


STEWART-WARNER MODEL R-102B

Many of the old line radio companies believed that the midget radio was nothing more than a passing fad. Stromberg-Carlson was probably the most stubborn. They did not bring out a midget set until 1934. The Stewart-Warner Corporation was a little late, waiting until June of 1931. By this time almost all major radio manufacturers had at least one in their line.

The Stewart-Warner Corporation of 1853 Diversy Parkway in Chicago was the result of the merger of two older companies in 1912. It was best known for automotive products when, in 1925, the company entered the radio manufacturing field and did quite well. During the 30's Stewart-Warner also made cameras, refrigerators and other home appliances, and in the late 40's televisions. It discontinued home radio and TV production in 1954. Stewart-Warner is still very much in business and larger than ever in military electronics, fascimile, furniture hardware, lubricating systems, heating, tools, and automobile instruments.

The R-102-A sold for \$52.95 and is a 6 tube superhet. Type 24 tubes are used as 1st and 2nd detectors, a 27 as oscillator, a 51 as an IF amp, a PZ (Arctures 47) is the output tube, and an 80 is the rectifier tube. IF transformers are tuned to 177.5 Kc. In the 60 cycle model a pitifully small power transformer is used and is frequently burnt out. The 25 cycle model goes to the opposite extreme and uses a transformer a good three times larger than the former. It also includes a third filter capacitor. Unusual bypass capacitors are used that look more like resistors. They are coated with a sand-like substance and seem to be unmarked. The values, however, are found stamped on the flat lead wires.

The cabinet is of unusual styling and not as well constructed as many contemporaries. The front panel is very thin and the speaker grille is easily broken. The arch is made of four pieces of solid wood and is poorly braced. Often the wood is split or broken from somebody lifting the radio by the arch. Due to the way the cabinet is constructed the weight of the set is put on the trim on the sides rather than the base. Often this leads to the sides bowing or splitting. Small wood blocks glued to the bottom of the base can cure this.



This Stewart-Warner is not an especially good working set. At best it can be described as adequate. Many improvements were made during its production run which can be found in Rider's Volume II. The improvements culminated in the model R-103 which used the same cabinets as the R-102 series and is pretty much identical but uses a Wunderlich tube in place of the 24 2nd detector. An unusual feature on Stewart-Warner sets of this period is a socket marked TELEVISION for the hook up of television equipment which was supposedly just around the corner. Provision is also made for hook up of the S-W model 301 short wave converter which was built into some of the R-102 console models.

The R-102-A is a nice acquisition to a collection when in good condition and is not very common. Take care to check for the above problems and also one other; the speaker field coil is 1450 ohms with a tap at 200. Often the windings are open but if it is only one side, it may be bridged with a 5 watt or better resistor and little change will be noticed.

Next month a Dutch mantel radio, a Philips 834 of 1933 vintage will be featured. Happy collecting! - Frank Heathcote.



CRYSTAL SET REVIEW


One of the more interesting collectables in the radio collecting hobby is the crystal set. Many manufacturers made these sets in countless shapes, styles and variations. It is the intent of this column to present in pictorial form many of these crystal sets and to add further documentation to the little that is currently available. Collectors are encouraged to submit B&W photos and descriptions of crystal sets in their collection. (GBS)

I assume that Kristallapparat means crystal apparatus or as we know it "a crystal radio" in Sweden. ESS is the initials of the manufacturer Erik Sunderg Sistuna. On the underside of the ESS set pictured it is called a type Hjarteress. Not knowing any Swedish I am not certain what that means. but I assume that it means something related to a heart as the dial pointer is a little red heart. Also the plug-in detector has hearts on it as well as the label underneath. The set measures about 6 inches by 5 inches by 2.5 inches. It was sold in Sweden in the late twenties. The case is made out of moulded bakelite type material. The little set boast


made up of four flat coils, two fixed in position and two rotate with the shaft. This results in the same principle as a variometer and was a common method of varying inductance. So in this set there are essentially two ganged variometers. This ESS set is the only set I have ever seen with such a double variometer tuning arrangement. The detector is also unique in that it allows for a high degree of adjustment and the detector material appears to be some sort of composition carbon material rather than crystaline. The ESS is one of my favorite sets in my collection. (Mike Feher)

a tuning range from 175 meters to 2000 meters in five bands. The bands are selectable by using a combination of either antenna input and a three position switch. Figure 2 shows the required combinations and Fiqure 3 is the schematic. The tuning arrangement is interesting and as can be seen from the schematic, when the switch is in positions 1 and 2 the bottom coil is shorted out. When in position 3 the two coils are in series increasing the inductance. Each coil is A





CONSOLE RADIO REVIEW

In order to present an expanded view of the radio collecting hobby scene, Antique Radio Classified will periodically present a review of a console radio. The author, Mark Cowart, encourages correspondance with other collectors on the subject. Please send a SASE to the address shown above.

