


Many Fired At Cap Branch

Fach Upped to Mercury Dir. of Disk Product

Dennis Smash| Føntana Chief

CHICAGO-Charles Fach has been named to the new corporate post of Director of Recorded Product for Mercury Record Corporation. In announcing the appointment, Irving B. Green, Mercury President, emphasized that the parent label and its affiliates, Philips, Smash and Fontana, are giving greater emphasis to the creation and development of new recorded product and the continuing major efforts required to present the proven talent in new single and album releases.

Succeeding Fach as Product Manager of Smash/Fontana will be Lou Dennis.

Green cited Fach's five-year talent development record with Smash/Fontana labels. Fach, he pointed out, took the two labels from embryo and made them an over-\$6,000,000 cumulative entity within Mercury's corporate empire.

"Since the first Fontana and Smash releases, Charles Fach has stressed the need for providing the strongest possible product for both labels," Green added. "Proof of the success of the Fach formula has been the consistent charting of artists on both labels such as Roger Miller, the Walker Brothers, the Mindbenders, Charlie Rich, Gloria Lynne, Jerry Lee Lewis and the establishment of James Brown as an instrumental bestseller."

Fach, who was a VP and Product Manager of both labels, has been elevated to Vice-President in the parent corporation, Green stated. He will continue to headquarter in Chicago, but will also maintain an office in Mercury's New York executive office. Present plans call for Fach to travel extensively, working with Vice-President of A&R Shelby Singleton and his New York staff, including Hal Mooney and Luchi De Jesus; Doug Moody, chief of the Hollywood office, and his assistant, Frank Leffel; Jerry Kennedy, Nashville director. and his aide, Roy Dea; and Lou Reizner, Chicago-based import coordinator.

In addition to working out the possible release of Jones' background film music on Mercury, Fach will discuss the recording activity of jazz artists on the Limelight label with Jones, an acknowledged arranger and conductor in the jazz field. A full-time Limelight recording director is being sought by Fach.

In addition, Fach will travel extensively in England and on The Continent.

All artist and repertoire activity will flow through Fach's office, with Fach reporting directly to Green. Fach stated that he intends the heaviest possible zeroing-in on new teenoriented product. In an additional beefing-up of talent procurement and promotion of the r&b department, Fach is searching for veteran manpower to amplify the corporation's position in this growing area.

In making the Dennis appointment, Green acknowledged Dennis' hefty contribution to Fontana, which he served as National Sales and Promotional Manager since 1964. Fach will oversee the joint label leadership temporarily while Dennis breaks in his managerial reins, Green stated.

Jerry Myers, presently performing both sales and promotional functions for Merrec Distributors, Cleveland, in the Buffalo area, replaces Alan Mink as Smash Promotional Director. Mink has moved into the Mercury National Promotion Director's slot.





Weiss Ends Monument Tour

Bobby Weiss, Vice President and Director of the International Division of Monument Records, has just planed back to the USA after a nine-week tour of Europe and England visiting the Monument licensees abroad plus meeting with other record companies, music publishers, indie record producers as well as motion picture producers on the Continent.

Weiss flew to Nashville immediately for meetings with Monument President Fred Foster to review all matters concerning the results of the European trek. Foster and Weiss were together in London at the start of the tour for one week last Feb. 21, when they conferred with Sir Edward Lewis of Decca-England about the current world-wide licensing agreement Decca has with Monument and which expires in October. Foster presented Monument artists Boots Randolph and Ray Stevens to the British press, radio and TV

audiences and returned with them to the USA while Weiss continued on his swing to Oslo, Stockholm, Copenhagen, Zurich, Berlin, Hamburg, Brussels, Paris, Milan, etc.

Now Foster and Weiss will review, country-by-country, the record situation as it applies to the Monument, Sound Stage 7 and LTD International record catalogues taking into consideration the appeal of Americanproduct at this time overseas, new marketing plans, etc. Weiss noted that a special campaign was made, not only in Europe, but globally by Monument distribs in behalf of the Boots Randolph instrumental version of "These Boots Are Made for Walking" as it offered no language barrier problem and said that in Sweden, S. Eriksson's Electra company set an all-time rush-release pattern by issuing the Randolph "Boots" single 24 hours after having received the sample from Monument.

RCA A&R Post For R. Cullen

Robert Cullen has been appointed to the post of a Producer, Pop A & R, by RCA Victor Records. The appointment, effective immediately, was announced by Ben Rosner, Manager, Popular Artists and Repertoire. He found many Puerto Ricans and Mexicans living there-potential consumers of the Spanish/Latin American product. Ron Schaeffer of Midwest Ltd., who will distribute the two lines there, is eagerly awaiting delivery. Also, Michigan and Illinois have become tremendous markets

for the Spanish line due to the thousands of Latin people living in the great cities of Detroit and Chicago.

