

SURVEY RESULTS

Survey Results - Back in July 1985, Antique Radio Classified enclosed a survey form in that months issue. The survey was meant to determine the typical collectors' collecting interest in the antique radio field and related categories as listed below. Approximately two-thirds of the people took the time and interest to return the completed survey form. Although not an 100 percent return rate, the large number of returned survey forms present an accurate survey which should apply to all those in the hobby on a "average". As far as I am aware, this is one of the most comprehensive surveys ever conducted in the hobby. and represents countless hours in tabulating the results. To the casual observer, these tabulated figures may not seem too exciting, or of much meaning to you as an individual collector. However, an in-depth study will reveal many interesting collecting trends, especially if surveys are run in future years. Perhaps a survey two years ago would have shown a near zero interest in the collecting of bakelite radios. Hopefully in years to come, surveys can be done again on a large basis to add meaning to these figures listed below - Gary B. Schneider, Editor. This "Value Guide" is an attempt to establish a relative value of many of the more common radios of the 1920's. The values expressed are the result of past market trends as indicated in recent auctions, flea market sales, sales by individual collectors, as well as information provided by other established collectors in the hobby. The factors affecting a value of a radio are many. One must consider the more obvious factors, such as condition of the radio, whether it is complete with tubes, in working condition, originality, age, rarity and etc. Other factors contributing to value include collector demand, collecting specialties (such as collecting wireless items, crystal sets, etc.), and geographic area. Thus when using this guide, you must consider these multitude of factors when valuating your radio. Of coarse the final value in the end, is the price another person is willing to pay for an item. Any questions in regards to this column, information about other radios not listed, comments, or suggestions should be sent to James Kreuzer with a SASE for reply.

RADIO COMPANIES OF PAST

WORKRITE MFG. CO. - CLEVELAND, OHIO

For a company that offered as extensive a product line as Workrite did, and advertised as often, information about it is remarkably hard to find, almost as hard to find as the radios themselves.

Workrite claimed to be a "conservative, well-financed company" with 12 years of manufacturing experience before getting into radio. It advertised parts and horns beginning in September 1922. Some time before the end of 1923 it joined the Independent Radio Manufacturers, Inc. and acquired a Hazeltine Neutrodyne license. It offered a knock-down model, while its "West Coast branch" factory of Kruger & Co. advertised completely wired sets in a variety of cabinets in December 1923 and January 1924. Workrite's own factory wired models came out in March, the Neutro-Grand Jr. and Sr.

In May 1924 Workrite moved from 5518 Euclid Ave. to a new plant at 1812 E. 13th St. and shortly came out with a new lineup of models, the first to look factory-made rather than kit-built. In September 1924 the new line was supposedly selling so well that Workrite opened a third factory in Chicago, and by November had doubled its floor space in the Cleveland plant. On the other hand, Workrite found it necessary to cut prices in January, and a Cleveland dealer was quoted in a trade magazine.

The reporter's question: How is the Neutrodyne set going in your section?... Why, it wasn't going at all, until Workrite cut prices on their products. We are getting some life on the Workrite now, but if we had all the Freshman sets that we wanted, and have ordered, we would not do such a marked business on the Workrite line. (Obviously Workrite was facing stiff price competition.)

The 1926 models, introduced in October 1925, appeared to be rearrangements of the previous models; not until July 1926 was anything really different offered. And none of these models is easy to find now, indicating that few were sold originally.

WORKRITE "WINNER FIVE"

In August 1927, Workrite combined with Apex, Case, Sentinel, and Slagle to form the United States Electric Corp., to obtain an RCA patent license (none of the companies individually was large enough to guarantee RCA the necessary \$100,000 per year in seven and one-half percent royalty payments). This merger was supposed to become effective on January 1, 1928, but one of the companies (probably Workrite) failed and forced the others into receivership to protect

themselves. Workrite pulled out and tried to get along without RCA, relying on its Neutrodyne license alone. Its last model series appeared in August 1928, though so far as is known, was never advertised. Workrite was said to be reorganizing in August 1929, which would indicate that it had failed again, but nothing was heard of it afterward. 




