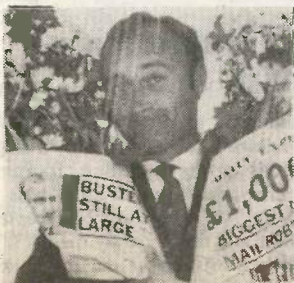

HMV opens new store in Calgary shopping centre

HMV, Canada's newest music store chain, has opened a new 4,000 square foot store in Calgary's Southcentre Shopping Centre. The new store is a refurbished and expanded version of the previous Mister Sound Music Store at the same location and is the 39th store in the national music store chain and the fourth HMV store in Calgary.

Warren Hardy, who joined Mister Sound in 1987 as a store manager, takes over as store manager of the new location. Grant Linneberg, who joined Mister Sound in 1986, takes on the duties of assistant store manager. The overall responsibilities for all HMV stores in the Western Region will be those of Werner Wiens in the position of Regional Manager.

A feature of the new store is its own in-store audio recording facility, which caters to artists and to customers. Prices for use of the recording studio begin at \$11.99.

Attic lowers prices on selected CD catalogue

Lindsay Gillespie, Vice President Sales & Marketing for Attic Records, advises that, as of October 31st, the wholesale price for all Attic front line CD product was reduced 12 percent. With this price decrease, all Attic compact discs uniformly carry a suggested list price of under \$20.00.

"Almost every label has some sort of discount program for CD," Gillespie points out, "but I feel the best way to effect a lower retail price is to start with a lower wholesale price" concluding with "Now, all of our CD product fits into A&M's price code 'R', which to me stands for reasonable. For some time now our new releases have been priced accordingly . . . now all titles are the same."

No Blame world premiere to support Casey House

The world premiere of No Blame, a film based on a story written by Donald Martin, will have its world screening at the Jane Mallet Theatre in Toronto's St. Lawrence Centre For The Arts on Sunday November 27. The film was directed by Daniele J. Suissa and stars Helen Shaver (expected to be in attendance), Stephen Macht and Marie Christine Barrault and features Jan Rubes. Martin and Suissa also wrote the screenplay, with the latter and Nicole Godin taking producer credits.

The world premiere will be a fundraising gala for Casey House Hospice, a free-standing hospital affiliated hospice for people with AIDS. As well-known writer June Callwood points out, "For as long as the AIDS crisis exists, Casey House will provide palliative care for those affected, after which the hospice will provide care for those with other terminal illnesses," continuing with "The hospice focuses on maintaining the dignity and quality of life . . . AIDS is not going to go away, at least not for a long time."

The black tie premiere of No Blame will be hosted by Al Waxman. General tickets are \$50.00 per person, which includes both the screening and the reception to follow. Special patron tickets are available at \$250.00 per person, which includes an exclusive pre-screening reception, a special listing in the souvenir programme, and the screening, followed by a dessert buffet and libations, hosted by Casey House.

Toronto label faces obscenity charge

Fringe Product, a Toronto-based independent label associated with Record Peddler, a Toronto record retail store, faces charges of unlawful possession and distribution of obscene material. The charges, reportedly a first for Canada, were laid by Nepean Police (Nepean is a suburb of Ottawa).

The charges apparently stemmed from a complaint that led to police seizing copies of Feed Us A Fetus and Here Today Guano Tomorrow by DayGlo Abortions, a B.C. band.

Maclean Hunter bids for Selkirk chain

Maclean Hunter has reportedly offered \$540 million for Selkirk Communications, a large communications group boasting fourteen radio and three television stations, plus a cable operation. The offer must be accepted by shareholders and approved by the CRTC.

Maclean is also a sizeable communications group with fifteen radio stations, cable operations in both Canada and the U.S., plus interests in magazines and newspapers.