Now visiting the U.S.A. is Jose Luis Salazar of Distribuidora Peruana Sudamericana, of Lima, Peru. Salazar has bought the machinery from Finebuilt in California and is ready to start construction of his own pressing plant. During his visit to New York, he will present Shawn Elliott with the Gold Microphone awarded him in Lima for the success there of "Shame And Scandal in The Family," Roulette's big hit the world over.

Visiting the United States is Nestor N. Selasco of Sicamericana, Sacifi, of Buenos Aires, Argentina. Selasco has been very successful with his label Music Hall in Argentina and is traveling to Europe and the Far East to expand business in these territories.

Alberto Martinez, who, based in Buenos Aires, used to be Peer International's representative for Latin America, has moved to Madrid, Spain, where he now heads a new publishing organization and will soon open an office there.

All Latin Americans are grieved over the recent death of one of their most popular singers. Javier Solis died in Mexico last week of complications resulting from an operation. Solis was one of the best singers in the Columbia catalog and very popular in Mexico and around the Latin world.

Latin American Licensing Corporation, a newly organized corporation, has started the year with a big bang; they have already acquired the catalogs of five small Latin labels in New York for representation overseas and have licensed three of their LPs in Mexico, Peru and Venezuela. In addition, Normand Kurtz has announced that they are also representing Ember Records of England and the Co and Ce labels of Pittsburgh, Pa., and that some of the product will soon be pressed by their Latin American licensees.

Rene Morety of Remo Records is back working after recovering from an operation performed on his right ear. Rene is exclusive distributor of the Musart and Discuba labels and is a well-liked fellow in the Spanish record industry in New York.

Montilla Records (purchased by the Garcia Brothers) has been gaining markets continuously. Here in the U.S.A. and abroad, the label has been very active. An LP most recently recorded in Peru with Raul Marrero containing the song "Rondando Tu Esquina" has been one of the top best sellers for the last five weeks. Jóse Chao, Montilla's General Manager, is continuously traveling in the States, setting up distribution for the label, as well as other labels they represent exclusively in the U.S.A.

Columbus Records, one of the oldest one-stops in the Spanish market in New York has moved to East 116th Street, consolidating operations at their other store, Anasco Records. Abelardo Gonzalez, Columbus' President, has been reactivating the entire label and has given over his entire catalog for foreign representation to Latin American Licensees.



Carl gives the same reason for both records being smashes -"They are driving sounds that never let up for one single instant." I respect young Carl's ear very much, and we have a skull conference in his studio every Saturday early morn-ing from 1 to 3 a.m. Teddy and South Moun-



tain Music have another strong release with the Royalettes on MGM, "It's A Big Mis-take." Automatic Hits: "Arrest Me," Jamo Thomas; and, "Good Time Charlie," Bobby Bland.

The last note I got from Jerry Wexler tipped me on the Percy Sledge which is go-ing #1 pop nationally. His latest is about "Neighbor, Neighbor," Jimmy (Steal"

Away") Hughes, Fame, from the same Rick Hall studio that gave us Percy. It reminds me of "Mother-In-Law." Henry Allen and many record people are telling me about the fantastic job being done on WAVZ, New Haven. by Tracy Garneau in breaking R&B records. Congrats Tracy, you are the new Allan Freed, and we really need you . . . I am thrilled at the way "Good Lovin'," Young Rascals, broke R&B without any push from Atlantic. Now I can remind you that the song was out originally by the Olympics and was a mild R&B hit. It was produced by Jerry (Garnet Mimms, Enchanters) Ragavoy. It is now an R&B smash in Baltimore, Washington, Philadelphia, N.Y., Detroit, Cleve-land, etc. The Ben E. King has broken R&B nationally.... "Cool Jerk," Capitols, went on WMCA, and is No. 1 pop in Philadelphia and in Detroit thanx to TV of the great dance the teen-agers have worked out to do to the record.

Ernie Durham in Detroit reports action on: Enchanters; Don Bryant; Maxine Brown; Carla Thomas.

"Let Me Be Good To You," Carla Thomas, is #1 in Memphis and should go big in many other markets. There are many picks on "Sugar, Sugar," Mad Lads. The "B" side of the Mar-Keys, "Honey Pot," has busted in many markets, just as Al Jefferson, WWIN, Baltimore, predicted it would long ago. Jim Stewart is getting good reaction on Al King's "Laundromat Blues." Speaking of Memphis, Bill Terrell of WDIA tells me that Stevie Wonder's "Purple Raindrops" is #1. . It now appears that "Good To Me" may be one side of the new Otis Redding because of the big action out of the LP.

