




# **COLLECTORS CORNER**

Last year I attended the BVWS/AWA meet at Harpendon, England, about thirty miles from London, I had not planned on going, but after receiving an invitation from a collector I had been corresponding with, I couldn't pass up the opportunity. It was a very enjoyable affair and most interesting. The collecting scene in England is quite a bit different than in the U.S.A. There seems to be a great interest in later sets. even those of the 1950's and 60's. The collectors were much more gentlemanly and not so grabby as is becoming so commonplace anymore. Battery radios using more than three tubes and AC sets with more than five are quite scarce due to steep license fees based on the number of tubes used, higher assembly cost, and a poorer buying public. Crystal sets were rather common also, though not cheap.

I was very lucky to find a number of sets that I had only seen in pictures. One of the nicest is the Marconiphone 42, Moving Coil Transportable III, manufactured by the Marconi Wireless Co. Ltd. of Dagenham, Essex, the pioneer radio manufacturing firm of Great Britain. The model 42 was introduced in September of 1931 and retailed for 20 Pounds (approx. \$100). Classified a three valve (tube) set for licensing purposes, it actually used four tubes, the rectifier not being taxed. Two wavelengths are received, 540-240 meters (540-1500 KHz) and 2000-1000 meters (150-300 KHz) using a TRF circuit and operating from AC 40-60 cycles, 95-260 volts. Twelve arrangements of two plugs, in seven sockets, allow any voltage within this range to be selected. Also available was a DC mains version. The set weighs 33 pounds, quite a hefty four tuber! It is 17" high, 12" deep, and 20" wide.

The model 42 has four controls, the left hand is tuning, the center is selectivity, the right hand is a novel combination on/off, radio/phono, and wave change switch. Whatever position it is in shows in the window beneath the tuning dial opening. The volume control is on the right side of the cabinet. It is a dual variable resistor, one controlling the radio volume and the other phonograph volume.



**MARCONIPHONE 42** 

Antenna input via a variable capacitor serving as an antenna trimmer feeds into the tetrode RF tube, Marconi metalized MS4B, which is coupled to a triode detector MH4B. The transformer coupled pentode output tube, MPT4, drives a permanent magnet moving coil speaker, quite unusual for 1931. DC is supplied by a full-wave rectifier, Marconi U10, making use of resistance-capacity filtering since no choke or field coil is used.

Jacks are provided for low impedance external speakers and a built-in antenna for local reception can be used. It is a .0001 Mfd. capacitor connected on one side to the AC line and to the antenna terminal on the other when in use. Most English sets of this vintage include this feature.

The Marconiphone 42 performs very well considering its limits. Sensitivity is adequate and selectivity is helped somewhat by the antenna trimmer. The set is extremely well built and is a very good looking radio. (Next month Sears' first Colonial built mantle radio, the Silvertone 1152, will be featured. - Frank Heathcote)



# **CROSLEY REVIEW**

Of all the radio manufacturers, one of the most popular with collectors is the Crosley Radio Corporation. Due to this wide-spread interest, Antique Radio Classified in cooperation with Dave Crocker, a Crosley specialist, will present a series of articles showing the mony models of Crosleys manufactured. This will help assist the collector in identifying the mony types of Croslevs made, as well as increasing ones' knowledge on the subject. PRECISION - A set of mysterious background was this one-tube set of "Tri-City" design. It was sold under the Precision name and was the only Crosley set to ever use the wooden vario-coupler he manufactured. The tube socket was of "Ace" design. The rest of the parts were Crosley. This set might have been produced so Crosley could use up old parts.



NEWPORT TYPE 1112 - The more expensive Trirduns were housed in more elaborate cabinets like this Type 1112 Trirdyn Special "Newport" that sold for just over \$100. The later Trirdyns panels were slightly redesigned to have the three center knobs align (both rheostats were raised) and the on/off switch moved to the left. Other Trirdyn models had names like "Standard", "Regular", "Biltmore" and "Super".



MODEL SR-2 - The smallest Crosley regenerative receiver in a wood cabinet was this "SR-2" one-tube set. It was sold thru Sears and Roebuck exclusively and in actuallity was the Model 50 squeezed so compactly that the panel of the Model 50 had to be rearranged. It was offered to the public for \$23.25 and aimed at the youth market.