Distribution of Satanic material needs examining

The music industry and all its associated industries rely exclusively on the integrity of the artists that are signed, recorded and promoted each year. This relationship though is obviously symbiotic as artists also depend on the marketing and distribution system already entrenched and at their disposal. Virtually powerless without the other, the intention of both sides of this established equation is implicitly understood: that no artist or band of artists can exist if no market can be found for their particular product. An economics principle, supply and demand, lies at the root of the music industry and unfortunately integrity takes a back seat to the driving force behind the business all too often.

Many of the music industry's positive undertakings, its foundations and on-going causes, were last month quickly undermined by Geraldo Rivera during his show on Satanism. Seemingly a popular topic for many bands of the heavy metal genre, a large North American television audience watched as heavy metal music was given as a reason for acts of human torture, mutilation and sacrifice by convicted murderers. Artists, existing within the framework of the music industry, are apparently helping to spread the word of the Satanic bible across North America to such an extent that Rivera considers the problem an epidemic. Given an expanding market, (yes, the popularity of even heavier heavy metal is growing), the small percentage of Satan lovers among artists are about to enjoy the benefits of an increased

Five new radio programs receive FACTOR funding

Metal Shine (Pilot) - an open-line talk show featuring the music of and interviews with Canadian and international metal music artists, produced by Creatively Produced Concerts Network (Manitoba);

Canadian Consumer (Series) - the radio edition of the monthly magazine Canadian Consumer, providing guidance to listeners on products and services, financial advice, safety, energy tips, etc., produced by Quasarts Productions (Ontario); and

The People Report (Pilot) - which encourages listeners to tell about people they know who they feel have made a positive difference in their family, community or workplace and deserve to be recognized as a Canadian of The Day, produced by The Robinson Connection (Ontario).

audience purely by chance.

An artist's chances of being either heard or seen and appreciated diminish or grow over time in equal proportion to the perceived or real size of his market. Hence, rebellious as they are, artists have historically been able to say what they wish without the risk of prosecution, and thus remain popular with their fans. However fans, the consumer, are a whimsical lot, ardent followers of fashion, with few exceptions. Today, relatively, there are not a lot of Satan worshippers, especially those who adhere strictly to its guiding religious values, yet there are many who speak of the devil and his home, a place called hell. Although it is these few that are providing a product for this growing market, they are taking advantage of an industry which displays a strange ambivalence towards these artists.

Rivera keenly demonstrated just how seriously certain fans take their music these days; to the point of killing parents and friends alike. Whether there are benefits for a heavy metal band to profess publicly an allegiance to Satan or not, they are sensationalizing an extremely contentious issue. If they are not sensationalizing and are sincere in their beliefs, then perhaps a previously unquestioned boundary has indeed been crossed. Music alone is neither the cause nor an excuse for deviant behaviour, though blatant calls for violence and aggression should be examined more closely by the industry. From the producers to the distributors and the individual retailers, all must take a more active role in the selection of music made available to the consumer.

Heavy metal records account for a large part of any label's annual billing; the market is unique and important, and for some labels this musical genre is simply their bread and butter. Within this group, as with anything, there is a fringe element whose thirst for the

MCA uses Halloween to test market single

MCA came up with a unique test marketing angle for a new single. Children who were lucky enough to visit the house of a Toronto MCA employee, this past Halloween evening, received, instead of the usual run-of-the-mill sugared goodies, a copy of a single titled Dial My Heart by The Boys.

Says MCA's Dave Watt, "The song is an up-tempo dancable tune that we believe will initially appeal to the younger crowd who are too old for Raffi but too young for Tiffany." continuing with "The problem is, how does a company make contact with this first phase target market? Halloween provided the answer."

The Boys comprise four young black brothers ranging in age from 9 to 14 years. Included with the single was a questionnaire card asking questions such as age, address, opinion of the song, and if they would play it for their friends. If the card is mailed back to MCA, a cassette of the complete album will be mailed back to the child, free of charge. "The promotion provided direct access to the target market," says Watt, "as well as having the benefit of the kids coming to MCA.

extreme never seems to be quenched. An element never quite satisfied, they congregate under a banner of violence and hatred, wanton destruction and ultimately death; an element so vile, where perversions and distaste are the norm, should not be taken so lightly. And yet the music industry seems content to foster and maintain its growth throughout the forthcoming decade, even though the Satanic messages contained in certain lyrics are detrimental to the industry and are tainting its image with each passing day.