The big news in the R&B world is that Burke Johnson has left WAOK, Atlanta. He was there eight years, and is not only loved by everyone in Atlanta, but Burke is loved by everyone in the radio and record world. He plans to remain in Atlanta radio. Shelly "The Playboy" Stewart replaced him, and WAOK plans to continue programming eight hours of gospel daily. Jimmy Whittington and Paul "Raggedy" Flagg at WIGO plan to continue rocking 24 hours around the clock. Any more questions, doctor?

The biggest record in the R&B world is the James Brown. It is a giant #1 in Detroit. Jimmy Bishop points out that the "B" side, "Is It Yes, Or Is It No" is also a smash They sent out two-sided deejays like Tamla does . . . Edwin Starr has another big one, as the Holidays and the Steve Mancha continue to sell . . . Everyone says that "Love Me," Billy Stewart, Chess, has to be a smash . . . Lots of picks on the Contours . . . Jr. Walker hit No. 1 in Cleveland and is doing very well nationally . . . "Gonna Be Strong," Intruders, is now a giant in Baltimore and is big in San Francisco . . . "God Bless the Girl," Enchanters, Loma, broke in Miami, (Continued on page 21)

"I Call Your Name" jumped out of the Mamas and Papas LP to become the biggest request song in the nation.

Atlantic Records now has two No. 1 records in a row-Young Rascals and Percy Sledge. With the Shadows of Knight, they have three Top 5 records at the same time. There is now no doubt that Joe Tex' "Letter Song" will give them four rec-ords in the Top 5. Meanwhile, "Cool Jerk," Capitols, is No. 1 pop in Detroit and Philadelphia and just went on WMCA, N.Y. with the Joe Tex. The new Deon Jackson looks good, and the Sam & Dave has gone all the way R&B.

Columbia is Top 10 with Paul Revere; Bob Dylan; and the Byrds, while their cousins at Epic have the D.C.5 and The Yardbirds . . . Warner-Brothers-Reprise have Nancy Sinatra and Pet Clark. Peter, Paul & Mary looks very strong ... Columbia and Reprise have strong prospects with the Simon & Garfunkel and the Trini Lopez, respectively. I like the Beau Brummels who have a good Dylan tune. 






There is no doubt that this will be Ray's biggest seller todate. Ray's first album for Cadet is an excellent example of the gutsy, two-handed brand of piano playing that has made Ray a popular favorite. There's not a weak track in the album.

TCB's Cuts: "Gotta Travel On"—"It Was A Very Good Year."

MAN AT WORK—Kenny Burrell—Cadet 769.

Kenny has firmly secured a position in the ranks of firstrate jazz guitarists. Kenny, **Richard Davis and Roy Haynes** play sparkling jazz and the results are contained in this superb album.

TCB's cuts: "Will You Still Be Mine"—"Soft Winds."

THE WEARY TRAVELER-King Fleming-Cadet 4053.

King Fleming, long a regional favorite in the mid-west, leads a tightly knit piano trio that works in many of the area's best lounges and supperclubs. Fleming's piano playing is deft, swinging and basic enough so that one needn't be a hard-core jazz buff to appreciate his offerings.

THE KNACK — The Interpreters—Cadet 762.

Here are six young jazz musicians who have to succeed, because they are (1) very good, (2) very dedicated. The frontline horns are—alto saxophone, tenor saxophone and trumpet and the rhythm section; the usual piano, bass and drums. There is, however, nothing "usual" about The Interpreters' music. Much of their material is unusual, and so is their performing.

RHAPSODY—Ahmad Jamal (W/Strings)—Cadet 764.







Stuckey Story: No Welfare Line

Nathan Wright Stuckey II (Nat Stuckey), Paula recording artist, was born in Cass, Texas, and grew up on a farm near Atlanta, Texas, where his father drove a school bus.

Nat's parents got him a guitar to amuse himself while they worked at the Red River Arsenal during World War Two. Nat played and sang during school days, organizing his own band.

His career after high school often parallels that of the late Jim Reeves. He worked for Station KALT in Atlanta, Texas, after getting out of Arlington State College and prior to going into service. Nat narrated Army films in New York, then went to Korea to set up their first TV station, then returned to KALT after his hitch was up. After working there several years, a vacancy appeared at KWKH and Frank Page, Program Director, hired Nat. Here, again, Nat's career parallels that of Reeves. Jim, too, was an air personality on KWKH before he started singing regularly on the Hayride. Nat's singing and writing ability were recognized immediately, and he became well known as a writer with songs recorded by Ricky Nelson, Hank Thompson, Tony Douglas and Buck Owens. Next, Buck Owens recorded "Waitin' in Your Welfare Line" which Nat wrote. Then Nat's own Paula recording of "Don't You Believe Her" began to show up in charts across the land. Nat's wife, Ann, wrote "One More Mile" which Warner Mack recorded.

So, things are happening for this tall Texan who now resides in Louisiana.
