NEW YORK

CAN I BORROW THE CAR?: By now, the Cars' second album, CANDY-O, will have already gone through its unprecedented 500 station simultaneous world premiere, but just because the LP's out, don't think the ignition's turned off. With CANDY-O completed, guitarist-songwriter Ric Ocasek has taken advantage of a brief respite to hone his production chops and do some session work as well. In recent days Ocasek could be seen behind the studio control board with three of his favorite home-town outfits, Boston's La Peste, the Nervous Eaters and Third Rail and New York's own Suicide. In addition Ocasek and Cars' bassist Ben Orr have lent Ian Lloyd an instrumental hand on his forthcoming Scotti Brothers album, which will include Lloyd's version of Ocasek's "Slip Away," a song the Cars have not yet recorded.

GREEN BACK: Peter Green, the legendary guitarist and founder member of Fleetwood Mac who's been missing in action since leaving Mac and the music business behind in the early 70s, has finally reemerged with an LP called IN THE SKIES, the first release of a new English label called PVK. The LP shows that Green has survived with chops intact, though he's helped out on guitar by Snowy White, the axeman who augmented Pink Floyd on their last tour. The record will be distributed here by Sail Records.

TIDBITS: Tickets for The Who's two nights at Madison Square Garden this September went on sale after details were announced on WNEW; station also gave first airing ever to KIDS ARE ALRIGHT soundtrack LP the day after the concert announcement. . . . Devo have just returned to the States after attempting to step up Japan's de-evolutionary processes. . . . The Dead Boys are rumored to be reforming, er, getting back together, anyway. . . . Tom Robinson had to cut short his US tour when he learned his grandfather had suffered a stroke. . . . Chuck Berry reportedly in big trouble with the taxman. He'll tell all in a book he's currently writing. . . . Dr. Pepper Music Festival schedule for this summer is most rock-oriented in years, with appearances scheduled by Blondie (who can walk to the gig), Rockpile, the Cars, the Ramones, Talking Heads, Southside Johnny and Johnny Winter. . . . Expect a mid-summer tour from Mick Taylor's new band. . . . Former Brand X drummer Chuck Burgi has joined Fandango. . . . Blondie producer Mike Chapman said to

be eyeing New York's Nervous Rex for possible production deal. Band's bassist, Lew Ecklund, left recently due to "musical differences" and will be replaced. . . . New York's premier punkabilly band, the Cramps have signed an English label deal with Police manager Miles Copeland's Illegal Records and are relocating in London for a spell.

IN THE STUDIO: Pink Floyd's Richard Wright and producer Bob Ezrin were in at CBS's 30th Street Studios to record the orchestral sections for the forthcoming Floyd LP, THE WALL. They'll mix it in LA in August for September or October release. Expect a tour around Christmas-time. . . . Warren Zevon near completion of BAD LUCK STREAK IN DANCING SCHOOL, which he's co-producing with Greg Ladanyi. . . . Aerosmith putting the finishing touches on their newie with Gary Lyons at Media Sound. . . . Ditto Blondie with Mike Chapman at the Power Station. . . . Kinks at the Power Station, too, frantically trying to meet late June release date. . . . Pretenders, whose Nick Lowe-produced debut single, "Stop Your Sobbing" got lots of AOR play as an import, working on their debut LP with Chris Thomas in London. . . . Also in London, Wreckless Eric, with Motors' Nick Garvey producing. . . . ZZ Top, recording their first Warners' LP, are bouncing around Texas studios to "prevent the curious from detecting their location" according to a publicity handout. . . . B. Willie Smith Band, recently signed to Big Sound, at Trod Nossel Studios in Connecticut, Doc Cavalier producing.

COMING SOON: Rainbow's DOWN TO EARTH, produced by new band member Roger Glover on Polydor July 26. . . . Two new British bands produced by Richard Gottehrer, Darling on Charisma and the Yachts on Radar, both through Polydor July 26. . . . Blue Oyster Cult's MIRRORS and Rachel Sweet's FOOL AROUND from Columbia in late June. . . . Jerry Wexler-produced Bob Dylan (backed by two of Dire Straits), Gary Lyons-produced Aerosmith, and second Bliss Band from Columbia in July. . . . Bette Midler from Atlantic in July. . . . Mink DeVille's LA CHATTE BLEU (The Blue Cat) produced by Steve Douglas, due July 9 on Capitol. Little River Band due July 23, with August 6 release set for LPs by Sammy Hagar, the Durocs, Red Rider, Michael Clark and Dolores Hart, all on Capitol, with debuts from the Motels and Gary P. Nunn due September 10. . . . The controversial LP of early George Thorogood tapes, BETTER THAN THE REST, is due June

22 from MCA, along with Point Blank's AIRPLAY (that's really point blank!), and debuts from Dream Express and Gainesville, Florida's Hotel. J.J. Cale 5, MORE AMERICAN GRAFFITI and the DRACULA soundtrack follow on July 6. MCA will also be releasing a BEST OF BISCUIT compilation, featuring the best live cuts from the King Biscuit Flower Hour syndicated series sometime this summer.

