
CRS-39: Start Planning Now

Take a look at your calendar, and you'll notice CRS-39, which is happening March 5-7 in Nashville, is rapidly approaching. If you're reading this on Tuesday, Feb. 12, it's a mere 22 days away and, therefore, not too soon to start prioritizing what sessions to attend. By the way, if you're looking for an unbiased view on the Country Radio Seminar, let's be honest, you won't find it here. This will be my 24th consecutive CRS, and I think it's not only the best organized industry gathering in existence, but one that can truly benefit your career. I guess you could say I'm a fan. In this week's (Feb. 15) edition of **R&R**, we'll give you a CRS-39 preview, highlighting some of the "must-see" sessions and events. Since there's never enough time and space to cover it all, I wanted to include some of the things we couldn't fit into the country column and put them in today's R&R Hotfax. It's also my clever way of getting you to read both the Hotfax *and* my weekly column. How's that workin' for you so far?

The first thing that pops out for this year's seminar is a Wednesday (March 5) start. Since 9/11, the seminar had dropped its Saturday agenda, making it a two-day event, but over the past couple of years, CRS gradually evolved back into three days, and, this year, they've made it official. According to CRS-39 agenda chairman Bob Richards, who programs Cumulus' WFMS/Indianapolis in his spare time, "It just got tougher to contain it to just two days." One reason for that was a decision to cut down the number of concurrent panels, so attendees didn't have as many tough choices to make. Wednesday, March 5 is a full day, starting with the Artist Radio Taping Sessions (ARTS) at 8:45 a.m. Immediately following ARTS is an "Up Close" session with none other than Garth Brooks. It should be an interesting morning. WSIX/Nashville morning dude Gerry House will moderate a Q&A session, then one radio attendee will be chosen from the audience to get on stage and sing with Garth.

According to both Richards and CRB exec. director Ed Salamon, PPM is this year's hot topic for both radio and the music industry. "Radio is certainly interested in how that measurement will affect their radio stations audience," says





Salamon, adding, "Record companies are equally interested in how audience flow on a minute-by-minute basis is going to affect programming philosophies." Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 p.m., the Arbitron sponsored panel titled "The Country Format Through the PPM Lens" will feature, among other things, information about how often country listeners tune in, how long they stay and where they go when they tune out. If you don't get your fill of PPM-centric data Wednesday, be sure and stick around through Friday for three more excellent PPM panels beginning at 8:30 a.m. with. "PPM: Our New Way of Selling."

On Thursday morning, Richards says not to miss the "Morning Show Marvels" panel scheduled for 10 a.m. Big D & Bubba, along with Todd Pettengill from "The Scott & Todd Morning Show" at WPLJ/New York, will share ideas about keeping the show fresh and topical. Valerie Geller, one of the foremost authorities on personality radio, will moderate. In addition to being a country music town meeting, with panels designed specifically for music industry professionals, Thursday is also being themed up as a "tech-track" day with a series of panels such as "Growing Online" (9 a.m.); "TXT WTF?", which discusses text messaging (10 a.m.); and a look at 10 hot technology trends such as HD, podcasting, blogging and social networking that may or may not be helpful to radio programmers. That session is called "Boom or Bust" and starts at 11 a.m. on Thursday.

One more panel to tell you about, and it's a good way to finish, because CRS is a fantastic place to network. You can meet people at CRS who will become valuable business associates for years to come; for the second straight year, the agenda committee is actually doing a networking session called ... ta-da! "Extreme Networking." Friday morning at 11 a.m., the agenda committee will have some of the biggest, most influential members of our industry in the same room at the same time, says Richards, "to give a lot of people from smaller markets the chance to sit down with label executives and programmers from big markets, to ask questions, etc." It's basically patterned after a speed dating session, with five

This Week At Callout America

Chuck Wicks has been strong for a long time with "Stealing Cinderella," and, this week, he takes over the No. 1 slot overall at Callout America, up from last week's No. 6. Females are the strength at No. 3, and, in demo, younger 25-34s are at No. 2; listeners 45-54 are at No. 1.

Gary Allan stays strong with "Watching Airplanes" ranking as the No. 5 passion song for the week, up from No. 7 two weeks back. Younger 25-34s are at No. 3 passion, and 25-44s are at No. 4 passion. The track gets strong "like a lot" scores with both male and female listeners.

Emerson Drive is new to the top 10 this week as "You Still Own Me" ranks at No. 10, up strong from No. 17 last week and No. 20 two weeks ago. Females are at No. 4 and No. 13 passion. Male strength is with younger 25-34s, where it's at No. 10, up from No. 15.

Chris Cagle's "What Kinda Gone" stays ahead of the radio spin charts with radio listeners ranking at No. 11 this week, up from No. 14 over the last two weeks. Men are at No. 10 overall, core 35-44 females are at No. 9.

Josh Gracin is moving strong with "We Weren't Crazy" at No. 12, up from No. 18. Females are at No. 11, up from No. 17. Male strength is with core 35-44s at No. 14, with men 25-44 at No. 15.

Mark Chesnutt produces solid numbers with strong passion scoring on "Rollin' With the Flow," which ranks as the No. 15 passion song, No. 11 passion with males and No. 15 passion with females. Core males are at No. 9 and No. 8 passion.

ON THE CHARTS

Strait's Nine Lives: He's Just Warming Up, Folks

It hardly seems possible that almost 27 years have passed since I first saw **George Strait** perform at Fan Fair in Nashville. And it seems patently unfair that after all this time, my hair is thinning and gray, while he looks every bit the feisty youngster he was when

he took the stage at Municipal Auditorium that hot June day so many years ago. That said, it almost goes without saying that cheering him on as he pings the **R&R** Country chart for his *107th* time (including duets and other collaborations) is among the rarest of pleasures.

After collecting 39 early adds on the **R&R** Country panel last week, Strait claims Most Added honors (55 reports) and a career-high bow with "I Saw God Today" (MCA Nashville), which takes the Hot Shot Debut at No. 19. The song wasn't serviced to radio until Monday, Feb. 4, but drew a whopping 11 million audience impressions during the Feb. 4-10 tracking week. Previously, Strait twice opened as high as No. 30 with "You'll Be There" (April 2005) and "It Just Comes Natural" (October 2006).

Strait's new song introduces his "Troubadour" album (due at retail April 1). It took an early bow last week on the **R&R** Country Indicator chart, where it repeats its Most Added nod with 66 new reports and rockets 54-27. The song nabs Most Increased Plays on that list (up 1,113) and Most Increased Audience on the **R&R** Country chart (up 10.8 million).

With the lofty debut, Strait becomes the fifth artist in the 18-year-old Nielsen BDS-era to debut inside the top 20, and "God" is the seventh title to arrive inside that part of the **R&R** Country list during that frame. The Texan's single posts the highest start since **Garth Brooks** opened at No. 1 with "More Than a Memory" in the **R&R** dated Sept. 7, 2007.

Meanwhile, the **R&R** Country Indicator list portends another No. 1 for **Rodney Atkins**, as "Cleaning This Gun (Come On In Boy)" (Curb) rises 5-1. Nipping at Atkins' heels is **Billy Ray Cyrus w/Miley Cyrus**' "Ready, Set, Don't Go" (Walt Disney/Lyric Street). The two titles are separated by just 97 plays this week.
