PHILIPS "VOLKSEMPHANGER"

In 1932, as the Nazi party of Adolf Hitler gained control of the government of Germany, the newly formed Ministry of Propaganda and Enlightenment, wanting to get the party message into every household, proclaimed that very cheap radios be made available. The Heinrich Hertz Institute of Berlin was given the responsibility of designing suitable radios. It could not be too good or that segment of the public that could afford it would balk at buying a more expensive set thus alienating the industry.

Hitler met with representatives of the leading companies and decreed the cost not to exceed 75 marks, about \$15. The original model introduced at the 1933 Berlin radio show was a spectacular success. In the first year 344,000 were sold. In 1934, with the ministry of Propaganda warning dealers against using "sell up" tactics on prospective owners, the price was reduced and over 811,000 were sold. Sales in 1935 were down to 470,000 even though a government supported trade-in plan resulted in the destruction of 373,000 pre-1930 sets. An improved model was introduced in 1937, total sales now reached over 2,600,000.

My Volksradio is the 1937 model VE301DynGw manufactured by Deutsche Philips, one of 28 manufacturers making the Volksemphangers. The 301 stands for 30 January to commemorate the appointment of Hitler as Reichs Chancellor. The set uses 3 tubes and operates on any voltage between 90 and 260 volts on either alternating or direct current. The cabinet is one piece black bakelite and employs a moving coil permanent magnet speaker. The linear tuning scale is lighted and has the names of German national and regional radio stations on it. Two frequency ranges are covered, 150-350 and 500-1550 kilohertz.



Valvo brand 8 pin side contact tubes are used. A type VF7 pentode is used as RF amplifier and detector. A type VL1 pentode is used as AF output and a VY1 half-wave rectifier tube supplies direct current. A Urdox U3505 tube is employed as voltage regulator.

I unfortunately can't report on the operation of the VE301. The rectifier tube was missing and I didn't receive it soon enough to have the radio working in time for the article. Perhaps in the future, I'll compare it to the English Philco 444 "Peoples Set".

The Volksemphangers are as synonymous with vintage radios as the Philco cathedrals are in the USA. Over 3 million were sold but due to their fragility and the efforts of the allies to wipe out any trace of the Third Reich many were destroyed or defaced. Now they are quite rare and very collectible.

Next months featured set will be the very unusual Cavac Autovox 5 tube midget set.




CROSLEY REVIEW

Of all the radio manufacturers, one of the most popular with collectors is the Crosley Radio Corporation. Due to this wide-spread interest. MODEL 52-P - Like the 51, the Model 52 three-tube receiver was marketed in a portable version. The black leatherette case was slightly larger than the 51-portable, but similar in design. Not many of this model seem to exist. Noticeable is the absence of panel binding posts, for they are moved inside to a bakelite strip behind the tube sockets.



ACE 2B - The Precision division of Crosley made its own two-step amplifier to boost reception of the Ace V model one-tuber. It was called the "Ace 2B" and was exactly like the Crosley Model IV (four) amplifier. (Photo courtesy of Larry Wright)



MODEL 51 (CANADIAN) - The very popular Model 51 was sold in Canada under license to the DeForest Radio Corp. of Toronto. Same circuit, same parts, same cabinet except for the red and gold DeForest decal on the cover lid. The Models 50 and 52 were also sold the same way.



HARKO SENIOR V - The Harko was redesigned in late 1922 and put in a more modern cabinet with finger-hole in the center. Tap switch points went to seven, the "book" tuner had a cast metal mount, the socket was still porcelain and the receiver remained non-regenerative. It's price was \$16 but advertised in a regenerative version for \$20. It was called the "Harko Senior V".

WHAT ABOUT THE I.C.A. CONQUEROR?

The name Insuline Corporation of America does not often ring a bell with antique radio collectors. Its earlier name had been Radio Panel and Parts Corporation. I.C.A. was organized in 1921 with a capitalization of \$15,000 and was located at 50 Warren Street, New York. Prior to Insuline's occupancy of the building at this location, a company called Bisbee Manufacturing was also a maker of radio parts.

David Grimes Inc., used radio panels made by I.C.A. but I.C.A. supplied only the labor as the material was manufactured by another company. Insuline enjoyed a very successful business of making panels for several of the radio companies and during the later months of 1925-26 they operated three shifts. While I.C.A. manufactured panels and radio parts, they later made radios and television sets, the television equipment was of the scanning disc type.

My only acquaintence and interest with this company was in 1930 when it announced that they were going to manufacture and sell short wave kits. One of them was called the *I.C.A. Conqueror*, both in the AC and DC models. As a boy of 16, my first endeavor was to build a Pilot Super Wasp DC kit with 4 tubes and plug-in coils. This whet my appetite for short wave which, at the time, was very popular as A.M. or broadcast receivers had limitations when it came to DX, or distant reception.

Like most of us who like to tinker, we progressed with the times to the newer tube circuited sets. It was then that I purchased the I.C.A. Conqueror AC short wave receiver kit which replace the 22 and 201A's of my Pilot Super Wasp with the new pentode and variable-mu tubes like the 24 and 27's along with a 45 for the output. The plug-in coils for my new set were of the horizontal type rather than the vertical style as used in the Pilot Super Wasp. The I.C.A. uses two plug-in coils, one for the RF and the other for the detector. The Conqueror's circuit consist of one stage of tuned radio frequency, regenerative detector, one stage straight audio amplification and a pentode output. The set has a frequency range of 14 to 1,000 meters using seven sets of coils. As for price, the kit sold retail for \$65.00 and the power supply at \$34.75.