LOS ANGELES

CROONER CROSSOVER TO CELLULOID CONTINUES: The intermingling of pop, rock and country stars with Hollywood movie makers seems to be reaching near-fever pitch. Paul Simon, in addition to readying his first LP for Warner Bros., is finishing up a screenplay for Warner films in which he'll also star. Neil Diamond is scoring original tunes for the remake of THE JAZZ SINGER in which he'll make his acting debut (in the title role). And Willie Nelson, already an "old hand" with THE ELECTRIC HORSEMAN under his belt (co-starring with Robert Redford and Jane Fonda) is set for the lead in a picture called HONEYSUCKLE ROSE. The leading lady looks to be a songstress too: thus far Linda Ronstadt, Carlene Carter and Nicolette Larson have been talked to and/or screen-tested for the part.

On the other side of the coin, Academy Award winner Diane Keaton is recording tracks with Kenny Vance for a possible album on Richard Perry's Planet Records. Keaton played an aspiring pop singer in Woody Allen's ANNIE HALL (in which Paul Simon played a record company exec — hey hey).

DISKERY DEALS UPDATED: Two recent label marriages: Beserkly Records has signed on with Elektra to distribute their Greg Kihn, Rubinoos, Jonathan Richman, Earth Quake and Sean Tyla roster. And the folk-oriented Takoma Records has inked with Chrysalis. Takoma is the home of such notables as John Fahey, Mike Auldridge, Mike Bloomfield, Norman Blake, Byron Berline and Canned Heat ("Canned Heat?!").

MANKEY TO PRODUCE 20/20: Earl Mankey, one-time member of Sparks, who has been producing The Pop for Arista, has been brought in to produce Portrait Records' entry in the L.A. local group competition — 20/20. The youthful 20/20 gang go into the studio with Mankey momentarily.

OTHER IN-THE-STUDIO NEWS: Kenny Loggins is working on his own solo album, as is his ex-partner Jimmy

Messina. . . . Bonnie Raitt's still working with producer Peter Asher, looking towards a September release on Warners. . . . The Temptations are at the Total Experience in Hollywood, recording for Atlantic with Ron Kersey producing. Chaka Khan sings on one number. . . . Snuff Garrett is producing Phil Everly at Britannia studios for Elektra/Asylum. . . . Joe Wissert (Boz Scaggs) is working with Nempor artist Steve Forbert at Nashville's Woodland Sound. . . . At the Record Plant in Sausalito, producer Jeff Lesser just completed a Hounds album for CBS, and just started there with Flint (ex-Grand Funk Railroad guys) also for CBS. . . . Ian Lloyd, produced by Bruce Fairbairn, working on a summer-slated disc from Atlantic.

MANAGEMENT SPLITS:

Three currently hot acts who have just severed (or are in the process of severing) ties with their management are Rickie Lee Jones, Blondie and Tanya Tucker. Jones split from her ex-boyfriend/manager Nick Mathe and is being courted by biggies such as Irv Azoff and ICM. Blondie is in the process of legal disentanglement from their long-time managers. And Tanya Tucker has split from Far Out, the management/production outfit that engineered her highly successful image transformation. Tucker's gone over to manager Peter Brown.

NEW RELEASES: Slated for August on Sire Records, FEAR OF MUSIC by Talking Heads. . . . The Yachts' debut on Radar/Polydor in late June. . . . On Warner Bros. in July: BOP TILL YOU DROP from Ry Cooder, NAIL ME TO THE WALL from The Sanford/Townsend Band. . . . Richie Furay's still untitled Elektra/Asylum album, produced by Val Garay, is set for July. . . . From Epic/Portrait/Associated Labels in late June and early July: Joan Baez's HONEST LULLABY, REO Speedwagon's NINE LIVES, THE EDGAR WINTER ALBUM, Ian Dury & The Blockhead's DO IT YOURSELF (with an extra EP featuring "Hit Me With Your Rhythm Stick"), Ian Gomm's GOMM WITH THE WIND, Andy Pratt's MOTIVES and Meat Loaf's THE RENEGADE ANGEL. . . . Los Angeles indie outfit Rhino Records has licensed the entire Allan Sherman catalog from Warner Bros. and has compiled THE BEST OF ALLAN SHERMAN (including "Hello Muddah. . ."). Rhino will release the set at the end of June. . .

REDBONE DROPPED BY WARNER BROS: The enigmatic Leon Redbone has been axed from the roster of Warner Bros. Records.

an interview with
phil ramone

There's no mistaking a Phil Ramone production — his recordings are the aural equivalent of a newly-scrubbed window; clean, uncluttered, transparent. Since the early seventies, when he worked as engineer on Paul Simon's solo albums, Ramone's career has blossomed. Now, his urbane arrangements and meticulous recording technique attract artists like Phoebe Snow and Billy Joel. The New York-based producer began his studio career as an engineer, which may account for the exceptional clarity of his albums. But he has also earned a reputation for his ability to work with that most difficult breed of artist, the singer-songwriter. Ramone puts his clients and their songs in the best of all possible settings; there is no excess, only essentials.



