Under The Influence

Tim Roberts' list of mentors is a who's who of the most influential people in the country music industry. Still, the ultimate "go to" person when the PD at CBS Radio's WYCD/Detroit is seeking much needed advice is none other than dear old Dad. "My dad has always been that guy, he was never in radio but was a huge fan; he was and still is a great teacher and my No. 1 mentor." For Clay Hunnicutt, who programs Clear Channel's WUBL (the Bull)/Atlanta and serves as the VP of country programming for CC, longtime mentor Marc Chase gets the call: "His ability to handle tough situations and develop solutions has been unmatched in my career."

In the most recent issue of **R&R** (May 23), every format column is focused on the art of mentoring. While talking with industry pros in both radio and records, I found so much passion and enthusiasm for this topic it was necessary to create a two-part series. In this week's (May 30) Part 2, we'll share ideas about how to make the transition for being mentored to mentoring others.

Talk to anyone who's had success in this nutty business, and they'll tell you it didn't happen without professional guidance. Somewhere, somebody recognized potential for greatness in all of us and took the time to nurture these previously invisible qualities, molding young bucks from yesteryear into the industry leaders of today. Just as Luke Skywalker had Obi-Wan Kenobi and then Yoda, so too did Alexander the Great have Aristotle, originally schooled by Plato, who was tutored by Socrates. Fast-forward to modern times, and Capitol Records' Jimmy Harnen can cite numerous reasons why Scott Borchetta and Mike Dungan influenced his career. Harnen heaps particular big praise on Dungan, calling the president of Capitol Nashville "the consummate record man who takes phenomenal care of the music, his artists and his staff. Whatever that 'it' factor is that all great leaders have, he's got it with a lot to spare. He continues to teach me so much about leadership, music and life every day."

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

Typically, the longer a person stays in a career, the more mentors they'll acquire over the years. Hunnicutt says his first-ever mentor was the first GM he worked for, Sammy George, at WUSY/Chattanooga, Tenn.: "He kept seeing things in me that I didn't think existed and kept allowing me to learn at jobs I had no experience and no business doing." Tom Baldrica lists Ken Van Durand as an early influence who convinced him to pursue the transition from radio to records, saying, "He was a guy I wanted to have access to, and he was nice enough to grant me that access. He, in turn, realized I may have something different to offer."

Now in well-established careers, with numerous professional credentials on their resumes, the panel we spoke to says becoming a mentor and recognizing tomorrow's leaders isn't just their responsibility. According to Hunnicutt, "It's our duty." After speaking with a number of people separately, the most common word used when discussing mentoring was "honesty." Tom Baldrica says whether it was seeking advice back in the day or now offering it, "I've always lived by the philosophy of 'tell me the truth.'" Hunnicutt offered up this advice for people who are currently seeking it: "Find someone you trust who will tell you the truth. That's the key to everything. Some people avoid conflict, but constructive conflict helps us all." WAMZ/Louisville PD Coyote Calhoun told R&R he's considers himself lucky that he never worked for someone who used fear as a tactic for success, commenting, "It seems that has ruined a lot of young talent." Time permitting, Tim Roberts attempts to help as many people as possible, even those he's never met, saying, "I aircheck people I really don't even know if they ask and try and give them some common sense advice to prepare them for the road ahead." Buck Owens' KUZZ/Bakersfield PD Evan Bridwell tells his young airstaff, "Listen for someone who speaks to them, appreciate how they do it, and then apply their own style."

This Week At Callout America

James Otto moves into the No. 1 slot this week with "Just Got Started Loving You," which is up from No. 2 for the last two weeks and ranks as the No. 5 passion song. Both male and female listeners are at No. 1, as are core 35-44 listeners.

Phil Vassar has the No. 1 passion song again with "Love Is a Beautiful Thing," which, overall, is the No. 2 song. Females are at No. 2 positive and passion, while men are at No. 3 and No. 2 passion.

Rascal Flatts kicks in big with "Every Day" ranking at No. 5 overall, up from No. 15 last week, and as the No. 2 passion song. Females are the drivers, ranking the song at No. 3, up from No. 12, and as the No. 1 female passion song. Males are at No. 9 and No. 5 passion.