There have been many charted hits over the years which have in fact featured the devil throughout the song: Devil In Disguise, The Devil Went Down To Georgia, Devil With A Blue Dress, Devil Woman and the most recent example, Devil Inside. But these are harmless metaphors compared with the Satanic tales of morbid bloodlust and human dissection found within the lyrics of Celtic Frost, King Diamond, Slayer and Venom, to name a few now well beyond the point of entertaining or absurdly horrifying for effect. These groups and their messages represent a real danger to those few and potentially to a lot more in the future. Because of their microscopic sales, many in the music industry choose not to believe that this Satan-laced heavy metal music poses any problem or that it is any concern at all. Naturally, it is simply incomprehensible to assume that a record label would ban the sale of the next Ozzy Osborne album, for example, no matter how many times Satan was mentioned; nor would any retailer deny it front rack space.

Now that Rivera has brought the problem into the open and directly to the attention of the public, the repercussions can only be a matter of time. It is a problem with no easy solution, but the music industry must bear the responsibility of governing itself and counting on the integrity of its artists to produce art worthy of the label that chooses to distribute it. Unfortunately, there are artists who are now taking advantage of a system that is more idealistic in nature, certainly one that does not propagate this degree of violence or such blatant and irresponsible acts of inhuman ferocity. These artists are plundering the system and the time to act is now. But not by having the government declaring an outright ban or censoring to any degree heavy metal music, or any music for that matter.

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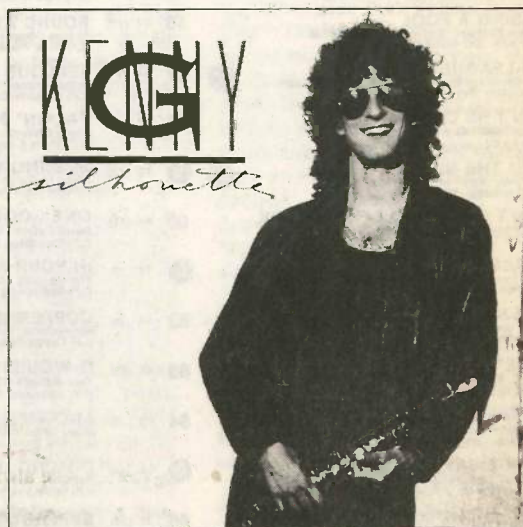

COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce**Clean and sober typifies Little Feat these days**

For many, many years Little Feat ran the Southern music gamut, consistently called all the roots-oriented rock 'n' roll and country-blues names in the book, but now, it would seem, that these favourite pigeon holes, as well as the band, are popular once again. There has been an incredible resurgence within the past two years of quite a variety of "roots" music, hence the release of *Let It Roll* is rather uncanny, yet in spite of all the new competition the band is proving to be just as celebrated as it was nearly a decade ago.

Soon after frontman and guitarist Lowell George died in the summer of 1979, both Paul Barrere and Bill Payne called it quits, vowing in turn never to play together anymore. Well, times change and so do people. Thankfully, for their fans and admirers, they are on the road, together again "to have some fun and kick some butts," says Barrere. Their return to the stage this time around was well planned and organized, and more importantly, he adds, though older and wiser, they're "a whole lot healthier."

Says Barrere, "I turned forty this year and I actually feel younger than I did when I was thirty when I was carrying on like a madman," continuing with "I'm amazed at the amount of problems I caused for myself from doing that stuff. My life now is practically problem free. You have to deal with life's problems on life's terms, rather than building

them into these huge problems. I'm clean and sober now and the more the world knows about it, that's fine with me."