There is no window in Phil Ramone's office at A & R Studios in Manhattan; the walls are panelled in dark wood, and the room is cluttered with equipment and furniture. A battered trumpet adorns one wall — it's the same horn Billy Joel holds on the cover of his Ramone-produced platinum album **52nd Street**. Ramone is forty-ish, has curly gray hair, and speaks quickly, in a no-nonsense tone. All through the interview, he fidgets with a large brown-stoned ring he is wearing on his left hand. "That ring has become part of my nervousness," he laughs. "When I'm thinking of something, I get to twisting this ring. As if it had magic powers!"

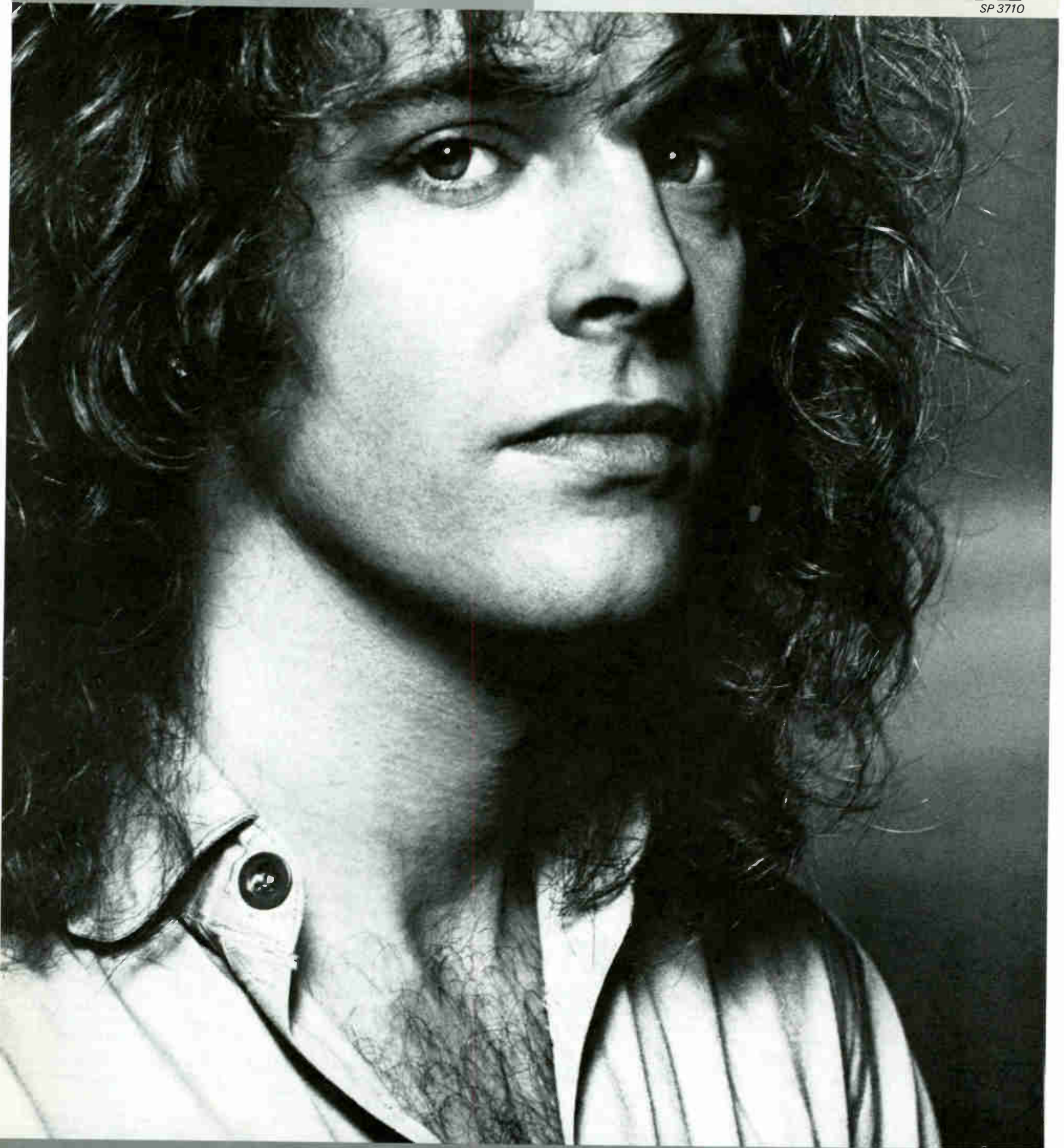

“I’m the country doctor — I’m not supposed to let anything happen to the artist while I’m working with him.”

Dixie Hummingbirds, as you know, the famous gospel group. We had tried to cut this record with a rhythm section and the group, and it just wasn't coming out. After a day, everybody just kind of left. So the next day, we sat in a circle and rehearsed it, just Paul and the group, singing and slapping their knees. And we went back into the studio, and I just sat everybody around, the same way we did in rehearsal, and hung microphones all around. And we got into a natural performance, just singing, and that's what's on the record. Afterwards — which is a rare thing to do — we put the drums and bass on. You can hear it in the record, everybody just sitting around, feet stomping. It was such a natural recording. We found it difficult to come up with anything better.

