered an acoustic rendering of songs by Merle Haggard and Jim Croce, both early influences. That moment of raspiness actually worked for Garth, merely adding to the sincerity of his interpretation, particularly on Croce's "Operator."

There was a time early in Garth's career, way before the move to Nashville or any record deal, when he played small clubs in Oklahoma and stood onstage for hours with just a guitar playing anything and everything requested for a roomful of patrons. In spite of the fact that Staples was busting at the seams with 19,000 fans eager to see Garth play his original material, this portion of the show offered a brief glimpse of intimacy in an otherwise typically delirious arena setting. Oh, and let's not kid ourselves, there was plenty of delirium to be had by all. Garth is a master at working massive crowds into a lather with his enthusiasm, honesty and humility. Anybody who saw Garth shows when he was supporting "Ropin' the Wind" or "No Fences" remembers the acrobatics that would get crowds amped up: swinging on ropes; climbing ladders; smashing guitars; dous-

ing the drummer with water; and, once, on one of his many TV specials in the '90s, flying high above a Texas Stadium crowd like Peter Pan while harnessed in invisible wires. Well, none of that happened last weekend — at least not at the show I attended — and that worked in his favor too. Instead, Garth let the music drive the show with solid players and an equally solid set list that surely satisfied everyone, an assumption I make based on every fan knowing every word to every song Garth performed all night. Even when he apologetically hoped fans wouldn't mind hearing something new, as soon as the chorus to "More Than a Memory" came around, the sing-along was off and running again.

Among the many impressive aspects of these five shows was the unique set list for each one. That acoustic part I mentioned earlier came somewhere in the middle of Saturday night's show, but served as an encore during an earlier one. Conversely, the encore I saw, "Ain't Goin' Down," was played in the middle of previous shows. It's hard to isolate a single goose-bump moment at a Garth show because they come at you pretty fast and furious, but here's one: No matter how many times I've seen it in person, watched it on a TV special or heard it on his live album, there really is nothing quite as awesome and empowering as hearing 19,000 fans simultaneously erupt with, "You can kiss my ass!"

According to Buzz Jackson, PD at Citadel's KIIM/ Tucson, who was also there, "It was the best concert as far as crowd and artist energy I've seen in a long time." Jackson told **R&R** today he was thrilled to see so many 20-somethings energized and excited "by an artist who basically has been absent from the charts for all their formative years." There was one simple word used by Becky Brenner, PD at CBS Radio's KMPS/Seattle: "Wow!" Actually, Brenner used another word that described Garth: "amazing." Like everybody else at the show, Brenner says she never sat down for two hours and craved even more when the show was finished. A highlight for Brenner was Trisha coming out onstage with Garth, which got the wheels turning in Brenner's head: "I think the next great phase should be the Garth and Trisha duets album with a world tour to match." This Week At Callout America

Jason Aldean repeats at No. 1 with "Laughed Until We Cried," which is also the No. 9 passion song. Men are at No. 2, women at No. 3.

Chris Cagle on the move with "What Kinda Gone Is This" at No. 14, up from No. 16, and at No. 14 passion, up from No. 19. Younger 25-34 listeners are at No. 12 and No. 11 passion. Younger females are at No. 13, core males are also at No. 13.

Phil Vassar's "Love Is a Beautiful Thing" is seeing some movement at No. 23 for the week, up from No. 28. Females are at No. 18. Females 35-44 are strong at No. 12 and No. 7 passion.

Campos, PD at Mt. Wilson Broadcasters' KKGO (Go Country 105)/Los Angeles, said Garth's five epic performances spoiled her: "I know that every single concert I go to will not match that."

A Tough Go For Go Country

You had to feel just awful for KKGO (Go Country) last Saturday (Jan. 26). On a day when Garth would play



three shows, the station had planned a live broadcast at Staples all day. Unfortunately, inclement weather hit Mt. Wilson — and by that, we mean the station's tower sight — knocking it off the air the entire day due to ice and snow that damaged an STL antenna, in addition to caving in the transmitter roof, which led to water damage. The station eventually got back up, but it wasn't until Sunday morning. Just in case you're confused, thinking, "Los Angeles? Snow? Ice?" It can happen. Last week was nonstop rain in L.A., but for surrounding mountain areas like Mt. Wilson, where the elevation is 5,000+ feet, that means white cold stuff.

This News Is Cold Too

Freezing, actually, and we don't mean the weather. Nope, we're talking budgets over at Clear Channel. Soon after the FCC approval of the CC buyout, **R&R** was told by sources inside the company that a substantial budget freeze is now in effect across the board for the first quarter and possibly longer. The freeze is said to cover tools such as marketing and research. New hires are on hold TFN, unless an offer had already been made, which would certainly be attractive at this point, wouldn't it?

Off In A Haze of Glory

Somewhere in this story, it seems like there should be "a player to be named later." It started with Capitol Nashville Midwest promo dude Van Haze defecting to Mercury. In what appears to have been mere moments later, senior manager of promotion Brent Jones was upped to director of Midwest promotion. Jones has been with Capitol since 1995. Jones will report to Capitol VP of promotion Steve Hodges, while over at Mercury, Hayes will report to promotion honcho Damon Moberly.





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
