
#### This Year's Class One Hell Of A Hall

When your **R&R** arrives this Friday, do us both a favor, won't you? Drop whatever you're doing, rush to the mailbox, rip open the envelope and start reading the special CRS features portion. You see, this week, we begin our extended CRS coverage, which will be divided between the next two issues. Part one will focus on each of the Country DJ and Radio Hall of Fame inductees. Bill Cody of WSM-AM/Nashville and Bob Robbins of KSSN/Little Rock enter the hall in the DJ category, while Jaye Albright, Michael Owens, and Bobby Kraig will be inducted as Radio honorees. I had the opportunity to talk to each of these broadcasters at length recently and came away truly inspired.

Bill Cody grew up in Kentucky and told me about a late-night drive with his father when he was maybe 10 years old. As they listened to WSM on the radio, Cody's father turned to him and said, "That's the one." As Cody's radio career started to unfold, the historical significance of WSM was never lost on him, and he dreamed of one day working there. After finding his way to KKYX/San Antonio, where he was quickly entrenched in the market as a radio and TV personality, Cody told his bosses there only one radio job could lure him away: WSM-AM. Sure enough, in 1994, the call came, and Cody has been in Nashville ever since. Ironically, this won't be Cody's first trip to the DJ Hall of Fame ceremony; he hosted the event in 2001. On Tuesday, March 4, Cody will be inducted as one its five newest members.

Bob Robbins is a radio rarity these days, having spent the past 29 years at KSSN/Little Rock. He signed on with the radio station in 1979 and has been honored many times by the industry, including a CMA award for Broadcast Personality of the Year in 1996. Robbins is one of the nicest, most genuinely positive people I've ever spoken too. His demeanor is something that can't help but rub off on you, and his outlook is best summed up this quote, when asked if he enjoys radio today as much as in the past: "I've said it a million times, I'm probably the most blessed man in the world and in this business. I hope everybody that does it loves it like I do."

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Jaye Albright has been in radio since the early '60s and is basically an encyclopedia when it comes to possessing a historical reference on radio in general and country specifically. She's got some pretty amazing call letters on her resume as a programmer, including KMPS/Seattle, KUZZ/Bakersfield and KEEN/San Jose, not to mention years and years as a successful consultant to many other stations. Jaye was actually a PD/GM very early on - like 12 or 13 — when she built her own radio station in the garage and staffed it up with neighborhood kids in her hometown of Salem, Ohio. During her career, she went on to cross paths with numerous other Hall of Famers, including Michael Owens and Larry Daniels. When asked for an observation about the format, Albright told **R&R**, "People talk today about the incredible change going on in our business, and I look back and would say, 'When hasn't it been like that?' Change is what life is all about. In this fast-moving multimedia age, when change comes at you a million miles an hour, it's amazing to watch the resiliency of the country format through it all."

Michael Owens is the epitome of starting a career from the ground up. That's because his first ever job at a radio station was sweeping the ground at KUZZ/Bakersfield. Owens' first-ever boss was Larry Daniels, who back then accurately predicted to his wife, "Someday, I'll be working for Michael." For 20 years, Daniels did, in fact, work for Owens at KNIX/Phoenix, where they not only built the station into a market leader, but one of the most respected radio stations in America. There was a 10-year period in the '80s when KNIX was ranked No. 1 in Phoenix every ratings period except for one. Describing those years, Owens told R&R, "We were extremely fortunate, but we worked hard. Clients, listeners vendors, record companies ... everybody wanted to do business with us, and we couldn't believe we got paid to do that." There's a great story about how Michael ended up making the move from Bakersfield to Phoenix. Be sure to read it this week.

"People just love Bobby Kraig." That statement from Dan Halyburton, who was the GM at KPLX during its incredible run in the '80s, pretty much sums up the feelings Kraig has cultivated over the years. There may be

Lady Antebellum is new to the top 20 with "Love Don't Live Here" ranking No. 18, up from No. 26, and as the No. 19 passion song. Men are at No. 17, and females are at No. 20 with both 25-34s and 35-44s at No. 16.