Like most collectors of early broadcast receivers I enjoy searching for, locating, and restoring these primitive electronic artifacts. Unlike most collectors, however, I prefer consoles. They seem to better retain the ambiance of a bygone era. I am sure more collectors would concentrate their interest on these ornate floor model sets if they had enough room in which to display them.

Most of the console radios of the 1920's and 1930's were well-crafted pieces of furniture. Some cabinet styles reflected contemporary trends while others exhibited traditional design, or even a combination of the two. A few cabinets, the AK 55 Kiel table comes to mind, were functional.

Conversely, some cabinets, like those of the 1920's with their spindled legs, carved doors, tapestry grill cloths, and elaborate detailing, were downright extravagant!

One such set that is representative of the extravagance and general prosperity of the Calvin Coolidge era is the behemoth Brunswick BR 260 Superheterodyne radio and phonograph combination. Manufactured in 1924 by the Brunswick, Balke, Collender Co. (see A.R.C. - March 1985, page 3), the pictured console is one of few radio/phono combinations featuring a wind-up phonograph. The unique reproducer on the gold-colored tone arm is convertible, allowing one to play either Edison records or standard discs.

To access the radio, the lockable front doors must be opened to expose a large drawer which, when pulled-out, exhibits a well-preserved Radiola AR-813 (a variation of RCA's AR-812). It features two tuning dials and utilizes six UV-199 tubes. The enclosed phonograph horn doubles as the radio's speaker. A knob on the right side of the cabinet mechanically controls the selection of either function. The wound-copper antenna is neatly confined within a door-like panel on the left side of the cabinet. Its directivity is adjustable simply by moving the door until the desired effect is obtained on the receiver.

There is a maze of compartments located behind the cabinet for connecting and storing the batteries. There are also two smaller drawers up front in which to store manuals and spare tubes. Bins are provided for generous record storage.

I must say that this console's asthetic attributes prompted me to acquire it from a private owner. No restoration was necessary as it is in excellent condition and has subsequently become one of my favorite pieces.

A-K BREADBOARD REVIEW

The Atwater Kent "breadboard" review is an attempt to present in pictorial form each month some of the many variations of models produced. This will enable the collector to help identify the breadboards he may possess. The photos appearing each month are all reproduced on the same scale, so that variations in size can be visualized. ATWATER KENT CRYSTAL SET: This receiver is the mystery set for AK historians and collectors. Did the factory manufacture and sell them? The set on the left using Type 11 tuner and the Part No. 4200 double detector is an exact duplicate of one made by AK's engineering laboratory. The one on the right is one of at least five produced by an independent entrepeneur in the Philadelphia area. In the early twenties, he seems to have bought the boards and instruments (variometers and detectors) and assembled the sets to be sold locally. The part number of the detector indicates introduction in 1923. This date and the lack of a set part number strongly suggest that AK did not see a suitable market for supplying production crystal receivers. The boards on both sets are the same as that of Model 5, 16 x 10 inches.



ATWATER KENT MODEL 6 - PART NO. 4052: Before the Federal Radio Commission opened the broadcast bands, radios only had to separate 360 from 400 meters. The primary requirement was amplification. Regeneration was unsatisfactory because of squealing, so amplifiers had to be used to increase the incoming signal to loud speaker level. AK used the detector two-stage amplifier as the basic instrument in earlier sets (3900 series). In the radio pictured above, he added one radio amplifier using a fixed-tuned transformer shown on the rear edge next to the power binding posts. Because this set was the sixth one produced, it is designated Model 6 although the Model Number was not used when the set was advertised and sold. The board was 24 x 8½ inches.

DeForest F5M

The DeForest F5 was introduced in late 1925 and production was continued into mid-1926. The selling price was about \$90 depending on the style of cabinet. The TRF circuit used Binocular coils and neutralizing condensers. Some F5 sets were housed in surplus D17 cabinets. The round metal tags on the lid hide the hole required for the D17's loop antenna.

This F5M has a completely original functioning chassis which makes the testing of it's performance interesting. The 01A type tubes used were all checked for good emission prior to logging measurements. The equipment used for the test was a Hickok 288X signal generator and a RCA Master VTVM. The results are shown in the graph below. The sharp dip in the sensitivity was probably due to some regeneration in the RF stages.