MODEL 3R3 - The Crosley Model 3R3 or "Trirdyn" (Try-er-dine) was featured in many versions. All were 3-tube regenerative receivers of the reflex design and boasted "Three tubes doing the work of five." It was the first set to depart from the "book" tuner and instead used the more selective variable plate condenser of which two were used. This is the Type 1123 and is the earliest version - 1924. It sold for \$50.




THE SEMATIC BUG - This Signal Electric bug could be used as either a speed key, or by closing both shorting bars and flipping over the catch at the end of the operating pendulum, it could be used as a sideswiper. This model is nickel plated and about a third larger than the black based models. They were made in the late 1920's. Courtesy C. Hinkle.



KNOX & SHAIN CAMELBACK - This 1870's vintage key has a style of its own. Of post Civil War making, it is a good example of the fine art of making camelbacks, soon to be phased out in favor of the straight, steel lever keys. It is made of heavy brass, and seems to have been part of a set. Courtesy G. Potter.



DUNNDUPLEX - This bug was made in 1909 by the Thomas J. Dunn & Co. and was made in both single and double lever models. It is unusual in that code can also be sent by the use of two fingers on the plastic buttons on top of the bridge, one for dashes and one for automatic dots. These seem to be pretty rare, and although they made dots by releasing the tension on the operating pendulum, apparently violated the patents anyway. I have seen one bearing an Albright license, usually a sign that H.G. Martin disapproved. Courtesy J. Montgomery.



THE NATROMETER - This code teaching machine, like the Omnigraphs of its time, was a device that could generate random code for the purpose of instruction or testing by a mechanical wheel. It was wound up like a clock, and by the selection of any or all the removeable pins on top of the drum, pseudo random code would be transmitted to a sounder or buzzer. Courtesy R. Rees.

**COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE: This** month we are going to depart from our normal listing of values to present a look back at some values of radios and other items over 24 years ago. In 1961, Mr. Bruce Kelley, editor of the Antique Wireless Association's Old Timers Bulletin, conducted a survey with collectors to determine an average value of some selected radios and other items. Again in 1975, another survey was conducted on some of the same items that appeared on the 1961 list, plus some new additions. Therefore, with these past listed values, and with the new ones listed in the 1985 column, we have an interesting tabulation for comparing prices over the past 20 years. The 1985 prices are based on past "Value Guides" in A.R.C., plus others that will appear in future issues or researched

for this special listing. Vacuum tube prices were furnished by a well known tube expert.



# **PHOTO REVIEW**



The "Photo Review" column is intended to present in pictorial form many of the radios, speakers, tubes, advertising, and other radio related items in the collections of other collectors. These photos are meant to help increase awareness of what's available in the radio collecting hobby. Photos are solicited from other collectors for use in future issues of A.R.C. Items desired are the more unusual radios and other items related to the hobby (covering the years 1900 to 1940's). Photos must be B&W (any size) and be sharp in detail, preferably with a light colored background. Please include a short description of each item submitted.



CRYSTAL DYNE - This crystal set was made by the Bethleham Radio Corporation. I have never been able to locate any information on the set or even find the company name listed in any radio books. The name "Bethleham Radio Corporation" does not appear anywhere on the set, however, both the box and instruction sheet identify "The Crystal Dyne" and the company name. There is one other interesting item about it. On the inside top cover of the box someone has hand written "WLTH - 15". That sounds like a radio station call letters but my old radio log's don't list it. I am not sure what it means. - Frank White, Olathe, Kansas



RADA CHRON: Model K-10, a nine tube superhet, manufactured by the Fred Stein Radio Corp., Atchison, Kansas in 1931. - Frank Heathcote



ECHOPHONE - Model "C", this early cathedral dates around 1929-30. With the uses of 01A tubes and a front panel mounted regeneration control, this set is a good example of the "Midget or Cathedral" evolution. The six tube chassis is mounted on the back of the cabinet using the following tube line up: 01A's for the first and second RF and first audio, a 27 for the detector, a 71 for the output and an 80 for the rectifier. **GENERAL ELECTRIC** - Model F-70, made in 1936, 7 tube Superhet. Has shortwave in 3 bands covering 550 kc to 18 mc. Not restored, but 100 percent original. *Ed Tumer, Youngstown, OH* 



## THE PORTABLE LEGACY

My first recollection of "early radio" is quite unlike those of other collectors. As a war baby. the home radio center was quickly being replaced by the post-WWII TV boom. Instead of Amos & Andy or the Shadow, Howdy Doody, Farmer Gray and the Texaco Comedy Hour were in focus on our 12" Philco TV.