WALRUS: IS THAT THE WAY YOU USUALLY WORK, TO LET THE ARRANGEMENT HAPPEN IN THE STUDIO? Some of the stuff may be predetermined by Paul or between the two of us. But we like to leave doors open for the musicians to really get into things with you. We take a lot of time, feeling out their knowledge, figuring out where it could be used in the song. Now, Paul might play the song ten or fifteen times, and we'll sit around and jab and talk about it. People we work with, like Steve Gadd and Richard Tee, are extremely talented. When you're working with players like that, you can't be dogmatic about what you want them to do. Cause if you are, musicians will generally start to play something they've played before. What we try to do is get them inspired from the song, rather than say, 'Give me this sound.' It's a real living room atmosphere. A lot of times we'll let a song go for hours, knowing that it's going in the wrong direction. But we learn from it.

WALRUS: CAN YOU GIVE US AN EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS PROCESS WORKS WITH A PARTICULAR SONG?

Yeah. . . in a later album, *Gone at Last*. We set one tempo that felt good, then somebody suggested we slow it down. And it took several weeks before we realized that we were going down the wrong path. . . Then, sometimes, you'll have a preconceived idea about a song that one player will walk in

and change completely. "Fifty Ways To Leave Your Lover" is a perfect example of an incredible drum part that was really created in the studio by Steve Gadd. A 'march-funk.' That little beat turned the song into a gay, happy record. It brought the song into a different focus.

(STEELY DAN — THE ROYAL SCAM) Good Record. I think Steely Dan probably have the most clarity of all rock groups around. There's something tremendously clean about their energy. Sometimes I worry that it's too clean. One of the things that is possibly a parallel between their work and mine is that we don't waste space. And they're not self-indulgent. I admire anybody that can edit themselves really well. I don't know how they work, but they take their time, a long time recording. And it shows in the result.

WALRUS: HOW FAR DO YOU GO WITH AN ALBUM? ARE YOU INVOLVED, FOR INSTANCE, IN THE REMIXING AND THE MASTERING?

Oh yes. I think you have to. It's not to bring your own ego and style to it. Following through is a security for the artist. They deserve it. I'm generally involved past the mastering stage. I'm not one to let the first set of tests go out. I've even changed a record after the first 2,000 records. I thought there was a problem with *Still Crazy*; one of the sides was not as bright and airy as I thought it could be. People will tell you, you're crazy, the audience doesn't hear that. But I don't buy that.

WALRUS: DID YOU CALL THE RECORD BACK?

I didn't recall any, I just re-equalized one of the cuts. This was only in the first set of records, the ones that went out to the dj's, and they're always replenishing those. And certainly, it wasn't a major problem.

When I first started engineering, with people like Burt Bachrach and Neil Diamond, some of those producers would call back their records. I remember Burt and I did "Raindrops Keep Falling on My Head" and it was a big hit. Later, we were in England, and we heard it on the air. And Burt said, 'Remember the intro we did that was better than this?' We went back in the studio and re-edited it. So the first

140,000 copies of the record are one way, and God knows how many are the other.

WALRUS: TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT YOUR MUSICAL BACKGROUND. YOU WERE A CLASSICAL MUSICIAN BEFORE YOU GOT INTO RECORDING?

I started as a child in classical music, on violin. I was one of those little child brat performers who was on TV and played pop, a little jazz and things. I was constantly around both TV and recording studios, and I got interested in that, trying to get sounds that nobody else had gotten. I worked at a demo studio for about three years, and got into engineering.

WALRUS: WHAT DO YOU THINK OF SOME OF THE NEWEST DEVELOPMENTS IN RECORDING TECHNOLOGY?

Well, I've played around with the Aphex. I'm personally waiting for the change to digital. Dolby was the first step in the expansion of recorded sound. And then I worked out a system that was a combination of two multi-track machines tied together to give me more tracks. Not because I wanted to outdo everybody by having thirty or forty more tracks. But because you do need them if you're gonna get more creative, and give artists more alternatives at the time they're recording. The people I work with are constantly restructuring a song in their mind. So am I. **(BOSTON — "MORE THAN A FEELING")**

I love the combination of delicate acoustic instruments with something hard; I love the shock value. It's a fine sound production, too.

WALRUS: BOSTON'S APPROACH TO THE STUDIO IS QUITE DIFFERENT FROM YOURS, ISN'T IT. THEY DON'T ENCOURAGE THINGS TO HAPPEN IN THE STUDIO. . . THEY FILL ALL THE SPACES. . .

I don't want to make it sound like I go into the studio unprepared. We do rehearse. But the point of rehearsal is not to finesse it — to keep the doors open to new ideas. I almost force myself to make the record work in the beginning stages, with just the rhythm and vocals. Sometimes I'll add the vocal parts to the song immediately, so I'm not tempted to fill the holes with

anything else. It's true, I do go into the studio with the chance that I'm gonna change the tempo and move into a completely different mood than the one I thought I was gonna be in. I worry if I'm sure about something from the start, cause, — maybe I'm going for the obvious.

WALRUS: DO YOU FEEL MORE COMFORTABLE WORKING WITH A SINGER-SONGWRITER THAN YOU DO WORKING WITH A BAND?

I'd like to move away from getting labelled as a producer who does singer-songwriters. I love bands. I stayed away from them for a while, because I felt that the lack of democracy which exists limits you from making a great record.

WALRUS: WHAT DO YOU MEAN?

