COLLECTORS CORNER

COLIN B. KENNEDY "CORONET" MODEL 42

Few vintage radio collectors realize that one of early radio's most respected companies ended its days in South Bend, Indiana, another casualty of the depression. The Colin B. Kennedy Corporation of San Francisco. California entered the wireless field in 1919. In 1924 the company moved to St. Louis and continued to prosper producing quality radios. living up to the company's slogan, "The Royalty of Radio". Early in 1929, several prominent members of Studebaker Automobile Corporation purchased a substantial interest in the Kennedy Corp. and moved operations to 212 West Ewing Street in South Bend, Intentions were announced to eventually hire 1000 workers and build 1000 sets a day.

Kennedy was caught by the depression. overstocked with high priced consoles and unwilling to follow the trend to cheaper mantel radios. Finally in November, 1930 they introduced the Model 42 "Coronet" based on the Model 20 circuit and selling for \$69.50 complete. It was a 6 tube TRF receiver using type 24 tubes in 3 RF stages and as detector. A type 45 output and 80 rectifier completed the tube line up. Early in the production run the circuit was revised, one RF stage was removed and an AF stage added using a type 27 tube. Two AF stages, entirely resistance coupled, replaced the former single transformer coupled AF stage which resulted in a cost savings over the early design.

The chassis is made of thick rust-proofed steel and the tuner and screen grid tubes are entirely shielded. An 8 inch Utah, Jensen, or Magnavox electrodynamic speaker is used with the 2250 ohm field coil and the 6 and 16 ufd. electrolytic capacitors providing excellent filtering of the DC voltage. Volume control is effected by varying the input signal to the grid of the first RF tube. A two position "Selectone" switch offers the listener a small degree of tone control.

The Coronet cabinet is uniquely styled and very well built. The front is covered with matching butt walnut vaneer panels, the sides



and top with plain walnut veneer. Decorative framing on the top and sides provide extra strength. The height of the set is 17 inches, width 16 inches, depth 10 inches, and it weighs 31 pounds. It can also be found with the brand name, Minerva, and also with a later model chassis using type 35/51 and 47 tubes.

My Coronet is a good performer in all respects and stands up very well against its competitors. I've found that its styling is not appreciated by many collectors but this is made up for by interest in Kennedy products. It is also the only quality Kennedy mantel set, later models were not as well made. The company lasted only until the 1933/34 season and distressed sets were sold by mail order radio outlets. Later, private brand radios using the Kennedy name were sold by Goldblatts Department Stores.

Some of the information in the above article is from "The Colin B. Kennedy Corporation South Bend Operations" by Ross Smith which appeared in the Spring, 1985 Antique Radio Gazette. BUILDING A HEADPHONE MAGNET RECHARGER

HEADPHONE MAGNET RECHARGER -PART 2: This is the conclusion of the article which was presented last month. (GBS)

Referring to typical headphone sketch, make a duplicate drawing of headphone unit actual size on a sheet of paper or cardboard 81/2 x 11 inches centering it side to side on the 11 inch dimension with you facing South and with sketch sheet placed on table directly in front of you with arrow on vertical center line pointed South and toward top of sheet with arrow on horizontal line pointing East and toward left side of sheet. Align phone with sketch and put it face down after removing cap and diaphragm. Position compass adjacent to right side as shown. If it reads North affix "N" label to square box area at rightside of phone. If it reads South, use "S" label at that spot and an "N" label in square on other side of phone. This identifies magnet polarity.

Gauge strength of headphone magnet by using several pieces of soft iron that cover a wide range of weights pre-determined by weighing them on a small postal scale and marking weights on each one. They must be at least long enough to extend across both pole piece surfaces and then some, and be perfectly flat on the pick-up service and about1/2 inch wide. Take headphone units with strong magnets and those with weak magnets and try to arrive at what you consider to be normal, tagging those units that are sub-par. Unless you are comparing units of same brand, same model, and same age, it is difficult to ascertain what is normal. What you can do is assume that any phone you have may be weak. Measure strength of magnets in each phone unit before and after subjecting it to a recharge procedure. Some phones just don't seem to be good candidates for improvement either because they were not very powerful to start with, or the magnet material deteriorated somehow and made it incapable of being brought back to its original strength. A more powerful charger, possibly a super-power capacitor discharge type would be necessary to re-vitalize it properly. This charger no doubt is a compromise between a combo of compactness, low cost, and simplicity in operation and one that is very bulky, expensive, and even dangerous to operate. I do know that it works fine on some magnets. I took an old pair of German phones with very powerful magnets and placed one phone unit atop a tape reel demagnetizer and in a jiffy all magnetism disappeared. I had initially made magnetic comparison of the two units and I could tell no difference in strength. I then put the dead one


on the magnet charger, applied 18 volts in rhythmic jolts and then found that it was a little stronger than the untouched one.