My earliest memory of radio was as a young child going to the beach lugging my father's 194? simulated alligator covered suitcase portable. Of course, we had to first stop by the local radio shop to pick up a fresh 90 volt battery. I believe then, and do now, that the radio stores made more money on the batteries than on the radios themselves. Polaroid seems to have been the leader in this area - a \$19.95 camera with \$200 a year for film!

As a child I loved foolin' with the knobs and dials of those mysterious radios. Coupled with my interest in antiques as an adult. I developed a love for early radios and a special warm spot for suitcase portables. Portables also attracted my attention because it is refreshing to collect something that everyone else isn't hungry for. I have been collecting for ten years or so and specialize in portables, Kellogg tube AC sets, DeForest, fancy horns and WWI items. In "real life" I am a practicing chiropractor in Wilmington, Delaware.



GLEB PORTABLE (MID 20'S)

Early portables are ugly... there is no getting away from it. Most were merely black enameled cloth covered boxes. Electronically, they were simple, less sophisticated and functionally less impressive than their table or floor model cousins. You cannot take away parts to reduce weight and still maintain the same performance. Those radios which kept all of their components so not to sacrifice quality, without concern for o weight, quickly discouraged portability. An example of this was the 1932 eight tube RCA P-31. The beauty of the portable lies in two areas: (1) the art of compactness and miniaturization, and (2) the emotional appeal of portability to the American public.



RADIOLA IIIA

Although I haven't yet researched it, portables seem to have preceeded table models. I say this because the Signal Corp during WWI was the first to have contracted to manufacture "carriable" field transmitters, transceivers and receivers. Of course many of the 1922 sets were in small boxes with handles (early Radiolas and Crosleys, for example). In 1924 Zenith intentionally beat out Operadio by introducing the first truly self-contained manufactured portable. However, the marketing speed of Zenith did nothing for its quality. The Operadio was by far the finest portable of its time. Within the next few years, dozens of portables hit the market. Like the stereotyped three dialers, the 1925-27 portables were mostly copies of each other.

The early 1930's brought a reduction in size (except for RCA's P-31) and an increase in performance. However, the one volt tube of the early 1940's brought a true revelation... in miniaturization, performance and features (multiband). Best known is the Zenith Transoceanic which was the longest productions of any radio line of which I am aware. Pictured are some of the versions of the Transoceanic which spanned a 35 year period, from 1940 through the 1970's.

Americans love portable radios. They have made them look like cameras, contain cameras. look like watches and even fit into coke bottles. While TV killed the radio as being the in-home family entertainment center, the portable flourishes even today. As a teenager, I was one of the first to have a transistor "pocket portable". My son and daughter love their "ghetto boxes" (was RCA's P-31 before its time and how would the Radiola Super Portable fit on a shoulder?)

The values of portables are certainly on the low side as compared with their pretty wood cabinet, exposed knobs brothers. Most of the common cloth covered portables from the mid Continue next page...

1920's bring from \$30-\$70. Some obvious exceptions are such emotional names as Kennedy, Cutting & Washington, Grebe and Operadio. These sets and other similar portables may bring in the hundreds of dollars. The infamous 1924 Zenith, of which only a handful survived, may bring up to \$1000 or more.

I have limited my portable collection to sets through the 1940's. A few collectors now even collect early transistor models. I am now trying to focus on finding such sets as Grebe portables

and early camera/novelty portables. I plan on writing a more comprehensive historical paper in the future and welcome any assistance from other collectors.





#### RADIO TIDBITS...

In the publication Antique Gazette, July 1985 edition, an article was presented describing the traveling exhibit of early radios by the Smithsonian National Museum of American History. This exhibit is currently on display at the Cumberland Museum in Nashville, Tennessee through September 9th, Radios and radio components from the Museum's collection supplement the Smithsonian exhibit. Much of the Cumberland Museum's display was donated to the Museum in 1969. Included are Atwater Kent. telegraph equipment, transmitters, and other early radio equipment. The exhibit provides a chronological presentation of the events of Marconi's life in the context of American and European history and the technological developments of the era. Also explored are modern technological developments that were made possible by Marconi's work - radio astronomy, satellite communications, lasers and computer chips.