Obviously, a life of recording and touring can take its toll, and it certainly has, but the comeback trail has been sweet indeed. Whether due to the advent of "classic" radio or simply older brothers and sisters handing down records to their younger siblings, Little Feat's latest tour has attracted a diverse crowd to say the least. Happy, though not totally surprised, Barrere remarks they knew the potential was always there anyway.

"All of us had been out on the road with different bands and everytime your name is introduced somebody inevitably in the audience would start yelling 'Feat, Feat, Feat', so we knew that the band had not been totally forgotten. But not only from the reaction of the fans, but by the mere fact that all the old albums continue to sell. We knew there was still a hardcore of fans out there, we just needed to hook into some younger people and that's basically been the fantastic part of this whole process . . . looking out from the stage and seeing nineteen or twenty year old kids, who had to be 10 or 11 when the band split up, and they're singing along with us."

What brought the band back together was more a series of circumstances, getting together and occasionally jamming as friends, rather than the usual big reunion gig. Barrere recalls there was no real pressure exerted from anybody except former band members to try it one more time. In 1985, the five surviving Little Feat members decided to forego their new careers and give the music industry and their fans another fresh taste of their original styles of Southern blended rock 'n' roll. In order to maintain that down home groove they re-recruited famed producer George Massenberg, "to make sure it got done right," he explains.

"Just to put the band back together and go on the road was not the idea at all. The thought came down that if we were to do this at all we would have to re-form the band, make a new album, have that album become

successful and then all the pieces would fit together. We knew that we would have to answer questions about it. I mean . . . there's going to be some people who feel it wouldn't be worthwhile without Lowell, but the overall feeling was that it felt good. 'Let's give it a shot.' We felt that we had just as good a chance as anybody of putting this thing over the top.

"But nowadays when you go in to record you have to have someone who'll not only get the best performance out of you but they're also going to record it in the best possible way. Little Feat," he concludes, "used to really fall apart in the studio, going way over-time and way over budget. This time, we didn't want to waste any time, money or effort. That's where George (Massenberg) is so valuable . . . he helped us prepare really well, and the sound of the record is a lot crisper and cleaner than records of old."

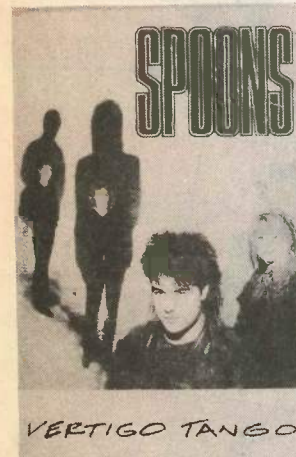

MICHELLE SHOCKED - Pop
Short Sharp Shocked
Mercury - 834 924-1-Q

When a performer relies as heavily as Michelle Shocked does on the earliest roots of such time-proven styles as folk, country and blues, and still manages to produce an album as fresh and up-to-date as this, it is an accomplishment worthy of special note. Shocked infuses the form of the traditional ballad with social conscience and humour in a fashion that demands a favorable comparison to the early work of Bob Dylan. The first single, Anchorage, did not create much of a stir at radio, seemingly having been selected more to cash in on the success of Tracy Chapman than to showcase, on their own merits, Shocked's own strong songwriting and expressive vocals. If Love Was A Train, the second offering, is more representative of the album as a whole and has already made a dent at AOR with its subdued bluesy drive. Truly a remarkable package, Short Sharp Shocked could well place this talented artist even higher among the ranks of the singer/songwriter.



THE SPOONS - Pop
Vertigo Tango
Anthem - A1-1054-F

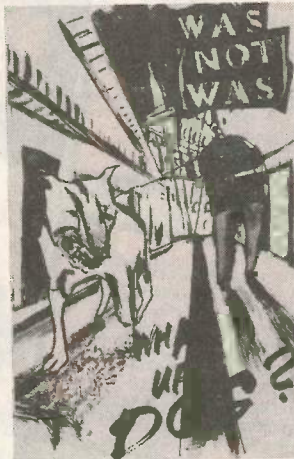
After the dismal sales figures of Bridges Over Borders, the Spoons have come full circle, returning to the studio with the man who guided their most successful LP, producer John Punter. Although Aria's & Symphonies was the band's best seller, their latest effort contains some of their finest work. Lyricist Gordon Deppe again tackles the overall theme of time (especially the past), giving the whole album a certain reminiscent, reflective quality. Examples are the single, When Time Turns Around and I've Been Here Before, an exploration of the occur-