The Eagles see a strong debut in this week's sample as "Busy Being Fabulous" debuts at No. 19 for the week and as the No. 23 passion song. Men are at No. 12 and also the early strength with core 35-44 males at No. 9. Female strength is with 25-34s at No. 19 and No. 17 passion in that cell.

a generation of pros in country who think of Bobby Kraig as a successful record executive, since he worked at Arista Nashville from 1993 until two years ago. But Kraig had a historical run in radio, and KPLX was one the country's most respected and influential country stations in America under his direction. Kraig started at a pirate radio station in Minnesota and soon graduated to WTHI/Terre Haute, Ind. for two

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tours of duty, the second time around as PD. From there, he made the leap to The Big D in 1981, and soon KPLX was a market leader. Kraig recruited future Country DJ Hall of Famer Terry Dorsey, his longtime friend, to do mornings at KPLX. In spite of Dorsey being lured across the street to work at rival KSCS in the late '80s, their friendship has endured. Commenting on his upcoming induction, Kraig told R&R, "I can't say how much this means to me: I never thought this would have happened." Part of the irony for Kraig is that former KPLX morning cohost Steve Harmon and MD Mac Daniels were the instigators for getting Kraig nominated, even though he says, "I know I threatened to fire both of them at one time or another, so I'm a little surprised."

#### Big Changes In Big D

It's still only February, and yet look at how the landscape has changed in the Dallas market this year. John Sebastian leaves the Cumulus KPLX (the Wolf) in January, and Cumulus VP of programming Jan Jeffries takes over; Victor Sansone makes a return to the market and KSCS as VP/GM. Now, PD/morning host Dingo announces a major airstaff shuffle at LKCM Radio Group's KFWR (The Ranch)/ Fort Worth. Dingo will stay on as PD/mornings and will be joined by Rebel, who moves from middays. Heywood sticks around as a morning "contributor." Tom Bigbee now starts his afternoon show two hours earlier and will be on the air 2-7 p.m. Kevin McCoy comes off mornings and will do nights on classic country clustermate KTFW, replacing the exiting Chuck Taylor. McCoy will also be handling production director duties, replacing Billy Thorman, who exits that role. That leaves a hole in middays, and maybe that's where you come in. 

#### **ON THE CHARTS**

#### **Coming On Strong**

One of country's heaviest hitters post solid debuts with new singles from former chart-topping albums. Rascal Flatts opens at No. 42 with "Every Day" (Lyric Street), the third track released from "Still Feels Good." "Take Me There" topped the list for three weeks in the fall, while "Winner at a Losing Game" spent four weeks at No. 2. The new song is the band's 29th chart hit, the most by a group this decade. At No. 48, Brad Paisley begins his quest for a seventh consecutive No. 1 with "I'm Still a Guy" (Arista Nashville). The cut is the fourth single from "5th Gear," following the No. 1s "Ticks," "Online" and "Letter to Me." On the Most Added tally, Paisley's "Letter" arrives at the top with 27 new stations, while Rascal Flatts comes in a close second with 25 adds for "Every Day."

On the upper portion of the list, Rodney Atkins sits for a second frame at No. 1 with "Cleaning This Gun (Come On In Boy)," while Capitol Nashville labelmates Chris Cagle and Trace Adkins enter the top 10 with "What Kinda Gone" (11-9) and "You're Gonna Miss This" (12-10), respectively. "Gone" is Cagle's fifth top 10 and first since 2003's "Chicks Dig It," while Adkins scores the lucky 13th top 10 of his career.

George Strait refuses to let go of the Most Increased Audience banner as "I Saw God Today" gains 3.8 million listener impressions on its way from 15-12. The title has been Most Increased in each of its three weeks on the chart. Breaker awards, meanwhile, go to "Busy Being Fabulous" by The Eagles (38-34) and "Home" by Blake Shelton (40-35).

The next day, it's WCRS, sponsored by BMI and featuring Casey Beathard, Eric Church, Dean Dillon and Jennifer Hanson starting at 4:10 p.m.

The rumors of their duet have been greatly exaggerated, according to a statement released last week by Faith Hill. While she and hubby Tim McGraw have talked a lot about it, no such project will take place in 2008 because, as Faith put it, "We're both working on our own projects."





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
