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### **DOJ Gives Thumbs Up To XM, Sirius Merger**

Determining that the proposal to combine satellite radio companies Sirius and XM was not anticompetitive, the Department of Justice's Antitrust Division today approved the \$5.7 billion all-stock merger. The next step is for the FCC to rule on the matter, but it seems unlikely to go against the DOJ's finding. The FCC could, however, impose conditions that could limit the benefits to the merger or quash it altogether.

The decision comes despite resistance from the NAB, which has beat the bushes wildly since President's Day weekend on Feb. 19, 2007, when the proposal was announced with a series of protests. The NAB has also secured the backing of several consumer groups — some known and some quite mysterious — who said they and their members could somehow be harmed by the merger. Reaction to the proposal was mixed on Capitol Hill, and the NAB was effective in generating a significant outcry from its usual political backers. How much input they have on the final outcome remains to be seen in the FCC's determination. A decision from that agency could arrive some time this week.

Responding to the DOJ's ruling, NAB executive VP Dennis Wharton said, "We are astonished that the Justice Department would propose granting a monopoly to two companies that systematically broke FCC rules for more than a decade. To hinge approval of this monopoly on XM and Sirius's refusal to deliver on a promise of interoperable radios is nothing short of breathtaking."

and a half or so, it's not what they signed on for either.

I got an e-mail the following morning from a PD, who asked to remain anonymous. It was not written on an emotional "he said-she-said" level, but rather, was a thoughtful and articulate characterization of life on the other side of the coin. This PD isn't even in Santiago's region, but offered some points which I thought only fair to share with you, since last week's Update content skewed more toward the label perspective. I'd love for you to read this and am hereby soliciting your reaction. "Your story about having more to do as PDs is clearly true. But how many conversations do I have to have about where a song is on a chart (I can read, and do) what the research is showing and how important the record is to a) the artist b) the label c) my boss d) my job e) the career ... before I stop listening to them.

"Many record reps are like the real estate agent who walks you into a house and tells you the kitchen is here, and this is the living room. There are exceptions. I had a call the other day from a rep who said, 'You've got to support me on this record.' Huh? And I want to return that call? I do talk to people I trust. To those who respect the time crunch we are under.

"I'm just a one-guy shop these days, the PD and MD. I get in each day at 7 a.m. I listen to my station at least 20 hours a week. I personally do every music log that my station airs. I personally touch every song we play; I look at every segue; I look at every imaging element. I leave the office at 6 p.m. or later most nights.

"Explain to me why reps think they deserve 10 minutes of my time and what they think they add to my ability and understanding of how I do my job or reach my audience. Understand, I'm not being critical. I am seeking to understand. It seems that many of these guys call with little or no plan other than to be able to mark me on a sheet."

### Trace Adkins Tops Indicator; Vassar Returns To Top 10

While he continues to get valuable face time on NBC's "Celebrity Apprentice," **Trace Adkins** hits No. 1 on the R&R Country Indicator chart in just 12 weeks. Up 264 plays, Adkins reigns with "You're Gonna Miss This" (Capitol Nashville), while the song rises 3-2 on the R&R Country chart. **Alan Jackson**'s "Small Town Southern Man" (Arista Nashville) stays seated for a second week atop that list.

**Phil Vassar** claims his eighth top 10 on the R&R Country chart with "Love Is a Beautiful Thing" (Universal South), which moves 13-10. Vassar first competed in that part of the chart when "Carlene" peaked at No. 5 in March 2000. He hasn't seen top 10 ink since "Last Day of My Life" peaked at No. 2 in June 2006. Concurrently, **Taylor Swift's** "Picture to Burn" (Big Machine) hops 11-8 and becomes her fourth straight top 10.

Carrie Underwood's "Last Name" (Arista/Arista Nashville) catches the Most Added bouquet on both charts, where she collects 42 adds on the R&R Country Indicator panel and 32 reports on the R&R Country panel. She also posts the biggest gain (up 671 spins) on the Indicator tally, while labelmate Brad Paisley hooks the Most Increased Audience (up 3.7 million impressions) on the R&R Country chart with "I'm Still a Guy" (19-13).

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

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