Take headphone unit to be re-charged, hold it face down and align it with mating surfaces of inserts Q-1 and Q-2. Polarity of this headphone unit you have already determined and labeled it accordingly. Position it so that North pole of headphone coincides with South pole of charger. Use momentary contact. Apply about 12 volts in rhythmic jolts spaced about 10 seconds apart over a period of 3 minutes then remove phone unit and its pickup ability with what it was before re-charging. If very little or no improvement is noted, repeat procedure with 18 volts, and if necessary 24 volts, but monitor temperature of coil and make sure it isn't overheating.

To charge horse-shoe type magnets, remove pole gap inserts Q-1, Q-2, and P and slide back A-1 and A-2 adjustable poles to afford a pole gap spacing equivalent to inside measurements of pole extremities of magnet being charged. Be sure that you have already checked magnet polarity with compass. (If it has a pole marked "N", don't go by that - go by compass reading) and place north pole of magnet atop south pole of charger and south pole of magnet atop north pole of charger and then follow same procedure used on headphones. Don't forget to tighten hex bolts after broadening pole gap before charging this magnet. (Contributed by: Ed Montgomery, 1092 Willowbranch Ave., Jacksonville, FL 32205)

COLLECTORS VALUE GUIDE

This "Value Guide" is an attempt to establish a relative value of many of the more common radios of the 1920's. The values expressed are the result of past market trends as indicated in recent auctions, flea market sales, sales by individual collectors, os well as information provided by other established collectors in the hobby. The factors affecting a value of a radio are many. One must consider the more obvious factors, such as condition of the radio, whether it is complete with tubes, in working condition, originality, age, rarity and etc. Other factors contributing to value include collector demand, collecting specialties (such as collecting wireless items, crystal sets, etc.), and geographic orea. Thus when using this guide, you must consider these multitude of factors when valuating your radio. Of course the final value in the end, is the price another person is willing to pay for an item. Any questions in regards to this column, information about other radios not listed, comments, or suggestions should be sent to James Kreuzer with a SASE for reply.

HORN SPEAKER VALUE GUIDE: For most collectors of pre-1928 battery operated radio receivers a collection is not complete unless they have some horn speakers to go along with the sets. Like radios, horn speakers come in countless designs, styles, shapes, and sizes. With the many types available for collecting, some collectors soon find this a fascinating sideline to the radio hobby. In the McGraw-Hill Co. 1925 Radio Trade Directory there are listed over 190 manufacturers of speakers, many of which were of the horn type. With many manufacturers making more than one model, the collector has hundreds and hundreds of models to choose from. Presented below are just a few of the more common names you are likely to find for your collection. The values presented below are for a speaker in very good condition, good driver, original finish, decals or nametags, and all original parts - GBS. (James Kreuzer)

E.G. BROWN CO. - This Brown's Crystavox horn speaker has a built in carbon granule "amplifier", just connect up a battery and you can listen to your crystal set. Made by S.G. Brown Co. in England, circa 1925. (Alan Brehaut - Timaru, New Zealand)



MOON - Unusual speaker manufactured by the Wilson Utensil Co. of Dayton, Ohio. Made of aluminum, it is 15 inches tall and has a bell diameter of 10 inches. Headphones were placed on the two projections sticking out of the base and were used as the driver. (Rudy Burick - Parma, OH)



AMPLION - This small speaker stands 8 1/2" high and the bell of the horn is 5 1/2" in diameter. Two binding post on top of driver unit are for wires to receiver (not shown in photo). Tone/volume adjustment is on front of driver. Front plate reads "Amplion Loud Speaker - Type AR 102". The casting which holds the driver and attaches to the horn is imprinted on the back "Made in Great Britain". (David McKenzie - Eustis, FL)



ANTIQUE RADIO SPECIFICATIONS

ANTIQUE RADIO SPECIFICATIONS - This column provides the collector with specifications, both physical and electrical on individual radio sets. Performance is measured and operation evaluated giving collectors a relative guide to expected results. Comments and suggestions concerning the evaluated radio are welcomed as well as additional radios you would like to see. (Henry Rogers)

The Radiola V was developed from commercial wireless sets G.E. sold for shipboard installation. Originally designated the AR1300 and AA1400 in 1922, the Radiola V was available through 1923 and part of 1924. Price was generally about \$140.

The circuit is a single tuned Armstrong regenerative detector with two stages of AF amplification. A two-mineral crystal detector is also included, however this circuit is independent and cannot be used with the tube AF amplifiers.

Performance of the Radiola V is somewhat disappointing. Sensitivity is adequate but the AF amplifier section is inefficent, requiring earphones to be used for any DXing. Due to the single tuned circuit, selectivity is poor. It is almost impossible to separate stations on the broadcast band. Running the INTENSITY control to the point of oscillation and tuning to the zero beat will give the best results.

Most distant stations received were: KOA, Denver, on a loudspeaker, 1000 miles distant, and using headphones station KRVN in Lexington, Neb., at 1500 miles.

It is interesting to note that two Radiola V's were used during the testing. Both were electronically original and operational. Performance results were identical for each set. The conclusion is that although the Radiola V is an impressive looking, well built receiver, its performance is not as good as many of it's contempories. (Henry Rogers - Minden, NV)