rences of Deja Vu. Musically, Vertigo Tango features all the elements one would expect from this band, strong lead vocals blended with Sandy Horne's whispery background harmonies, solid rhythm section, and tasteful guitar licks. It's good to hear at least one guitarist who realizes that it's sometimes what you leave out that really counts. Radio programmers should pay special attention to Waterline which ebbs and flows like a gentle tide, and could be the surprise hit from the band's latest, and possibly most accessible record to date.



JUDSON SPENCE - Pop
Judson Spence - Atlantic - 78-19021-P

This new kid on the block seems to have his funky little finger firmly planted on the pulse of the current pop scene. While two thirds of the album is straight-out funk ala Prince, the first single, Yeah, Yeah, Yeah, injects a strong dose of gospel soul, creating an infectious good-time mood that is reinforced by tracks like If You Don't Like it, Attitude and Hot & Sweaty. In addition, to strong ballads, Love Dies In Slow Motion and Forever Me, Forever You, provide an effective counterweight to the upbeat songs.



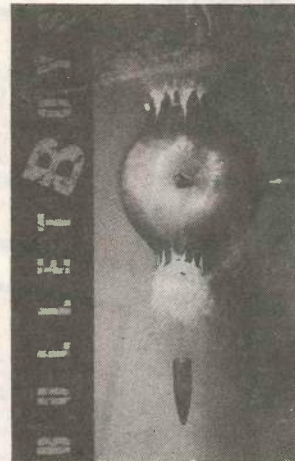
WAS (NOT WAS) - Pop
What Up Dog?
Fontana - 834 291-1-Q

The newest release from the Was Brothers (not brothers) and company is (not is) a fairly accessible blend of soul, funk and jazz and contains a few tracks that should be welcomed wholeheartedly by the dance club crowd: Boy's Gone Crazy, Walk The Dinosaur and the single, Spy In The House Of Love, which is already making a respectable showing at radio. The lyrics often stray as far from the mainstream as beat poetics, an influence also clear musically. Secondary selections key for AOR, in addition to campus and alternative, are Anytime Lisa and Shadow And Jimmy, co-written by Elvis Costello.



ETTA JAMES - Soul/R&B
Seven Year Itch
Island - ISL-1210-J

Unsurprisingly, Etta James once again delivers some rock-solid performances. A good balance is provided between hard-driving blues rockers and soulful ballads, and every track stands well on its own. Worthy of particular praise are Breakin' Up Somebody's Home and It Ain't Always What You Do, R&B songs that order the toe to tap. James proves she still has what it takes to please after almost thirty years of recording.



BULLETBOYS - Rock
Bulletboys
Warner Bros - 92-57821-P

When one reads Ted Templeman's name on an album sleeve with a production credit, one can expect to be struck by a rock that crunches like a .38 slug through a truck windshield, enter Bulletboys, this year's answer to Whitesnake, who were David Coverdale's answer to Led Zeppelin. But Robert Plant never wanted, nor indeed expected, so many answers so often. That is not to say that Bulletboys don't have something of note to offer. They do. Namely, vocals by Marc Torien, which at times sound like David Lee Roth circa 1978, but more often like the late Bon Scott of AC/DC. Guitarist Mick Sweda has been kicking around the Los Angeles hard rock and its die-hard audience long enough to know what sells and what smells, and that's why there's nothing resembling a ballad on this disc. F9 slows the pace a tad, and while it's a tasteful song (and chord for that matter), one wonders if that particular odd triad appears very often in such a straight ahead rock album. Nonetheless, a rock solid debut.