Well, in some cases you have to become a leader. But there's also a leader in the group, and the difference in opinion can make it difficult for you to get the sound you think would be good for them. I've had so much freedom in the studio, that I don't want to relinquish that to a band format, which in some cases is very limiting to me.

WALRUS: YOU SEEM TO HAVE THE ABILITY TO GET ALONG AND WORK PRODUCTIVELY WITH SOME NOTORIOUSLY DIFFICULT PEOPLE. WHAT'S YOUR SECRET?

Being objective and clear and honest with people, and making sure your relationship is based on that. I demand a certain amount of privacy. I keep the studio absolutely clear. No friends, no visitors, no lovers. There's a time for play. I don't even let them take cassettes home. Artists who've worked with me know that. And they know that they become their own worst enemy when they listen to half-finished material over and over again. It's better to take a weekend off, put the tape up on Monday, and see it in a whole new light. And if your friends are there — I'm sorry, it's a deterrent. It disrupts all concentration. I'm the country doctor, and I'm not supposed to let anything happen to the artist while I'm working with him.

WALRUS: WHAT WAS IT LIKE WORKING WITH PHOEBE SNOW?

Phoebe and I have had an up and down relationship from

ANALYSIS

BY GEORGE MEIER

Naturally the most interesting aspect of our Centerfold Chart is the mountain of discrepancies which show up. Kansas jumps into the Top 5 from Futures with their characteristic Midwestern radio support, yet they are selling best in the West. Another Midwestern radio act, Van Halen, is selling best by far in the Northeast. Ian Hunter is a Top 10 radio act but he is not selling like it. While Journey gets strong airplay west of the Mississippi and the Midwest sales confirm their popularity, the West sales do not. The Doobies' radio intensity is coming from east of the Mississippi but their sales intensity is coming from west of the Mississippi.

Beyond all of these discrepancies there remains some distance between radio and sales in many other cases. What it all means is hard to figure. Either the "research" that radio is doing is off or the medium's influence wanes from time to time.

Last issue we noted a shift in Southern radio strategy. That is confirmed again in this issue's Centerfold. If you check Charlie Daniels, Marshall Tucker and the Allmans, you will see that all of them are getting more intense radio play in the Midwest than they are getting in the South.

That fact must signal some changing winds, though Atlanta Rhythm, Wet Willie and Dixie Dregs remain at least nominally ahead in their home territory.

Still, some things never change. Diehard Midwestern acts like Kansas, Bad Co., Van Halen and Ted Nugent remain so. Bent rockers like Bowie, Graham Parker, Roxy Music and Robert Fripp push out on the two coasts.

Very notable is the exaggerated Retail position of Cheap Trick in the Northeast and in the Midwest. It's a highly unusual pattern.

Finally, of the forty records shown in our Centerfold, only seven records have stronger retail than radio intensities. The number remains the same as in last issue. People are not very excited about many acts. They never really are. The only records which really sell are in the Top 10 - 15. In tough economic times even fewer records sell as buying habits become increasingly conservative.

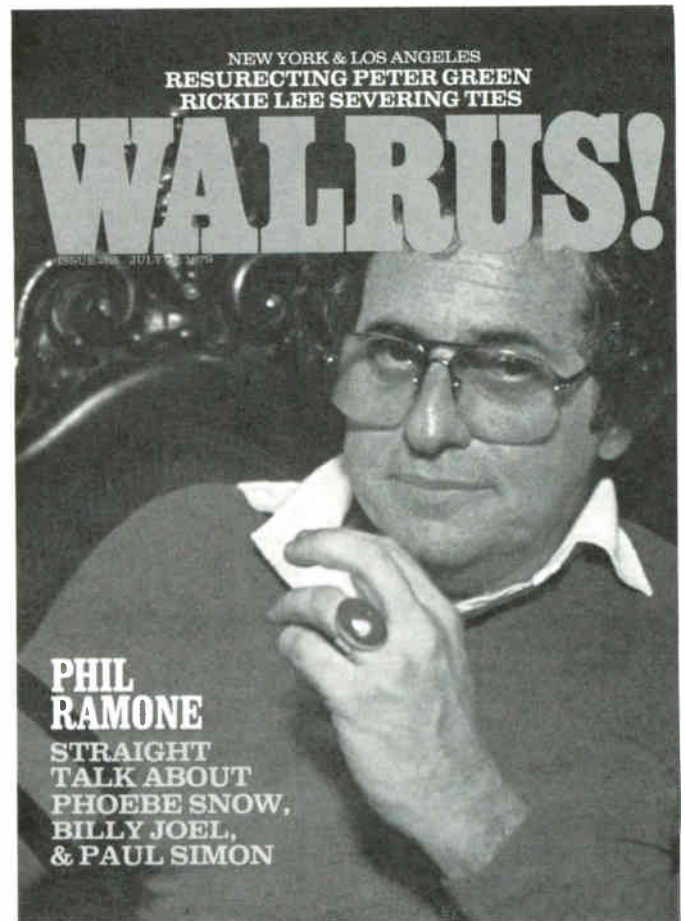

(Continued from page 6) the beginning. It goes through many phases. She's had a lot of grief in her personal life which has caused tremendous amount of hell, in and out of the studio. If something is wrong for Phoebe, I think I'm the first to know. But it might take her weeks to find out, and by then, it may be too late. Then, her tendency is to give up, or blame it on somebody. Like: 'You know, that drummer was a real drag, he made me angry.' But I'll tell her, 'You didn't say anything to him at the time — you let it slide!' Phoebe's learning more and more that she has to be vocal about her thoughts. She's also a victim of her friends. The day she loses some of those nice friends in her recording period will be the best thing that happens to her. Because she's a fine artist. If she could only directionalize! For years, I've told Phoebe, 'Forget about this weight problem, just lose the weight.' Maintain your inner beauty, because you are beautiful. But this girl has no feeling that she looks good, and when she doesn't feel that, she doesn't sing with that confidence that you need.