PHOTO REVIEW

TEMPLE RADIO LTD. - This set was manufactured by Temple Radio Ltd. of Toronto, Canada in 1931. (June 1931 stamped on speaker cone and inside cover of tone control potentiometer.) The nameplate bears no model number, only the serial no. 30137. The set is of TRF design using the following tube lineup: RF #1 - 235, RF #2 - 235, detector - 235, audio power output -247, and the rectifier is a type 280 tube. I found the set at a yard sale and purchased it for \$25.00. The cabinet is in near perfect condition and did not require anything more than a good cleaning and an application of furniture polish. No parts or knobs were missing, and no alterations were made to any of the circuitry.

To restore the chassis it was necessary to replace 3 electrolytic capacitors, and 4 bypass capacitors inside a 4 unit condenser block modern capacitors are much smaller than the originals, thus I installed the new capacitors inside the original housings to maintain the original appearance of the chassis. The set now works very well. Sensitivity is good. I was able to pick up WCAY in Philadelphia and WBZ in Boston at this location. Selectivity is good at the low end of the band, but deteriorates somewhat at the high end. (I assume that this is normal in a TRF circuit as the bandpass would be expected to increase with frequency.) The audio quality is quite good, though some of the bass frequencies seem to be modulated by 60 cycle hum only on certain notes. I assume this is because the #247 audio output tube uses a directly heated cathode run on AC. There is very little audiable hum in the speaker otherwise.

I know nothing about Temple Radio Ltd., but when looking through some old schematics of this period I noticed that there was a Temple

Corporation located in Chicago, Illinois which manufactured radios, perhaps my radio was made by a Canadian subsidiary of the company. (Peter Ivanchich, 30040 Jamestown, Romulus, MI 48174)

SUPER-BOOSTER- Manufactured by the Liberty Radio Corp. of Cleveland, Ohio and L.A. California, this booster does not contain any amplifier circuit or tubes. It is most likely just a wave trap as the circuit consist of nothing more than a coil and variable capacitor. Nicely constructed in a 9 x 5 x 4½ inch wooden cabinet. Several questions have been received in regards to different problems advertisers are not sure of. The first has to do with display ads the reason display ads are lower in price verses the cost of a lengthy classified ad is because display ad rates are based on "CAMERA READY" artwork. These words cost extra at the rate of 10 cents each. "FOR SALE" and "WANTED" are set in bold print at no extra charge! Another point - classified ads that are not used for any particular month can not accumulated for use in later months. To use the old phrase - if you don't use it, you lose it.Remember when figuring your classified ad word count that your name and address count as part of the word count. On payments under one dollar you may pay with stamps if you prefer, Several people have sent us ads for their non-subscriber friends. We will not run ads for non-subscribers unless paid for at the rate of 20 cents per word.

We realize that many copies of A.R.C. are shared with others. We would hope that these "free loaders" consider taking out their own subscription, these "lost subscriptions" may ultimately effect the existence of A.R.C. because of the loss of badly needed income. Still getting request for separating the "For Sale" and "Wanted" ads. This subject has been covered several times in the past, and we shall keep the format of mixed ads until further notice. And finally the problem of receiving classified ads at the last minute. This is a one-man production of A.R.C. - I simply don't have enough hours in a day to be able get the 1001 details worked out because of people waiting to the last minute. PLEASE try to get your classified ads in early. We should all know by now that the 10th of the month is the absolute deadline for ads. and in some cases if an issue is filled up for space the deadline could be earlier. Why not just get in the habit of sending your ads in on the last week of the month (or earlier). It would make my job much easier and make you happy because your ad wasn't left out of next months issue. Incidently for your information the 10th of the month is the same day I have to have A.R.C. at the printers - no easy task! Just one more point I would like to bring up - a very important message will be printed in the next issue (March) - please take the time to read it. (GBS)