TRANSVISION VAMP - Pop
Pop Art - Uni - UNI-5-J

At best, Transvision Vamp is guitar-oriented bubble-gum pop. At worst, the music is mindless, which is never a fatal flaw. The vocals of lead singer Wendy James are reminiscent of, but

not as strong as, the girls from the B-52's. The first single, Tell That Girl To Shut Up, is by far the song with the best potential for CHR success, but is too blatantly commercial for AOR which should take a look at the rougher-edged Psychosonic Cindy, if it wants to look at all.

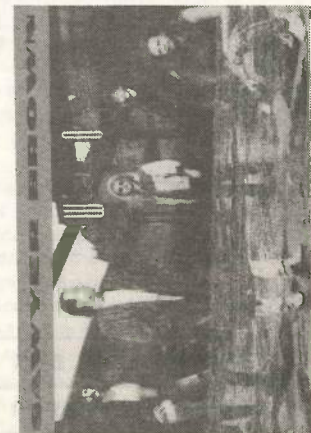


THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS - Pop
Love Junk
Chrysalis - CHS-41675-J

With the ballsy Canadian guitars that Canadian bands favour, lead and backing vocals dripping with character, and strong material from lead TPOH Moe Berg, Love Junk is a really good effort, although the generally unchanging beat eventually tests one's patience. Hard To Laugh is doing well as the first single (a new version of I'm An Adult Now is being worked in that other country) and AOR will be able to dig a few tracks deep before striking bedrock. Key are Killed By Love, Ten Fingers and She's Too Young. Produced by Todd Rundgren.

Barbara Mandrell - Country
I'll Be Your Jukebox Tonight
Capitol - C4-90416-F

While more and more country acts are moving toward contemporary, it's nice to have a powerful spokesperson like Barbara Mandrell show what traditional country can really do. She is currently charting with I Wish That I Could Fall In Love Today, which was co-produced by Fred Foster and Tom Collins. The latter produced all the other tracks, key of which are Blanket Of Love, I Dropped Your Name and Mirror Mirror.



SAWYER BROWN - Country
Wide Open - Capitol - C4-90417-F

Sawyer Brown has been one of the pet projects of Capitol Nashville and, with this set, he should begin to pay off. He's already showing good chart numbers across Canada with My Baby's Gone, taken from this album, and there are more than a few singles left, including Running Out Of Seasons To Run, It Wasn't His Child and Old Pair Of Shoes. Produced by Ron Chancey.

Programmer nod to Murray McLauchlan

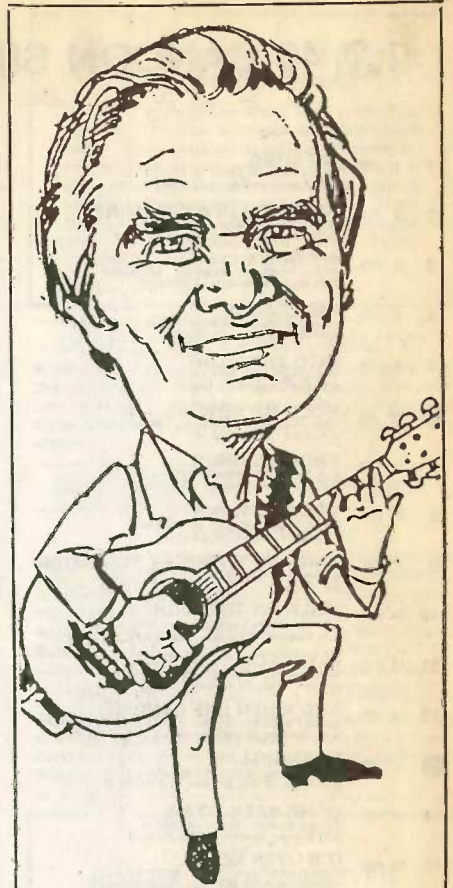

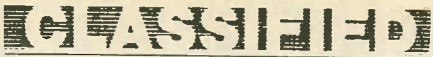

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
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