(GINO SOCCIO — OUTLINE) Takes some time getting there, doesn't it? Is this one of those nine minute jobs? I don't dislike this form. A lot of people are surprised that I happen to like it. I don't know if there's anything special about this record that I like, though.

Disco's become a lot less faceless than it was in the beginning. Linda Clifford and Donna Summer are great singers. Disco is credible, and I admire that. A lot of rock and roll wasn't. A lot of dance rock and roll was garbage. (Aside) I just got done listening to the disco version of "Bridge Over Troubled Waters." (Laughs) Now I have to get the punk version of "Sounds of Silence." (ROCHES — "HAMMOND SONG")

I know them well — they're one of my favorite acts. If you look at my discography, you'll find a very unsuccessful record that I helped make, *Seductive Reasoning*, their first LP. They've changed a lot, they're three voices now. When I first got involved with Paul, they used to hang around the office. There was something real innocent and fresh, yet road-wise about

them. They'd tell you how they'd hitched from Allentown to Muscle Shoals.

WALRUS: ROBERT FRIPP RECORDED THEM WITH VIRTUALLY NO EMBELLISHMENTS — VERY DIFFERENT FROM SEDUCTIVE REASONING. WOULD YOU EVER RECORD AN ARTIST THIS SPARSELY?

Well, if I'm known for anything, I guess I'm known for not crowding the issue. I probably would have taken them a step further than this, though. It depends on how much fire an artist has in their writing. In some cases, you don't have to accentuate them. It'll be a matter of time as to whether the people who determine airplay will want to

get involved with something like that. But I believe that it's going to happen. And I don't think the use of drums is all that important. I never felt that with Phoebe in the beginning. "Poetry Man" is a really delicate piece of material.

WALRUS: WHAT HAS YOUR INVOLVEMENT WITH BILLY JOEL BEEN LIKE? HOW MUCH DOES HE BRING TO THE STUDIO, AND HOW MUCH DO YOU CONTRIBUTE? His technique of working has changed radically in the last couple of years. He'd never come into the studio without 6 or 7 songs. Now he has a feeling that he can change things, play around in the studio. Also, using his band

on the records was a big change. Billy's not one to want or need tremendously flowery arrangements. And he's given me all the freedom in the studio I could ask for. We re-edit together, play at night after the session with new ideas.

WALRUS: HOW WOULD YOU CONTRAST HIM WITH, SAY, SIMON?

He's not a prolific writer, like Paul is. He takes a lot of time to come by a song. The last album, I think we had two or three songs, and then the rest emerged. Two or three came literally overnight, in the studio when we were just sitting around, and it was beautiful. That, for me, is one of the nicest things that happens with Billy. He's also a tremendous humorist. I try to keep the humor level high. I play jokes. The band plays jokes. Insane jokes. I tease them with food. It's the before-the-Chinese food and the after-the-Chinese-food takes that count.

WALRUS: WHICH TAKES ARE THE BEST?

The ones right before the food, usually. The take where I'm holding up the bone and saying 'You want it? Here it is!' They do things back to me, too. I was using the bathroom backstage at a show one night, and they managed to get the caterer to bring a load of sandwiches and ice in ice buckets, and they proceeded to dump it on me over the wall of the commode.

You have to blow off your steam in the studio. You gotta get rid of it. Then, sometimes, you'll come back at three in the morning, and find a piece of a song that didn't exist, or a bridge to something he never completed. And he'll find a connective tissue there, and it'll all come together.

The essence of music — I like to compare it to romance. Its climax is one of the nicest things you can experience. It's like a love affair that happens between the music, the player and the producer. That's why the people who work around me have to be in tune. Cause it's a rare amount of minutes where that happens. The rest of it is the Good Take, the O.K. Take, The Acceptable Take. I don't try to put the best parts of each together. I go for the chemical take. It may not be perfect. But it will have the natural inflection. □

RADIO CITY

Joe Jackson, Patti Smith, Graham Parker, Roxy Music, The Police, Robert Fripp, Blondie, Talking Heads, Boomtown Rats, The Cars and Elvis Costello — Yep, it's time to talk about the Northeast — that hungry music monster, constantly evolving and forever searching for new music to satisfy its outrageous appetite. The Northeast, basically a triangle from Boston to D.C. to Pittsburgh, is the smallest of the four regions but contains the most people per square mile. Besides being the birthplace of the nation, the Northeast has either spawned or been the first to support the most inventive/sophisticated music. It is almost true to say that no matter how big a band may be elsewhere, it can't really achieve stardom until the Northeast gives its OK.

