OUR RELATIVE CHARTING, AS SEEN BELOW, RESEMBLES BASEBALL'S BATTING AVERAGES. IT ESTABLISHES A RATIO BETWEEN THE IDEAL, (HEAVY AIRPLAY AT EVERY STATION WHICH REPORTED); AND THE WEIGHTED COUNT THAT A RECORDING HAS ACTUALLY EARNED. THIS MATHEMATICAL FORMULA IS APPLIED TO EACH RECORD-FIRST REGIONALLY, THEN NATIONALLY. A DUAL WEIGHTING SYSTEM IS USED TO DERIVE THE COUNT. IT ADJUSTS FOR MARKET SIZE AND FOR HEAVY OR MODERATE AIRPLAY. THESE CHARTS SHOW THE RELATIVE INTENSITY OF RADIO AIRPLAY FOR BOTH NEW AND ESTABLISHED FECORDINGS.

With the proliferation of FM rockers it will be harder and harder for any station, particularly less tightly formatted, more quality-conscious one to dominate its market with 7 and 8 shares. However, if we keep our heads and learn to work creatively with our sales neonle, we learn to work creatively with our sales people, we ought to be able to present a sizeable and desirable audience to advertisers. It's important that we control, where we can, the integrity of what we're doing. We're going to have doing. We're going to hav to compromise, for sure, but if we don't make the effort to preserve the art, as well as the science, of radio, who will?

They had become musically acquainted in several wild nights of fantastic music last September at the Last Chance, a local club, whose house band, The Last Chance Jazz Band is a rollicking collection of individuals whose forte is dixieland incert end enderst music. On those hot nights in September, David and the Jazz Band cooked so well together that they blew themselves, as well as their audiences, away stunned. It seemed only right, then, to bill the two acts together in David's first appearance at the new Civic Center in Pough-keepsie. The Last Chance Jazz Band came out first, and despite some sound problems, their set was energetic, tight and boisterously received by the audience. Their type of music set-up the crowd so well for Bromberg - it's a damned shame that they couldn't arrange a whole tour. By the time that the interminable equipment changing delays were finished with, the place was very hyper and ready for David and his band. And although David was visibly ex-hausted from a show that went until 5 a. m. in New York the night before, he and his band put on a very good show for the audience. Much of his material was unrecorded, and much came from his latest release, including his show-stopper, "Will Not Be Your Fool." He did perform some old favorites, such as "The Hold-Up." During the show, David brought out Johnny Windhurst, the amazing trumpet player from The Last Chance Jazz Band, to play on several songs. Johnny's playing during the gigs in September had knocked David out, and he was determined to bring him out to add some extra fire to the show. It was a nice tribute to John Windhurst, one of the area's true musical resources. When the show was over, Bromberg and company found it nearly impossible to get off the stage. Their encore of "Sharon" brought things to yet another peak, and they were forced to come out again and do another song, this one quite mellow, to quiet the audience and allow themselves the peace of the dressing room. In spite of a rather prob-lem-plagued debut on Friday, January 18th (1st show, Diana fell off a step leading onto the stage, landing on a man in the audience and suffering an injury to her leg in the fall; 2nd show, she braved several hecklers), she was able to more than remedy any professional embarrass-ment by electrifying her audiences for the final 3 performances. Basically, her show drives home dramat-ically her sheer versatility, encompassing her multi-dimensional career of Supreme, solo artist, desincr, actress. Effective use of 3 mimes who had a surreal touch of ingenuity only serves to underline the sheer creativity

actress. Effective use of 3 mimes who had a surreal touch of ingenuity only serves to underline the sheer creativity and imagination that's gone into this show. First half features "Love Hangover," where Ms. Ross invites people up to dance with her on stage as she makeshifts the theatre into a temporary disco! The Saturday performance saw only one person join Diana in this segment, while the Sunday show had 20 or 30 people on stage feverishly hustlin' and bumpin'. She pays tribute to the great "Work-ing Girls," people like Holiday, Brice, and Bessie Smith. Dazzling lighting and rapid costume changes enhance this portion. Throughout, a comedic flair, a warmth and ef-fortless, unforced love for an audience is bounced back and forth from Diana. Her audience responds with beauti-ful spontaneity. ful spontaneity.

Second half features a Motown medley, a Supremes med-ley and a memory tinged look back on her struggles to get there on her own star. At both shows that I attended, everybody enjoyed these segments immensely and I believe that Diana got a lot of satisfaction from the people's fond love for her first works. Throughout, her vocal back-up (Jones Girls), along with a trademark - original Motown rhythm section and a <u>real</u> string section pulsated tremen-dous momentum and soul to Diana and the crowd. She ended her Sunday show by going into the audience (into meaning 2/3 of the way down the aisle and into the rows or seats, touching hands) and persuading people to sing along and join hands for "Reachout and Touch." Her good feeling generated throughout and there were no sad faces, just happiness!

Beating the System - Developing New Artists Against the Odds...

Our concern, as we have said many times before, is with the media process by which artists reach the public ear. Fascination with the process consistently regenerates it-self because it never quite works the same way twice, al-though patterns do emerge from time to time. New artists are often of more interest to us than the established artist whose individual pattern has already emerged. You may be able to detect a sense of that move-on-to-the-next feel-ing in our reviews. ing in our reviews.

With concern for new artists manifest we offer the follow-ing. It is an idea which people in the record business must already know but, one which few have acted on.

all know that both the radio and concert scenes are less willing to take chances on unproven performers. The reason for that is that the self-interest of those major forms of exposure does not lie with the introduction of the new and the untested. Both are interested primarily in draw, getting a big audience. You do that by offering talent which draws big audiences.

There is only one place where the long range self-interest of record companies coincides with the self-interest of others. That is in the retail store. Record companies need to develop promotion systems parallel, and equal in effect-iveness, to their radio efforts but, which are aimed at re-tailers. They must determine the really activated stor s from the less involved, provide promo Lps for in-storeplay, personal promotion, as opposed to sales, contact with these stores and they must be dedicated to marketing that will change the "m" from lower case to upper case.

A great record company maintains a stable of established artists while it continually develops new artists. To depend on radio and concerts, especially in the area of new names, as tools to develop these people is unrealistic. New levels of organized promotion are required. Point of sale influ-ences designed to stimulate interest in new artists have not we followed and we have the for the four set. yet been fully developed. They must be for the future's sake.