Montgomery Gentry are new to the top 10 this week with "Back When I Knew It All" ranking at No. 10, up from No. 14, and as the No. 15 passion song. Men are driving this song, ranking it at No. 6 with softer passion at No. 17. Females are at No. 16 both positive and passion.

Josh Turner continues to be well ahead of the radio spin chart with radio listeners as "Another Try" is at No. 13 for the week. Females rank the song at No. 14, with males at No. 15. Core 35-44s are the strength at No. 9.

Toby Keith is putting up some smokin' passion scores with "She's a Hottie" ranking as the No. 7 passion song this week. Younger 25-34 listeners are at No. 4 passion with younger males at No. 1.

At the rate he's going, Lamb will soon be alpha sheep at the label after his newly announced promotion to director of West Coast regional promotion. Lamb will continue to be based out of Phoenix, the same city where he worked in radio at CBS Radio's KMLE. Lamb is a native of Scottsdale, but attended Belmont University in Nashville. In a statement, Lyric Street VP of promotion Kevin Herring called Lamb "a great promotion guy and a valuable member of our team."

After the April 9 exit of Mercury Southwest rep Stacie Clark, inquiring minds wondered: Who will get the gig? As it turns out, it was someone already working the territory: Allen Mitchell of Universal South Records was the choice, but the rest of the world had to wait until May 22 to find out. That's because Uni-South was busy working to fill Mitchell's post by extricating Karen McGuire from Curb Records, where she'd been entrenched for the last 15 years. The next installment in this gripping drama is who will replace McGuire at Curb? She'll take some time off before reporting for duty to Uni-South Veep Teddi Bonadies. Mitchell, meanwhile, will officially swear his allegiance to Sugarland and all things Mercury as of June 2, reporting to Damon Moberly.

ON THE CHARTS

Sugarland's Big Arrival; Paisley Still Feels Manly Atop Charts

The duo's rousing debut of "All I Want to Do" (Mercury) on the May 18 Academy of Country Music (ACM) Awards helps **Sugarland** log a career-high bow on the R&R Country chart, where it pops on at No. 27. The duo's previous best was a No. 36 start with "Want To" on the chart dated Aug. 4, 2006. That song became Sugarland's first chart-topper, spending two weeks at the summit in December that year. The new song collects 6.5 million impressions at 77 of the 108 stations monitored by Nielsen BDS for the chart and finishes the tracking week with the chart's biggest gain (up 6.5 million). It is the lead single

from the duo's third album, "Love on the Inside," which arrives at retail on July 22. Sugarland won trophies for Single of the Year and Song of the Year for "Stay" at the ACM telecast, which repeats starting June 4 exclusively on Great American Country (GAC).

The duo repeats the high debut feat this week on the R&R Country Indicator chart, where "Do" enters at No. 31 (987 plays at 60 reporting stations). Between the two chart panels, the new single collects 83 adds and gets the Most Added spoils on both lists. The R&R Country panel edges its Indicator counterpart 42-41 in the adds column. Also noteworthy is an add tally of 69 for **Taylor Swift**'s "Should've Said No" (Big Machine). The Indicator stations step up with 36 reports, while the R&R Country panel brings 33 new commitments to Swift's party

Brad Paisley continues to ride the No. 1 wave on both charts, where "I'm Still a Guy" (Arista Nashville) spends a third week atop the Indicator scorecard. The song dominates the R&R Country list, where it logs a second week at No. 1.

On the Indicator Exclusives list, Trent Willmon's "Broken In" (Compadre/Music World/Quarterback) lengthens its stride as the highest-ranking exclusive title at No. 48, followed by Rick Huckaby's "I Got You Covered" (HeadCoach), which advances 54-51. Mark Chesnutt's "When You Love Her Like Crazy" (Lofton Creek) posts a 53-52 surge, while Jeff Bates' "Don't Hate Me for Lovin' You" (Black River) dips 52-56. Carter's Chord opens at No. 60 with "Different Breed" (Show Dog Nashville). Take a look at the complete menu of R&R Country Indicator Highlights in this week's R&R print edition (dated May 30).

Speaking of the CMA Music Fest, the stars from ABC-TV's daytime dramas "General Hospital," "One Life to Live" and "All My Children" will be in town on June 5-8 to host stages, participate in a celebrity sports challenge and intro artists at LP Field.



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