This corner of the country is not a string of stereotyped cities which all blanketly accept all forms of music. Baltimore and Pittsburg are blue collar towns. New York, Boston and Washington are cultural centers. And Philadelphia falls neatly in between.

At the center of this triangle, and what seems to be the center of the universe we find New York City — the place where anything goes. Even Punk Rock flourished there, for a while.

"New Yorkers are spoiled," says WNEW's **Scott Muni**, who by his own admission, has been in radio for almost 78 years. "They demand the best here, and get it of course. There's more going on here than anywhere in California."

"I think the people who failed," Scott continues, "were those in what was called Punk Rock because they weren't in it for the music. They were fighting some cause or communicating some message. The musicianship involved just sucked. A guy can't learn to play the guitar in a couple of weeks, like one of the Sex Pistols. You can pull that off in the studio but not in front of the public."

Punk Rockers did to the rock audience what farmers might do to mules, smacked them in the face with a shovel just to get their attention. Ever since then it's been called New Wave (or more recently in these pages — Bent Rock). But this kind of music is strong in New York because besides airplay, the city offers a number of venues which feed the movement.

Meg Griffin, who recently left WNEW to become MD at WPIX, used to work at the best club in town (Hurrah) and says, "Aside from what the club scene can do legitimately, what it does image-wise is immeasurable. At a place like Hurrah you feel the essence of the music. Rock'n'roll started with its roots — Chuck Berry, Buddy Holly, Elvis Presley. And it continued to grow from there until it got to the point where bands came along like Boston, which is really far away from the roots. Not their songs so much, but the way they're approached and produced. Instead of it being Buddy Holly's heart and guts and fingers — it's machines. The people making new music today are tired of that bullshit and want to get back to the human aspect of rock'n'roll, so that your heart and guts can feel it because that's where it's coming from."

"Most of the people who are making this music have a lot in common with the people who are accepting it. We all want it. It's just a matter of who can make it, who can get on the radio and play it or who goes out and buys the records. We're all supporting it, one way or another, like Patti Smith



says, 'till victory.' "

At the top of the triangle we find Boston, a city which is invaded every fall by a quarter of a million college students. **Tony Berardini**, PD at WBCN explains his situation. "In Boston, in particular, it's easier for new music to be accepted because there's an incredibly large college population and quite a few college radio stations. And since they're non-commercial they're willing to take a lot of risks, playing concentrated doses of music that no one else will play. So, it's a great breeding ground for new musical concepts. And it can't help but rub off on the commercial stations. We get a lot of musical input from them when we do our research."

From his standpoint at Philly's WMMR, **Jeff Pollock** says, "Northeasterners are more sophisticated musically because people here are indoors more. They seem to read more. They seem to enjoy more challenging types of music. Out west there are virtually no days that you can't be outdoors. So, that's going to make a great difference as far as radio listening and ultimately music awareness."

"What I find interesting right now is that, in a strange way disco has revitalized rock'n'roll — bringing energy and movement, body music back to radio. There's a tremendous anti-disco movement that's happening and now more than ever people are demanding good rock'n'roll. The fact that Supertramp has a #1 album over disco product — that's encouraging."

Pittsburg is geographically part of the Northeast but when you listen to WDVE's **John McGhan** it sounds like The Iron City shares the Midwest's philosophies. "The only thing constant about radio is change. The change that we're into now will probably be passed 18 to 20 months from now and we'll be into something totally new. Today we're into a real hard rock period — real boogie, party time. To sociologists it's just as socially important as the anti-war movement was. It's definitely a giant movement — a behavior pattern — escape and have a good time. For example, when the new Pat Travers LP came in, we listened to it and it went on the

air immediately. When the new Frampton arrived we got to it after a few hours."

Baltimore, like Pittsburgh, plays Heavy Metal more than most stations in the Northeast but mixes in a good bit of New Wave. **Denise Oliver**, PD at WIYY knows that it's working. "Bent Rock is a healthy thing because it has put spirit back into rock'n'roll. Spirit and energy is what WIYY is all about and it's what this city is all about. To back up that claim, we just received a Mediastat that shows us to be the number one station over all in Baltimore. It's just a Mediastat but it's the first time we've been number one in a million years. Something's happening!"

After talking to the boys from D.C. a couple of interesting points come to light. From **Dave Einstein** at WHFS we hear, "The Northeast just ain't afraid to rock'n'roll. Hell, a band like Devo couldn't get arrested in their own home town. They've certainly been more successful here. See, the Northeast is into British Invasion music. Even if the band is from these shores, we'll just eat it up. We're into a lot but I guess to sum it up you could say we're into Art Rock!"

Great! Just what we needed — another term.)

Another 'personality' from D.C. is the MD at WWDC, **Mike McKay**, who thinks "everyone's going back to wearing love beads, growing long hair and dressing in psychedelic clothing."

But when you ask him a serious question like, 'Have drugs had anything to do with the Northeast's musical taste?' He replies, "Hold on a second, I just dropped my razor blade." But he does tell us that, "Drugs are real big in high school around here. As a matter of fact, in one school they tried to make their class song Ian Dury's 'Sex & Drugs & Rock & Roll'. — Very affluent suburban school but the higher echelon wouldn't approve it. I don't think that much goes on with hard drugs. Grass is fairly accepted. But a lot of drinking goes on because the age here is 18. But drugs aren't as connected to the music as much now as in the late sixties."