For the performance test the F5M was connected to a 100 foot inverted "L" antenna and batteries were used to supply voltage to the set. Selectivity is fairly good for a TRF, although tuning with the directly coupled knobs is touchy at the upper end of the dials. Sensitivity is quite good with the longest distance station received being WBAP in Ft. Worth, Texas, approximately 1600 miles from Minden, Nevada. (Henry Rogers)


PHOTO REVIEW

RADIO PHONOLIER This set combines a lamp, complete radio receiver - one step radio detector, tuner, two steps audio, and loud speaker. The speaker is the upright support of the lamp, in which is attached a telephone receiver (driver). The Radio Phonolier is built of solid copper, and finished in Bronze, Silver or Gold, with lamp shades to match or contrast with in 1922 at the New York Radio Exhibition, and was manufactured by Capitol Phonolier Corporation, New York City. This rare and beautiful set was completely restored by: John Milton Williams - Westport, CT)





GILFILLAN - Model GN3, a four-tube Neutrodyne featuring exposed tubes on a sloping front panel. (R.A. Hostler - Findlay, OH)



CHELSEA - Model 104, an early one-tube regenerative receiver manufactured by Chelsea Radio Co., Chelsea, Mass. (R.A. Hostler Findlay, OH)

REMLER - Called the Remler "Infradyne Amplifier", Model 700, this device is a IF amplifier made in the late 1920's. Built in a copper case, the bakelite top has sockets for three four-prong tubes. Four tuning adjustments are provided for peaking the amplifier stages. It is 16 inches long, 4 inches deep and 2% inches high. (Gary Schneider - Cleveland, OH)


PHOTO REVIEW



STANDARDYNE - A very unique set using a "multivalve" tube (three tubes in one glass envelope), it was made in 1925 by the Standard Radio Corp. of Worcester, Mass. The sloping front panel is housed in a nice walnut cabinet, measuring 11¾ inches wide, 9 inches deep at base, and 8 inches high. A very desirable set with collectors, this radio is quite scarce, and needless to say, the vacuum tube is almost as difficult to find as the radio itself. (Gary Schneider - Cleveland, OH)



UNKNOWN SPEAKER - Early horn speaker using headphones as the driver, manufacturer unknown. (R.A. Hostler - Findlay, OH)



CLAPP-EASTHAM - The "Baby Emerson" was manufactured by the Clapp-Eastham Co., Brooklyn, New York. It is a one-tube set using an "Emerson" multivalve type of tube (tube box shown left of set). The small horn speaker shown to the right of radio is of unknown manufacture. (R.A. Hostler - Findlay, OH)

SELDOM SEEN...

NESCO - A very interesting receiver, of which only three are known to exist, is the Model RG-1 made by NESCO. At first glance, the set looks like a WW2 vintage receiver, and it is quite a surprise to see that it was made in 1926. The set is a high frequency receiver tuning 1000 Kcs to 20,000 Kcs. The set consists of the following:

SE 2511 - High Frequency Receiver

SE 2512 - Tuned RF Amplifier

SE 2513 - Inductance System (plug in coils)

SE 2514 - Cabinet and Filter System

A very practical, foolproof and ingenious design permits the immediate change of the RF amplifier (on the left side of the set viewed from the front) and the HF receiver on the right simply by pulling the units out to the front and substituting new ones simply by plugging them in.




WHAT IS IT? - This set features a Repwood front and solid wood sides. Uses the following tubes: Three 24's, one 27, one 45 and an 80 rectifier. The 24's are highly shielded. This broadcast band set was probably made in the early 30's. Looks as if there was some kind of decal on the inside of the cabinet at some time. Anyone have knowledge of this radio? (Andrew Mooradain, 5 Priscilla Lane, Winchester, MA 01890)



The set uses one 215A as the RF amplifier, and three 215A tubes in the receiver section functioning as detector and two stages of amplification. The receiver is entirely constructed of aluminum, and it's light weight makes it ideal for aircraft and shipboard installations. (Ralph Muchow - Elgin, IL)

HINTS & TIPS...

HINTS & TIPS - To engrave on glass - Apply a thin coating of wax to the glass with gentle heat... when cool draw the design on the wax with a hard pointed instrument, so that it penetrates through the glass. Apply an aqueous solution of acid HydroFlouric to the design with a soft artist brush. Apply several times to get a deep etch outline. Finally wash the acid off with plenty of water and remove the wax. (Phil Weingarten - Flushing, NY)