An interesting statement made in I.C.A.'s advertisements was all that was needed for assembly was a screwdriver to secure their respective terminals to small fastening nuts. All the leads were pre-measured and no soldering was necessary. Photographs, diagrams and working drawings were supplied along with some pre-assembled parts which made the set easy to construct.

A capacitatively-shielded inductive coupling to the antenna system was used to prevent the loading effects of the antenna from effacting the efficiency of the T.R.F. amplifier. This made it possible to use any type or size antenna.

As time passed and growing up, getting married and raising a couple of boys took priority, I did not follow up with my interest in radio. After retiring I soon met a fellow here in Arizona who sold old radio tubes. It was then I remembered the old Pilot Super Wasp. I had little hopes of again seeing one, no less of having one. Well, you guessed it, I really did find one advertised down in Florida. I bought it and had fun restoring it. But now I visioned if I could only find an I.C.A. Conqueror.

I decided to advertise and had a photo made to go with the ad but received no replies. With the years passing and no signs of finding the set it looked like there wasn't any I.C.A.'s left in exsistance. I forgot about it until Gary Schneider saw me at the the 1984 Elgin meet and asked if I was still looking for an I.C.A. set. I answered by saying yes, but I didn't think I'd hold my breath 'til I found one. With that, Gary pointed to a heap of rust and dust and, sure enough, it was the set I had been looking for. This junker was over 50 years old. The photos show in how terrible condition the radio was when found!


I guess I forgot how bad the set looked and accepted the challenge of bringing it back to life. Like a lot of the old sets, previous owners thought they could improve the circuit and alterations had been made, but I was determined to restore it as it was originally designed. Regarding the restoration, the rust was so bad it required peening with glass beads and some of the "white metal" parts also took the same treatment. The only difficult


part to repair was making a new colored plastic numbered dial. Fortunately, 1 was able to photograph one of the damaged plastic dials then made a positive film and backed it up with colored "Zip-a Tone."

I am now glad to say the old I.C.A. Conqueror is back in circulation - Les Rayner.



RESTORING A CROSLEY RFL-75 RECEIVER

I found the 1926 Crosley RFL "75" by placing an ad in our local shoppers paper. It is one that covers several counties and reaches farmers. I have found that it is the farmers who usually have an old radio stuck in the barn, basement or shed. This one was in a dirt floor basement, and hardly recognized as a radio. Dirt and grime covered it completely and offered a challenge. This is the type of radio I like. To see what one can do with something that looks like that. As you can see, I bought it, but not until a lot of bargaining for it.

The first thing I had to do was wash the grime off. This was done with warm soapy water. The hard rubber front panel was the worst! Years of finger marks and basement grime required a lot of scrubbing, but finally was completed.

The varnish on the cabinet was a mess. One could brush it off like powder. To remove old varnish and paint, I use a putty knife sharpened. It is much easier and not as messy as using a liquid remover. To do this, I pull the putty knife towards me, not pushing it, as one does to remove wallpaper, etc. When the knife gets dull, I resharpen it. This has to be done repeatedly as the edge wears off due to the hardened varnish.

After several hours the varnish was removed and then came the sanding of the wood; to remove the varnish I had missed. I start with 220 grit sandpaper and then graduate to the final sanding with a 800 grit. The result is a mirror wood finish ready for the stain. In this case, walnut. After letting the stain cure for three days, I give the cabinet a good coat of Johnson's paste wax, especially made for wood. There is no need to apply varnish or polyurathane. The wax does the job.

The front hard rubber panel was something else! After removing the dirt and grime, I noticed a series of tiny indented dots covering the panel. Occasionally there were areas of gold lines connecting these dots. Using a large magnifying glass, I noticed that by connecting these dots, a picture would result. I consulted a local artist about a price to restore the picture on the panel. His price was \$220. Not having \$220, I asked his advice on how to go about it myself. I ended up with a four hair artists brush and a bottle of gold leaf paint.

Have you ever tried to paint a picture using a magnifying glass when you have no idea of what you are painting? This is what faced me. Holding the glass in one hand and painting (connecting the dots) with the other was a job I do not want to do again. It was painstaking work. Like putting together a jigsaw puzzle without a picture to quide you.

I completed the left side first and saw it was several trees covered with clinging vines and tiny flowers. Then I started on what turned out to be a dancing maiden (above the lower left knob). Continuing on revealed more vines and several small

towers amongst the vines (upper center). Still had no idea of what I had! I then started on what was to be the Roman God, Faunus, blowing a horn. I later found out by research that the name of this Roman God was Faurus

I now had a completed, beautiful mural staring at me! Yet to be done was restoring the tiny numbers above the dial pointers. This was done once again via the magnifying glass.

The completed mural took nine hours of labor, but as you can see, it is worth every hour. The completion depicts the Roman God playing his trumpet for a dancing wood nymph.

The interior required only a good vacuuming and washing the five O1A tubes. These turned out to test OK, lucky for me as I had only two on hand.

The moral of this is, never turn down a "pile of junk", dirt and grim, for you will never know what it will turn out to be after some "tender loving work".

Now that the challenge is over, I may sell it to someone who would give it the respect that it requires. It is one in a million.




COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

This "Value Guide" is an attempt to establish a relative value of many of the more common radios of the 1920's. The values expressed are the result of past market trends as indicated in recent auctions, flea market sales, sales by individual collectors, as well as information provided by other established collectors in the hobby. The factors affecting a value of a radio are many. One must consider the more obvious factors, such as condition of the radio, whether it is complete with tubes, in working condition, originality, age, rarity and etc. Other factors contributing to value include collector demand, collecting specialties (such as collecting wireless items, crystal sets, etc.), and geographic area. Thus when using this guide. you must consider these multitude of factors when valuating your radio. Of coarse the final value in the end, is the price another person is willing to pay for an item. 