Another hybrid city in the Northeast is Syracuse (or 'The Cleveland of The Northeast' as it's been tagged). The one year old WAQX finds both Van Halen LPs in its top ten along with a healthy share of Bent Rock. MD, **Ed Levine** gets into it. "Bent rock — New Wave, whatever, has really caught on here. And we didn't think it would. We didn't think Syracuse was sophisticated enough for it. But we just sold out a 1200 seat hall on week night, turning away 400 people for Joe Jackson. We did the same with the Police. But besides Van Halen, our top ten includes the Cards, the Police, Joe Jackson, Blondie, Cheap Trick. As long as it's rock'n'roll people are willing to accept it. And Bent Rock seems to be the mass appeal mainstream music of at least '79 and '80. I think, in the beginning the whole New Wave movement, like anything else, was a lot of bullshit. But the best of it stayed, evolved and got better. And that's what we're seeing. A year ago, six of our top ten retail would have been considered punk. I don't see how you could be anything but deaf and say that this is not mass appeal music now."

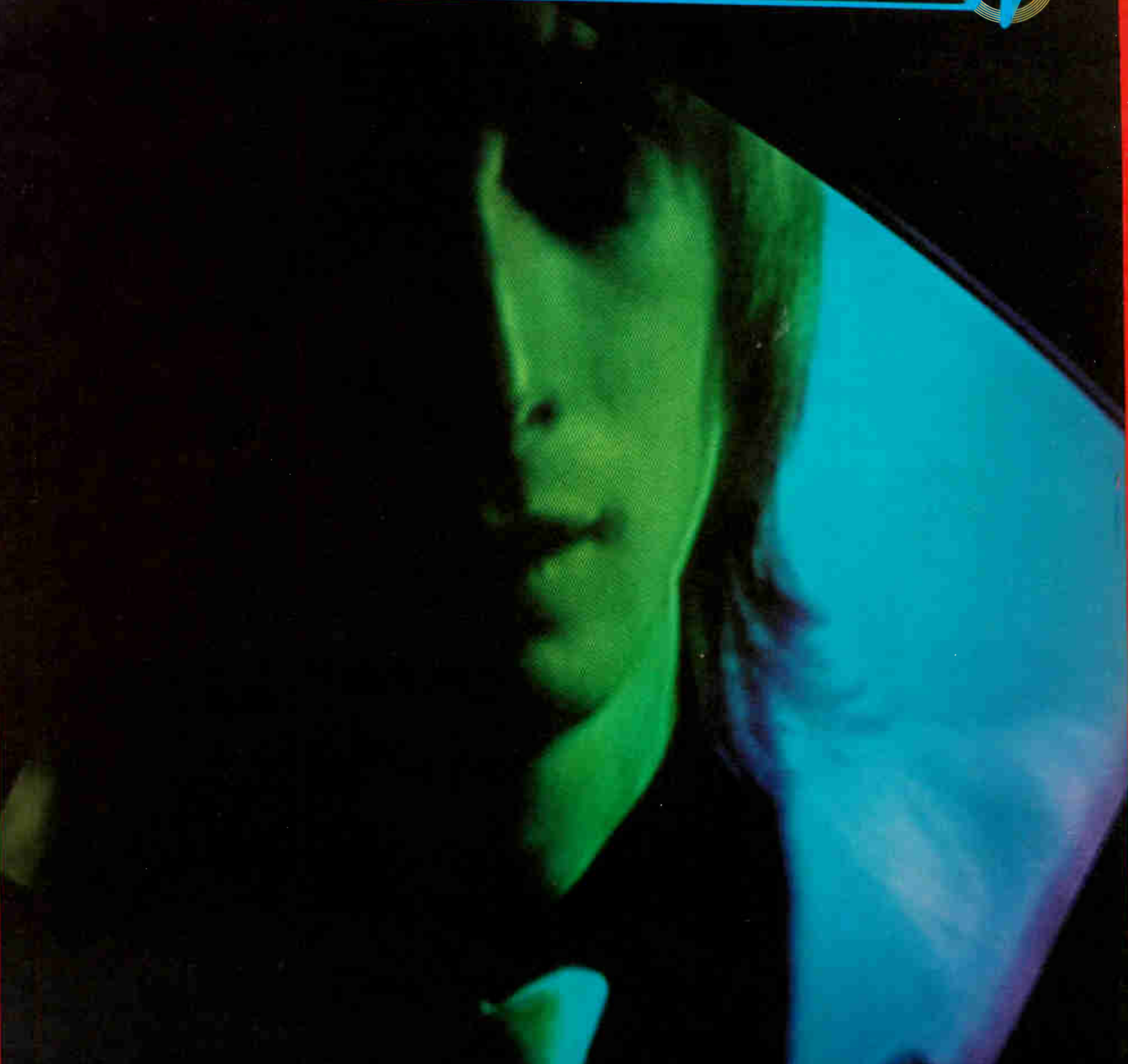
